PROCEEDINGS OF THE LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT, BOMBAY.

The following Bill, together with the Statement of Objects and Reasons accompanying it, is published in accordance with Rule 15 of the Rules for the conduct of Business at Meetings of the Council of His Excellency the Governor of Bombay for making Laws and Regulations:—

Bill No. 3 of 1885.

o. X. of 1866 A Bill to amend the Bombay General Clauses Act, 1866, and to shorten the language of the enactments of the Governor of Bombay in Council.

Whereas it is expedient to amend the Bombay General Clauses Act, 1866, and to make other provisions for shortening the language of the enactments of the Governor of Bombay in Council and for explaining their meaning; It is enacted as follows:—

- 1. This Act may be cited as "The Bombay General Clauses Act, 1885."
- 2. The Acts of the Governor of Bombay

 Enactments repealed. in Council mentioned in Schedule A are repealed to the extent specified in the third column of the said schedule.

The words quoted in the fourth column of Schedule B from the enactments made by the Governor of Bombay in Council respectively mentioned in the previous columns of the said schedule are repealed, and, where such intention is expressed in the said schedule, the words contained in the fifth column thereof shall be deemed to be substituted respectively for the words so repealed.

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

In section 1, clause (7) of the Bombay Bo. X of 1866. General Clauses Act, 1866, the word "Magistrate" is defined to mean "any person exercising the full powers of a Magistrate under the Code of Criminal Procedure", i. e., according to section 3 of the Act X of 1882. present Criminal Procedure Code, a Magistrate of the first class, and this definition applies to all Acts of the Governor of Bombay in Council passed since the Bombay Bo. X. of 1866. General Clauses Act, 1866. The existence of this definition has, however, at times been overlooked by the Legislature. In the enact-

ments Bombay Act III. of 1867, s. 19. noted in " VIII. of 1867, s. 11 (2). " II. of 1868, ss.12 & 15. the mar-VII. of 1873, ss. 9, 12, gin, for and 56. instance, II. of 1874, s. 37. it seems III. of 1875, s. 7. to have V. of 1879, s. 215. VII. of 1879, s. 61. been intended

that the word "Magistrate" should have its ordinary signification, viz., a person exercising any magisterial powers. The mistake was one which it was difficult always to avoid and as it is inconvenient that a generic term like "Magistrate" should have a specific meaning attached to it in the Acts of the Legislature, it is proposed to amend the definition and to provide that in all the enactments of the Governor of Bombay in Council, past and future, this word shall

have its ordinary meaning.

2. This is the primary object of the present Bill. But there are other portions Bo. X.of 1866. of the Bombay General Clauses Act, 1866, which are suitable for repeal. The definition of "Magistrate of Police" in clause (8) of section I, for example, is superseded by section 3 of the Criminal Procedure Act X.of 1882 Code; and the definition of "Regulation districts" in clause (11) of the same section is no longer requisite because that term has become obsolete since the passing of XIV. of 1874. the Scheduled Districts Act, and even before that time the term does not appear to have been employed in any Act of the Governor of Bombay in Council.

3. On the other hand many terms which are very frequently used in the Acts of the Governor of Bombay in Council, such as "Commissioner," "Collector," "imprisonment," "immoveable property", &c., are Bo. X, of 1866. omitted from the Bombay General Clauses

Act, 1866.

4. It has appeared therefore desirable
Bo. X of 1866, to repeal the Bombay General Clauses Act,
1866, entirely and to substitute for it a new
Act which shall be both more complete and
more adapted to the requirements of legis-

lation at the present time.

The twenty general definitions which are given in section 3 of the Bill comprise all the terms commonly used in the Bombay enactments and their adoption will tend greatly to shorten the Acts of the future. But this has appeared to be also a favorable opportunity for repealing the superfluous definitions and expressions to be found in many of the Bombay enactments at present in force. By declaring the new definitions applicable to existing as well as to future enactments, as it is proposed to do by section 10 of the Bill, not only is this shortening and simplificaof existing enactments rendered feasible, but there will be the additional advantage that the one set of general definitions will be applicable to all the Bombay enactments.

6. The various portions of the Bombay enactments now in force which may be repealed or amended if the new definitions and the other sections of the Bill become law, are set forth in the two schedules annexed to the Bill and the repeal or amend-

ment of these will be effected by section 2 of the Bill. The amendments include some alterations in the few fragments of the old Bombay Regulations which still remain "The Magistrate" referred unrepealed. to in those Regulations was the "Zilla Magistrate," whose place is now occupied by the District Magistrate. But in the improved administration of the present day there are several other Magistrates in a district besides the District Magistrate and it is expedient to vest in them some of the powers which the regulations vest in the Zilla Magistrate alone. This will be accomplished by the alterations in the Regulations specified in Schedule B.

7. Sections 4 and 5 of the Bill prescribe some general provisions regarding the effect of repeals. These provisions are not new and the necessity for them is self-evident. It is not, however, proposed to reproduce section 3 of the Bombay General Clauses Bo.X. of 1866. Act, 1866, which also relates to the effect of repeals, because the principle laid down in that section is one of general law which does not need to be specifically prescribed by the Legislature.

Sections 6 and 7 of the Bill are based upon the corresponding sections of the present Bombay General Clauses Act and do not need explanation. Section 8 will re-enact so much of section 6 of the present Act as empowers Government to fix and from time to time to postpone the date on which any enactment shall apply or be extended to any portion of the presidency; but the other provisions of the latter section which enable Government to direct by whom any powers or duties incident to the enactment shall be exercised, &c., have not hitherto been of any practical use and it is not proposed to reproduce them. The enactments which have to be extended provide sufficiently for such matters.

9. Section 9 of the Bill is based on section 5 of the Government of India's General Clauses Act. But so much of that section as refers to sections 64, 65 and 66 of the Penal Code has been rendered unnecessary by the amendments made in the Code by sections 1 and 2 of Act VIII. of 1882.

10. The provisions of sections 4—9 of the Bill are equally necessary for past as for future enactments of the Governor of Bombay in Council and section 10 of the Bill therefore includes them as well as the section of general definitions.
