BILLS OF THE COVERNMENT OF INDIA.

LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT.

The following Bill was introduced in the Council of the Governor General of India for the purpose of making Laws and Regulations on the 17th December 1894:—

A Bill to amend the Indian Tariff Act, 1894.

Whereas it is expedient to amend the Indian Tariff Act, 1894; It is hereby enacted as follows: -

III of 1894.

Substitution of new Schedules for Schedules II to V of Act VIII of 1694.

For Schedules II to V, both inclusive, appended to the said Act, the Schedules appended to this Act shall be substituted.

SCHEDULE II .- (IMPORT TARIFF.)

Arms, Ammunition and Military Stores,

including also any articles, other than those included in Nos. 1 to 12 of this Schedule, which are "arms" within the meaning of the Indian Arms Act, and any articles which the Governor General in Council may, by Notification in the Gazette of India, declare to be "ammunition" or "military stores" for the purposes of this Act.

Exception I.—Articles falling under the 5th, 6th, 9th, 9th or 10th head of the foregoing list, when they appertain to a firearm falling under the 1st or 3rd head, and are fitted into the same case with such firearm, are free.

Exception II .- The following are also free, namelyt:-

- (a) Arms forming part of the regular equipment of an officer entitled to wear diplomatic, military, naval, or police uniform;
- (b) a sword, a revolver, or a pair of pistols, when accompanying an officer of Her Majesty's Regular Forces, or a commissioned officer of a volunteer corps, or certified by the commandant of the corps to which such officer belongs, or, in the case of an officer not attached to any corps, by the officer commanding the station or district in which such officer is serving, to be imported by the officer for the purposes of his equipment;
- (c) swords and revolvers which are certified by an Inspector-General of Police to be part of the ordinary equipment of members of the Police force under his charge;
- (d) swords forming part of the equipment of native commissioned officers of Her Majesty's Army;
- (e) swords for presentation as army or volunteer prizes;
- (f) arms, ammunition and military stores imported with the sanction of the Government of India for the use of any portion of the military forces of a Native State in India which may be maintained and organised for Imperial Service:
- (g) Morris tubes and patent ammunition when imported by officers commanding British and Native regiments or volunteer corps, for the instruction of their men.
- Proviso 1.—No duty in excess of ten per cent. ad valorem shall be levied upon any of the articles numbered 1 to 10 in the foregoing list when they are imported in reasonable quantity, for his own private use, by any person lawfully entitled to possess the same.
- Proviso 2.—When any articles which have been otherwise imported, and upon which duty has been levied or is leviable under numbers 1 to 10 are purchased retail from the importer by a person lawfully entitled as aforesaid, in reasonable quantity for his own private use, the importer may apply to the Custems-Collector for a refund or remission (as the case may be) of so much of the duty thereon as is in excess of ten percent. ad valorem; and if such Collector is satisfied as to the identity of the articles, and that such importer is in other respects entitled to such refund or remission, he shall grant the same accordingly.

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

In the Tariff Act passed in March last cotton yarns and piece-goods remained exempt from duty. The existing state of the finances is such as to render necessary the revenue to be derived from the duties on these classes of goods, and this Bill is introduced to authorize the levy of them. The opportunity has been taken of introducing several detailed amendments which the experience of the past eight months has shown to be desirable, and of which the object is to make the Tariff classifications more clear and precise and more easy of application.

LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT.

The following Bill was introduced in the Council of the Governor General of India for the purpose of making Laws and Regulations on the 17th December 1894 :-

A Bill to provide for the Imposition and Levy of certain Duties on Cotton Goods.

WHEREAS it is expedient to impose certain duties on cotton goods; It is hereby enacted as follows :-

PRELIMINARY.

1. (1) This Act may Title, extent and combe called "The Cotton mencement. Duties Act, 1894";

- (2) It extends to the whole of British India;
 - (3) It shall come into force at once.
 - 2. In this Act, unless there be something repuguant in the subject Definitions. or context,
- (I) "The Principal Act" means "The Sea
 - (2) "Chief Customs Authority" means, in the Presidency of Fort St. George, and the territories respectively under the administration of the Lieutenant-Governors of Bengal and the North-Western Provinces and the Chief Commissioner of Oudh, the Board of Revenue; in the Presidency of Bombay outside Sind, the Commissioner of Customs; in Sind, the Commissioner; in the Punjab and Burma, the Financial Commissioner; and elsewhere, the Local Government or such officer as the Local Government may, by notification in the official Gazette, appoint in this behalf by name or in virtue of his office:
 - (3) "Collector" means the Customs Collector mentioned in the Principal Act, and includes-
 - (a) in any place for which there is no Customs Collector appointed, the Collector or Deputy Commissioner of the district, unless the Local Government shall otherwise so direct, and
 - (b) every officer for the time being duly authorised to perform all or any of the duties of a Collector under this Act:
 - (4) "Mill" means any building or place where cotton fibre is spun or otherwise converted into yarn, or where yarn is woven, by machinery, or by the use of any motive force other than manual labour:
- (5) "Warehouse" means a place licensed for the storage of yarn under this Act, and includes every public or private warehouse duly appointed or licensed under section 15 or 16 of the Principal Act, or under section 2 of the Inland Bonded XXI of 1887. Warehouses Act, 1887 : and

(6) "Cotton yarn" means yarn wholly or partly composed of cotton fibres.

3. The officers subordinate to a Collector shall, unless the Local Govern-Performance of duties of Customs Officers and ment shall otherwise so direct, for the purposes subordinate officers.

- (b) For "the bill-of-entry or shipping-bill" shall be substituted "the return required by this Act";
- (c) Every reference to a warehouse, or warehousing, shall be construed as referring to a "warehouse" as hereinbefore defined.

Duties.

5. There shall be levied and collected at every mill in British India upon all cotton Imposition of duties on cotton yarns produced in British Indian mills. yarns produced in such mill, a duty at the rate for the time being prescribed in the Indian Tariff VIII of 18

Act, 1894, for the levy of duty in respect of cotton yarns imported by sea:

Provided that no duty shall be levied upon yarns of the count or number of 20 or less:

Provided also that the Governor-General in Council may, by notification in the Gazette of India, exempt from duty any yarns of any count or number not exceeding 24.

Explanation.—Yaru is said to be "produced" within the meaning of this Act-

- (a) in the case of yarn which is reeled and bundled in the mill in which it is spun-when it is so bundled;
- (b) in the case of yarn which is woven in the mill in which it is spun-when it is passed from the spinning into the weaving section of the mill;
- (c) in any other case—when it is issued out of the premises of the mill.
- 6. (1) The Governor-General in Council may from time to time, by notifi-Power to Governor-General in Council to cation in the Gazette of India, fix, for the purpose of levying the said duties, fix tariff values of such tariff values of all such

yarns as aforesaid or of any particular count or counts thereof, and alter any tariff values for the time being in force.

- (2) In the absence of any notification under sub-section (1), the tariff values for the time being fixed for the purpose of the levy of duty in respect of such yarns when imported by sea shall be the tariff values for the purpose of the levy of duty under this Act.
- (3) Such tariff value shall, for the purposes of this Act, be deemed to be the "real value" of the yarns to which it applies, but save as aforesaid all yarns shall be assessed under this Act at their real value as defined in section 30 of the Principal Act.
- 7. (1) The owner of every mill shall propare Delivery of monthly returns of yarn produced by mill-owners. the Collector, on or before the fifteenth day of each month, a return of all cotton yarn produced at his mill during the preceding month, whether liable to duty or not; and shall subscribe a declaration of the truth of such statement at the foot of such return.
- (2) Every such return shall state for each count or number of yarn the quantity produced during the preceding month under each of the three heads mentioned in the explanation to section 5, and in the case of dutiable yarn the real value of such yarn.
- (3) Every such return shall also contain such further information and be in such form and be subject to such conditions as to verification and otherwise as may be prescribed by any rules under this Act.
- 8. (1) The Collector shall thereupon assess

 Assessment of duty the duties, if any, payable in respect of the month to which the return relates, and, unless the amount thereof is immediately tendered, shall cause a notice, in such form as may be prescribed by any rules under this Act, to be served on the owner requiring him to make payment of the amount assessed within ten days of the date of service of the said notice.
- (2) A notice under sub-section (1) may be served on the owner of a mill by delivering or tendering to him or his agent at his ordinary place of business a copy of the notice, or, if this cannot be conveniently done, by fixing a copy of the notice on one of the outer doors of the mill.
- 9. Sections 30 to 34, 37, and 39 to 41, all inclusive, of the Principal Act, shall apply to the assessment and recovery of duties under this Act.

 34, 37, and 39 to 41, all inclusive, of the Principal Act, shall apply to the assessment and recovery of the duties imposed by this Act:

Provided that the rate of duty and the tariff valuation applicable to any yarn which has not been warehoused as hereinafter provided shall be those in force at the time when the yarn was produced, and not when the return was delivered as provided by the said section 37.

(1) When any cotton fabrics woven in a mill in India and composed in whole or in part of dutiable counts of yarn are exported by sea from any Customs Port to any Foreign Port, the exporter may

apply to the Customs Collector at the port of shipment for the repayment as drawback of any duty which may have been paid under this Act in respect of such yarn.

- (a) the quantities and counts of yarns in respect of which drawback is claimed, the mill at which they were produced, and, as nearly as possible, the dates on which they were produced;

PART II.

INLAND CUSTOMS DUTIES.

VIII of 1894. (1) Duties of customs shall be levied at the rates for the time being prescribed in the Indian Tariff Act, 1894, upon cotton yarn, and

upon cotton manufac-

tures of all kinds, passing into British India out of any territory declared, under the power hereinafter in this section conferred, to be foreign territory.

- (2) The Governor-General in Council may, by notification in the Gazette of India, declare that the territory of any Native Prince or Chief under the suzerainty of Her Majesty not forming part of British India, shall be deemed for the purposes of this section to be foreign territory.
- (3) The Governor-General in Council may from time to time, by notification in the Gazette of India, prohibit or restrict the bringing of cotton yarns or cotton manufactures into British India, from any such foreign territory, or may prescribe the routes by which alone they may be brought.
- Application of provisions of the Principal Act as to drawback on export shall apply to all yarns upon which duty has been paid under this Part.

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The finer classes of cotton manufacture in India enter into direct competition with the cotton manufactures imported from England. As it is intended to weight these last with an import duty, it is considered necessary to levy at the same time a countervailing duty upon the competitive classes of Indian manufactures.
