## PROCEEDINGS OF THE LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT, BOMBAY.

The following Bill, together with the Statement of Objects and Reasons accompanying it, is published in accordance with Rule 15 of the Rules for the conduct of Business at Meetings of the Council of His Excellency the Governor of Bombay for making Laws and Regulations :---

### Bill No. 2 of 1894.

A Bill to amend the Aden Port Trust Act, 1888.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Bo. A. V. of Aden Port Trust Act, 1888, in manner hereinafter appearing; It is enacted as follows :-

For section 14 of the Aden Port Bo. A. VI. of 1 886, section 6, para. 2. Amendment of sec- Trust Act, 1888, hereof tion 14. inafter referred to as 1888. the said Act the following section shall be substituted, viz. :--

> "14. Every trustee shall be entitled to a fee of such Fee payable to trusamount not exceedtees. ing thirty rupees

> as shall from time to time be prescribed by Government, for each meeting of the Board at which a quorum is present and business is transacted, and which he attends from the beginning to the end thereof : provided that if more than one such meeting is held in any one week,

no more than one fee shall be paid to any trustee for his attendance at all or any of such meetings during that one week.

2. To section 25 of the said Act, the following sub-sec-Amendment of sections shall be added ; tion 25. viz. :-

"(3) Notwithstanding anything con-tained in or done under this section, the crane on the Post Office pier entered as No. 23 in the said schedule shall, whenever and so long as the use thereof may be required by or on behalf of Government, be rendered by the Board available for such use, free of charge."

"(4) The property specified in Schedule C. shall, on and after such date as shall be notified in this behalf by the Governor in Council, vest in the Board."

3. After section 25 of the said Act the New section inserted following section shall after section 25. be inserted ; viz. :--

## "25A. Nothing in this Act or in any

shall be deemed to affect the proprietary right of Her Majesty to the bed of the sea facing lands on the shore, which are vested in Her Majesty, or the right of Her Majesty to reclaim any part of the bed of the sea; but the Board shall have, on and along the outer boundary wall or line and to seaward of any such reclamation of a part of the bed of the sea, the same rights, if any, as it would have under this Act or any such enactment as aforesaid, on or along the strand or foreshore or to seaward of the same, if no such reclamation had been made."

4. To sub-section (1) of section 57 of Amendment of section 57 (1). the said Act there shall be added the following :—

" or in the Bank which is at the time appointed to conduct the business of Her Majesty's treasury there."

5. For clause (c) of section 58 of the Amendment of section 58 (c). Amendment of secing clause shall be substituted; viz.:- "(c) such sums as Government may from time to time require the Board to contribute on account of expenses in connection with the harbour-police and police employed in guarding the docks, warehouses, and other property of the Board and on account of medical services supplied in the port, in lieu of, or in addition to, any expenditure which Government may direct to be made from the funds or hospital portdues, the control or application of which is, by sections 36 and 50 of the Indian Ports Act, 1889, vested in Government." Amendment of section 73. 6. To sub-section (3) of section 73 of the said Act the following

words shall be added ; viz .:--

"unless such damage or mischief is in no way attributable to the order, act or improper omission of such officer."

7. (1) For entry No. 22 in Part I of the Schedule A. annexed to the said Act the entries Nos. 22 to 26, both inclusive, contained in Schedule No. I to this Act shall be, and shall be deemed always to have been, substituted.

(2) After Schedule B. annexed to the said Act there shall be added Schedule C. contained in Schedule No. II. annexed to this Act.

That portion of the roadway known as the Marshág Road which, commencing in Holkat Bay at a point 1,945 feet in a direct line south by west from the centre of the arch on the east side of the south Pass Gate or Draw-bridge, extends thence to a total length of 5,100 feet to the Marshág Light-house."

#### STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The object of this Bill is to effect the following amendments, which it is desirable to make, for the reasons hereinafter stated, in the Aden Port Trust Act, 1888:-

- It is found to be desirable to assimilate the provision in that Act as to payment of fees to Trustees to the corresponding provision in the Karáchi Port Trust Act (Bombay Act VI of 1886, section 16, paragraph 2). Section 1 of the Bill proposes therefore to amend Section 14 of the Aden Act in this sense.
- (2) Schedule A of the Aden Port Trust Act, 1888, has proved to be not quite complete. It is, therefore, proposed to add to it now, with retrospective effect, certain properties which, by mistake, were previously omitted from it. But whilst allowing the transfer to the Trustees of the crane on Post Office pier (which is one of the properties now for the first time to be entered in the schedule), Government wish to retain to themselves the right of using that machine, whenever necessary; in section 2 of the Bill it is proposed to add to Section 25 of the Act a sub-section (3) to give effect to this wish. It is also proposed in section 2 of the Bill to vest prospectively in the Board the Marshág Road which it is the interest and desire of the Board to maintain.
- (3) It is expedient to place beyond doubt the right of Government to reclaim on the foreshore, in front of lands belonging to it, without prejudice to any rights to levy landing-fees, &c., which the Act vests in the Trustees. This it is proposed to do by section 3 of the Bill.
- (4) It is deemed expedient as proposed in section 4 of the Bill to enable the Trustees to keep their moneys in the Bank which conducts the business of Her Majesty's Treasury.
- (5) The purpose of section 5 of the Bill is to authorize Government to require the Trustees to pay such contribution towards the actual cost of harbour-police and police employed in guarding the property of the Board, and towards the actual cost of medical services in the port, as may from time to time appear reasonable.
- (6) Section 6 provides for a slight amendment of the Act, which is necessary to enable the Board to recover compensation for any damage or mischief done to its property by any vessel with a pilot on board, when such damage or mischief is not attributable to any fault of the pilot.
- (7) Section 7 is intended to introduce the additions to the schedules descriptive of the properties referred to in paragraph 2 above, as intended to be transferred to the Board.
