## Bill No. 4 of 1886.

## A Bill to vest the Port of Karáchi in a Trust.

Whereas it is expedient to vest the port of Karáchi in a trust and to provide for the management of the affairs of the said port by trustees; It is enacted as follows:—

## I .- PRELIMINARY.

Short title.

2. In this Act, unless there be something repugnant in Definitions.

1. This Act may be called "The Karachi PortTrust Act, 1886."

2. In this Act, unless there be something repugnant in the subject or context,

(1) "port" means the port of Kará-"port"; chi as defined for the purposes of this Act;

(5) "master," when used in relation to any vessel, means any person having for the time being the charge or control of such vessel;

Do. do. (6) the word "goods" includes wares and merchandise of every description;

To. do. (7) "owner," when used in relation to goods, includes any consignor, consignee, shipper or agent for the sale or custody of such goods; and when used in relation to any vessel, includes any part-owner, charterer, consignee, or mortgagee in possession thereof.

Power to define and alter limits of port.

Power to define and alter limits of port.

Bombay Government

Gazette:

(a) define the limits of the port for the purpose of this Act, and

(b) from time to time alter such limits.

Such limits may extend to any part of the navigable approaches to the port, and may include any wharves, tramways, warehouses, sheds and other works made on behalf of the public for convenience of traffic, for safety of vessels, or for the improvement, maintenance, and good government of the port, whether within or without high-water mark, and, subject to any rights of private property therein, any portion of the shore within fifty yards of high-water mark.

#### II .- OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES.

Constitution of Board.

4. The duty of carrying out the provisions of this Act shall, subject to such conditions and limitations as are hereinafter contained, be vested in a board to be called "The Trustees of the Port of Karáchi"; and such board, hereinafter referred to as "the board," shall be a body corporate and have perpetual succession and a common seal, and shall sue and be sued by the name first aforesaid.

5. The board shall consist of such number of trustees as shall from time to time be fixed by Government, the same being not less than seven nor more than nine.

Appointment of chairman and vice chairman of the board.

Appointment of chairman and vice officer or not, to be chairman of the board.

If the chairman of the board is a public officer, Government may appoint some other person, whether a public officer or not, to be vice-chairman of the board.

The chairman and, if any be appointed, the vice-chairman of the board, shall be trustees.

7. Of the rest of the trustees, one shall be the Manager, for the time being, of the North-Western Rail-

way, or such officer as the said Manager shall from time to time appoint to act for him in this behalf, and such number as shall from time to time be fixed by Government, the same being not less than two, shall be elected by the members for the time being of the Karáchi Chamber of Commerce.

The remaining trustees shall be appointed by Government.

Any trustee elected or appointed under this section may be a public officer or not.

S. The election of trustees by the Bom Act VI.

manner as shall from time to time be determined at a meeting of the members of the said chamber convened in accordance with the rules at the time in force in this behalf. 10. The term of office of the first trustees shall commence on such date as shall be notified in this behalf by Government.

The rest of the first trustees, other than the chairman and vice-chairman, shall, unless they become in the meantime disqualified, hold office until and inclusive of the 31st day of March next following the 31st day of March aforesaid.

In every other case every trustee, other than the chairman and vice-chairman, shall, unless he becomes in the meantime disqualified, hold office for a term of two years.

The chairman and vice-chairman shall hold office during the pleasure of Government, unless they, respectively, become in the meantime disqualified for being a

Explanation.—In this section one-half means the exact half if the number to be divided is even, and, if it is uneven, the nearest integral number below the exact half.

12. The first election of trustees by

the chamber shall be for holding Time held on some day not elections and making later than a month appointments. previous to the date

which shall be notified by Government under section 10, and the first appointment of trustees by Government shall be made on some day during the said month.

Elections of trustees by the chamber to succeed trustees whose term of office expires shall be held on some day not earlier than the fifteenth and not later than the last day of the month of February next preceding the 1st day of April from which the term of office of the new trustees is to commence; and appointments of such trustees by Government shall be made on some day in the month of March next preceding the said 1st day of April.

capable of acting previous to the expiry of his term of office, the vacancy shall be filled up, as soon as it conveniently may be, by the election or appointment, as the case may be, of a person thereto, who shall hold office so long only as the trustee in whose place he is elected or appointed would have been entitled to hold it if the vacancy had not occurred.

A person who has already been a trustee on one or Re-eligibility more occasions shall, trustees. not disqualified under section 15, be again eligible at any time for election or appointment.

## Disqualifications of Trustees.

- (a) who is an uncertificated bankrupt or an undischarged insolvent, or
- (b) who holds any office or place of profit under the board, or
- (c) who has, directly or indirectly, any share or interest in any work done by order of the board, or in any contract or employment with, by, or on behalf of the board; or
- (d) who has been sentenced by a cri-. minal court to imprisonment or to whipping for an offence punishable with imprisonment for a term exceeding six

months, or to transportation, such sentence not having been subsequently reversed or quashed, and whose disqualification on account of such sentence has not been removed by an order, which Government is hereby empowered to make, if it shall think fit, in this behalf; and any trustee who—

(f) is absent from the meetings of the board for a period exceeding twelve consecutive months, or, without the permission of the board, from six consecutive meetings of the board,

Every trustee, other than the chairman and vice-chairman, shall be entitled to a fee of such amount not exceeding thirty

rupees as shall from time to time be prescribed by Government for each meeting of the board at which a quorum is present and business is transacted and which he attends from the beginning to the end thereof: Provided that if more than one such meeting is held in any one week, no more than one fee shall be paid to any trustee for his attendance at all such meetings during that one week.

- No act of the board, or of any committee, or of Acts of board, &c., any person acting not to be invalidated as trustee, shall be by informalities. deemed to be valid by reason only of some defect in the appointment of such board, committee, or trustee, or on the ground that

they, or any of them, were disqualified for the office of trustee.

The chairman may, on behalf of Bom Act VI. the board, enter into Mode of executing any contract or agreecontracts. ment, whereof the. value or amount shall not exceed one thousand rupees, in such manner and form as, according to the law for the time being in force, would bind him if such contract or agreement were on his own behalf; but every other contract and agreement on behalf of the board shall be in writing, and shall be signed by the chairman and by two other trustees, and shall be sealed with the common seal of the board.

No contract or agreement not executed Bom. ActIII. as aforesaid shall be binding on the board:

Provided that the signatures of the chairman and two other trustees may be engraved, lithographed or impressed by any mechanical process on coupons attached to debentures which the board is at any time authorized to issue under the Local Authorities Loan Act, 1879, or other law XI. of 1879. for the time being in force, and the signatures so engraved, lithographed or impressed shall have the same validity as if they were written in the proper handwriting of . the chairman and other trustees.

and all officers and servants holding any office on the said day under the said Karáchi Harbour Board and the officers and servants aforesaid, if any, so maintained by Government on the said day shall be deemed to have been appointed under this Act, and shall continue to hold the same offices, respectively, and to receive the same remuneration under the board, until it is otherwise directed under this Act :

## General Powers as to Property.

The board shall, for the purposes of Bom. Act VI. this Act, have power of 1879, s. 26. Powers of board as to acquire and hold to property. moveable and immoveable property whether within or without

the limits of the port or city of Karáchi; and shall also have power to lease, sell or otherwise convey any moveable or immoveable property which may have become vested in or been acquired by them:

Provided that no sale of immoveable property and no lease of any such property for a term exceeding fifty years shall be valid unless such sale or lease shall have been made with the previous sanction of Government.

## STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The management of the affairs of the port of Karachi has been vested for some years past by Government in the local body known as the Karáchi Harbour Board, the members of which were appointed, on the recommendation of the Commissioner in Sind, by Government.

- 2. The fees levied at the port have been imposed under the Bombay Landing and Wharfage Fees Act, 1882, but in other respects the proceedings of the Harbour Board have not been regulated by any enactment; and as the Board has not occupied any legal position except as the agent of the Executive Government, its authority has been found insufficient to enforce the various provisions necessary for the proper control and management of the affairs of the port.
- At the same time the rapidly increasing trade of the port of Karáchi has led to the erection of many new piers and other important works for the protection of the shipping resorting to the harbour and for improving the means of landing and shipping goods thereat, and in addition to the large outlay already incurred

for these purposes from Imperial and Provincial revenues, the raising of a loan of ten lákhs of rupées has recently been sanctioned by Government, to enable the Board to carry some of these works to completion. Of this sum Rs. 2,88,500 have been obtained from the public, as shown in Schedule B to the Bill. The balance is to be advanced by the Government of India, under the guarantee of the local Government, and the liability for so much as shall have been so advanced before a board is created under the new law will constitute a further. debt for which that board will be responsible under section 28 of the Bill.

4. In these circumstances it has appeared to Government desirable that the affairs of the port of Karáchi should now be handed over to a local corporation invested with full powers for their proper management. This Bill has been drafted for this purpose, and its provisions are based partly on those of the Rangoon Port Commissioners Act, 1879, and partly on XV. of 1879, those of the Bombay Port Trust Act, Bom. VI. of 1879. 1879.
