PART V.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT, BOMBAY.

The following Report of the Select Committee of the Council of His Excellency the Governor of Bombay, on the Bill to vest the Port of Karáchi in a Trust, and the Bill as amended by the Select Committee, are, in accordance with Rule 25 of the Rules for the Conduct of Business at Meetings of the Council, published for general information:—

Report of the Select Committee appointed to consider Bill No. 4 of 1886 (a Bill to vest the Port of Karáchi in a Trust).

We approve of the purpose and general provisions of the Bill and therefore limit our recommendations to the amendment of certain of its details.

- 2. In order to secure an adequate representation on the board of every section of the community interested in the affairs of the port, we propose to fix the number of members of the board definitely at nine, of whom two at least shall be natives of India resident at Karachi. With the same object we have provided in Section 7 that one trustee shall be elected by the Municipality of Karachi and have fixed the number of trustees to be elected by the Chamber of Commerce at three.
- 3. We suggest (Section 11) that the chairman shall hold office for a renewable period of five years, subject to removal by Government instead of his being appointed "during the pleasure of Government"; and that the term of office of the vice-chairman, if any be appointed by Government, shall be the same as that of an ordinary trustee.
- 4. Having regard to the fact that many of the gentlemen likely to be appointed trustees will frequently have occasion for being absent from Karáchi on leave or otherwise, we have made provision in Section 13 for the appointment of acting trustees to hold office temporarily during any absence of a trustee exceeding three months. This is the practice in Bombay under Section 13 of Bombay Act VI. of 1879.
- 5. In Section 23 we propose that any order made by the chairman for dismissing for misconduct an officer or servant whose monthly salary exceeds thirty rupees shall be subject to the approval of the board.

- 6. In the proviso to Section 25 we deem it expedient to reduce the term for which the board may lease immoveable property without the previous sanction of Government from fifty to twenty-one years, the latter term being, in our opinion, sufficient to cover all ordinary leases.
- 7. We have struck out Section 35, because it does not appear to us that at the port of Karáchi there are any "inland vessels" to which the provisions of that section would apply.
- 8. After Section 54, we propose the insertion of a new section enacting that the surplus, if any, of the port dues and other moneys credited, under Section 47 of the Indian Ports Act, 1875, to the Port Fund Account of Karáchi shall be paid, for the purposes of this Act, to the board. This is the course which has been followed in the case of the Bombay Port Trust, at first under Section 79 of Bombay Act I. of 1873 and since the passing of Bombay Act VI. of 1879, under the executive orders of Government; and it seems desirable to make a specific provision to this effect in the present Bill. The port-dues at Karáchi are at present collected and managed by the Harbour Board, and powers for this purpose will no doubt be conferred by Government, under the Indian Ports Act, 1875, on the new board when it is formed.

- 9. In Section 69 we have defined the public securities in which the board may invest their balances so as to include debentures of the Karáchi Municipality and also debentures or other securities issued by themselves or by the Karáchi Harbour Board. Liberty to invest in these local securities is likely to prove beneficial both to the Trust and to the Municipality and is not attended with any serious risk of loss.
- 10. We have added a proviso to Section 88 for the purpose of subjecting the board to the ordinary liability of bailees in respect of goods which they either land or ship or retain in their custody. As the Act may be used to give the board a monopoly of the right of landing and shipping at the port, it is fair that they should be subject to this liability.
- 11. We have completed the Schedule B. by adding to it the loan of fifteen and a half lakks recently sanctioned by the Government of India.
- 12. The other amendments which we have made are of minor importance and need not be specially noticed. They are indicated in the copy of the Bill which will be published with this Report.

Bill No. 4 of 1886.

A Bill to vest the Port of Karáchi in a Trust.

WHEREAS it is expedient to vest the port of Karáchi in a trust and to provide for the management of the affairs of the said port by trustees; It is enacted as follows:—

I .- PRELIMINARY.

- Short title.

 1. This Act may be called "The Karáchi Port Trust Act, 1886."
- 2. In this Act, unless there be something repugnant in the subject or context,
 - (1) "port" means the port of Kará-"port"; chi as defined for the purposes of this Act;

Whereas it is expedient to vest the port part-owner, charterer, consignee, or mort-Karáchi in a trust and to provide for gagee in possession thereof.

- 3. Government may, with the approval 1879, s. 3. of the Governor General in Council, by notification in the Bombay Government Gazette:
 - (a) define the limits of the port for the purpose of this Act, and
 - (b) from time to time alter such limits.

Such limits may extend to any part of the navigable approaches to the port, and may include any wharves, tramways, warehouses, sheds and other works made on behalf of the public for convenience of traffic, for safety of vessels, or for the improvement, maintenance, and good government of the port, whether within or without high-water mark, and, subject to any rights of private property therein, any portion of the shore within fifty yards of high-water mark.

II.—OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES.

Constitution of Board.

4. The duty of carrying out the provi-Bom. Act VI.

as are hereinafter contained, be vested in a board to be called "The Trustees of the Port of Karáchi"; and such board, hereinafter referred to as "the board," shall be a body corporate and have perpetual succession and a common seal, and shall sue and be sued by the name first aforesaid.

- 5. The board shall consist of nine members, of whom not less than two shall be natives of India residing in Karáchi such number of trustees as shall from time to time be fixed by Government, the same being not less than seven nor more than nine.
- Appointment of chairman and chairman appoint a person to be chairman of the board and may, if they think fit, from time to time appoint a person to be vice-chairman of the

public officer or not. Government may from time to time appoint a person, whether a public officer or not, to be chairman of the board. If the chairman of the board is a public officer, Government may appoint some other persen, whether a public officer or not, to be vice chair man of the board.

The chairman and, if any be appointed, the vice-chairman of the board, shall be trustees.

Of the rest of the trustees, one shall be the Manager, for Nomination of other the time being, of the North-Western Rail-

way, or such officer of the said Railway as the said Manager shall from time to time appoint to act for him in this behalf, and such number as shall from time to time be fixed by Government, the same being not less than two three shall be elected by the members for the time being of the Karáchi Chamber of Commerce, and one shall be elected by the municipal commissioners of Karáchi from among their own number.

The remaining trustees shall be appoint-

ed by Government.

Any trustee elected or appointed under this section may be a public officer or not.
