JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT.

Bombay Castle, 16th March 1920.

I.

No. 2580.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 11 of the Indian Motor Vehicles Act, 1914 (VIII of 1914), the Governor in Council is pleased to amend as follows the rules regulating the use of motor vehicles let or plying for hire in public places within the limits of the town and island of Bombay, published in Government Notification No. 705, dated 5th February 1917 :—

(1) In rule 3 of the said rules for the words "Bombay, and for such permit a fee of Rs. 5 shall be charged" substitute the following :—

"Bombay. A fee of Rs. 5 shall be charged for the permit, and a fee of Rs. 2-8-0 for every duplicate thereof."

(2) In rule 7 (4) after the word "renewal" insert the words "or duplicate."

(3) In rule 8 for the words "with the rates prescribed in the second schedule appended to this notification" substitute the following :—

"with a schedule approved by the Commissioner of Police, Bombay."

(4) In rule 50, as amended by Government Notification No. 6717, dated 12th August 1919 delete clause (g) and alter the designation of clauses (h), (i), (j), (k), (l) (m) and (n) to (g), (h), (i), (j), (k), (l) and (m), respectively.

(5) Immediately before rule 51 insert the following rule:—

“ 50-A. No driver or owner of a motor vehicle or agent employed on behalf of such driver or owner shall exact or demand more than the proper fare to which he is legally entitled.”

II.

No. 2581.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 11 of the Indian Motor Vehicles Act, 1914 (VIII of 1914), the Governor in Council is pleased to amend as follows the rules regulating the use of motor vehicles let or plying for hire in the District of Thana published in Government Notification No. 6252, dated 1st October 1917:—

(1) In rule 3 of the said rules for the words “ Thana, and for such permit a fee of Rs. 5 shall be charged ” substitute the following:—

“ Thana. A fee of Rs. 5 shall be charged for the permit and a fee of Rs. 2-8-0 for every duplicate thereof.”

(2) To the same rule make the following addition:—

“ The District Superintendent of Police shall enter on such permit the maximum number of passengers and quantity of luggage which may be carried at any one time in such vehicle.”

(3) In rule 7 (4) after the word “ renewal ” insert the words “ or duplicate.”

(4) In rule 8 for the words “ with the rates prescribed in the second schedule appended to this notification ” substitute the following:—

“ with a schedule to be approved by the District Magistrate of Thana.”

(5) In rule 50 delete clause (g) and alter the designation of clauses (h), (i), (j), (k), (l) and (m) to (g), (h), (i), (j), (k) and (l) respectively; and add the following clause:—

“ (m) carry any passenger or luggage in excess of the number of passengers or the quantity of luggage entered on the owner's permit under the provisions of rule 3.”

(6) Immediately before rule 51, insert the following rule:—

“ 50-A. No driver or owner of a motor vehicle or agent employed on behalf of such driver or owner shall exact or demand more than the proper fare to which he is legally entitled.”

III.

No. 2582.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 11 of the Indian Motor Vehicles Act, 1914 (VIII of 1914), the Governor in Council is pleased to amend as follows the rules regulating the use of motor vehicles let or plying for hire in the Kaira District, published in Government Notification No. 7710, dated 3rd December 1917:—

(1) In rule 3 of the said rules for the words “ Kaira, and for such permit a fee of Rs. 5 shall be charged ” substitute the following:—

“ Kaira. A fee of Rs. 5 shall be charged for the permit and a fee of Rs. 2-8-0 for every duplicate thereof.”

(2) To the same rule make the following addition:—

“ The District Superintendent of Police shall enter on such permit the maximum number of passengers and quantity of luggage which may be carried at any one time in such vehicle.”

(3) In rule 7 (4) after the word “ renewal ” insert the words “ or duplicate.”

(4) To rule 94, as amended by Government Notification No. 6712, dated 12th August 1919 add the following clause:—

“ (l) carry any passenger or luggage in excess of the number of passengers or the quantity of luggage entered on the owner's permit under the provisions of rule 8.”

IV.

No. 2583.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 11 of the Indian Motor Vehicles Act, 1914 (VIII of 1914), the Governor in Council is pleased to amend as follows the rules regulating the use of motor vehicles let or plying for hire in the Ahmedabad District, published in Government Notification No. 7712, dated 3rd December 1917:—

(1) In rule 3 of the said rules for the words “ Ahmedabad, and for such permit a fee of Rs. 5 shall be charged ” substitute the following:—

“ Ahmedabad. A fee of Rs. 5 shall be charged for the permit, and a fee of Rs. 2-8-0 for every duplicate thereof.”

(2) To the same rule make the following addition:—

“The District Superintendent of Police shall enter on such permit the maximum number of passengers and quantity of luggage which may be carried at any one time in such vehicle.”

(3) In rule 7 (4) of the said rules after the word “renewal” insert the words “or duplicate.”

(4) In rule 8 for the words “with the rates prescribed in the second schedule appended to this notification” substitute the following:—

“with a schedule to be approved by the District Magistrate of Ahmedabad.”

(5) In rule 36 delete clause (g), and alter the designation of clauses (h), (i), (j), (k), and (l), to (g), (h), (i), (j), and (k), respectively; and add the following clause:—

“(l) carry any passenger or luggage in excess of the number of passengers or the quantity of luggage entered on the owner's permit under the provisions of rule 3.”

(6) Immediately before rule 37 insert the following rule:—

“36-A. No driver or owner of a motor vehicle or agent employed on behalf of such driver or owner shall exact or demand more than the proper fare to which he is legally entitled.

V:

No. 2584.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 11 of the Indian Motor Vehicles Act, 1914 (VIII of 1914), the Governor in Council is pleased to amend as follows the rules regulating the use of motor vehicles let or plying for hire in the District of West Khandesh, published in Government Notification No. 1096, dated 15th February 1918:—

(1) In rule 3 of the said rules for the words “West Khandesh, and for such permits a fee of Rs. 5 shall be charged” substitute the following:—

“West Khandesh. A fee of Rs. 5 shall be charged for the permit and a fee of Rs. 2-8-0 for every duplicate thereof.”

(2) In the addition made to the said rule 3 by Government Notification No. 4075, dated the 23rd May 1919 after the word “passengers” insert the words “and quantity of luggage.”

(3) In rule 7 (4) after the word “renewal” insert the words “or duplicate.”

“with a schedule to be approved by the District Magistrate of West Khandesh.”

(2) To the same rule make the following addition :—

"The District Superintendent of Police shall enter on such permit the maximum number of passengers and quantity of luggage which may be carried at any one time in such vehicle."

(3) In rule 7 (4) after the word “renewal” insert the words “or duplicate.”

(4) In rule 8 for the words “with the rates prescribed in the second schedule appended to this notification” substitute the following :—

“with a schedule to be approved by the District Magistrate of Belgaum.”

(5) To rule 36, as amended by Government Notification No. 6715, dated the 12th August 1919, add the following clause :—

(2) To the same rule make the following addition :—

“The District Superintendent of Police shall enter on such permit the maximum number of passengers and quantity of luggage which may be carried at any one time in such vehicle.”

(3) In rule 7 (4) after the word “renewal” insert the words “or duplicate.”

(4) To rule 34, as amended by Government Notification No. 6714, dated the 12th August 1919, add the following clause :—

(l) carry any passenger or luggage in excess of the passengers or the quantity of luggage entered on the owner's permit under the provisions of rule 3.”

(2) To the same rule make the following addition :—

“The District Superintendent of Police shall enter on such permit the maximum number of passengers and quantity of luggage which may be carried at any one time in such vehicle.”

(3) In rule 7 (4) after the word “renewal” insert the words “or duplicate.”

(4) In rule 8 for the words “with the rates prescribed in the second schedule appended to this notification” substitute the following :—

“with a schedule to be approved by the District Magistrate of Kolaba.”

the rules regulating the use of motor vehicles let or plying for hire at public places in Aden, published in Government Notification No. 6089, dated 24th September 1917:—

(1) In rule 3 of the said rules for the words "Aden, and for such permit a fee of Rs. 5 shall be charged" substitute the following:—

"Aden. A fee of Rs. 5 shall be charged for the permit and a fee of Rs. 2-8-0 for every duplicate thereof."

(2) To the same rule make the following addition:—

"The District Magistrate shall enfer on such permit the maximum number of passengers and quantity of luggage which may be carried at any one time in such vehicle."

(3) In rule 8 for the words "with the rates prescribed in the schedule appended to this notification" substitute the following:—

"with a schedule to be approved by the Political Resident at Aden."

(4) In rule 32 delete clause (g) and alter the designation of clauses (h), (i) and (j) to (g), (h) and (i) respectively; and add the following clause:—

"(j) carry any passenger or luggage in excess of the number of passengers or the quantity of luggage entered on the owner's permit under the provisions of rule 3."

(5) Immediately before rule 33, insert the following rule:—

"32-A. No driver or owner of a motor vehicle or agent employed on behalf of such driver or owner shall exact or demand more than the proper fare to which he is legally entitled."

Bombay Castle, 22nd March 1920.

No. 2859.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 11 of the Indian Motor Vehicles Act, 1914 (VIII of 1914), the Governor in Council is pleased to make the following rules to regulate the use of motor vehicles let or plying for hire in public places within the limits of the district of Broach, hereinafter referred to as the said limits. The rules shall come into force on the 1st of May 1920.

Rules.

1. In these rules "motor vehicle" shall mean a motor vehicle let or plying for hire.

2. Such of the Bombay Motor Vehicles Rules, 1915, as are not inconsistent with the provisions of these rules shall apply to motor vehicles let or plying for hire.

3. No motor vehicle shall be let or plied for hire in public places within the said limits without an owner's permit granted by the District Superintendent of Police, Broach. A fee of Rs. 5 shall be charged for the permit and a fee of Rs. 2-8-0 for every duplicate thereof. Such permit shall be in form A set forth in the schedule appended to this notification with such variations as the circumstances require. The District Superintendent shall enter on such permit the maximum number of passengers and quantity of luggage which may be carried at any one time in such vehicles.

4. Subject to rule 5, such permit shall remain in force from the date on which it is granted until the 31st March following, and shall not be transferred to any person without sanction duly endorsed thereon by the District Superintendent of Police.

5. A motor vehicle shall be liable to examination at such times as the District Superintendent of Police may prescribe, and the owner's permit may be suspended or cancelled by him, if the vehicle does not comply with the requirements of these rules or with those of the Bombay Motor Vehicles Rules, 1915, or is not passed by the District Superintendent of Police as fit to ply for hire or is not produced for examination, at such time and place as the District Superintendent of Police may require.

6. The owner of a motor vehicle shall maintain regularly a register in such form as the District Superintendent of Police may direct showing the name of the driver and the hours and dates on which the driver was in charge of the motor vehicle.

7. (1) A motor vehicle let or plying for hire shall not, under any circumstances, be driven by any person other than a driver who shall hold and produce, whenever required by a Police Officer, a public driver's permit signed by the District Superintendent of Police. Such permit will not be granted unless the driver satisfies the District Superintendent of Police that he is a competent and careful driver, that he has a thorough knowledge of the rates for hire sanctioned, and that he is in all respects a fit person to be the driver of a motor vehicle to be let or plied for hire.

(2) A public driver's permit will be granted only to a person who already holds an ordinary license to drive which is for the time being in force.

(3) A public driver's permit shall remain in force from the date on which it is granted until the 31st March following, but shall cease to be in force if the holder's license to drive is suspended or cancelled, or expires and is not renewed.

(4) A fee of Rs. 4 shall be charged for the permit and a fee of Rs. 2 for every renewal or duplicate thereof. Such permit shall be in form B set forth in the schedule appended to this notification, with such variations as the circumstances require.

8. The rates for the fare or hire of a motor vehicle let or plied for hire, and for the detention of, and the carriage of packages in, the same shall be in accordance with a schedule to be approved by the District Magistrate, Broach.

9. Every motor vehicle intended to be let or plied for hire within the said limits must be taken to the office of the District Superintendent of Police for inspection. The owner or person in charge of such motor vehicle shall at the same time produce the certificate of the registration of the motor vehicle under the Bombay Motor Vehicle Rules of 1915.

10. The brakes shall, as far as possible, be so affixed as to be capable of easy adjustment, and at least one brake must be so made as to be applied by the foot of the driver. The brakes will at any time be subject to inspection.

11. All brake and steering connections secured with bolts must have such bolts secured with nuts and locked or pinned. These parts will at any time be subject to inspection.

12. The machinery should be so constructed that no undue noise or vibration is caused.

13. All parts connected by bolts or studs or nuts subject to severe vibration must be fastened by lock nuts or by nuts and approved spring or lock nut washers to prevent their working loose and making a rattling noise, and any motor vehicle with lamp brackets, mudguard brackets, and other carriage fittings so loose as likely to cause unnecessary noise will be regarded as unfit for use as a public conveyance.

14. Carburettors must not be placed in close proximity to magnetos or to connections of wires carrying electric current, unless they are suitably encased or screened.

15. Effective means must be adopted for preventing the heat of the motor or of the exhaust pipe connections from injuriously affecting other parts of the motor vehicle or the comfort of the passengers. All wires carrying electric current must be properly insulated and protected from injury, and so placed that they cannot be the cause of danger.

16. Tanks for petrol or other liquid fuel must be made of suitable material properly constructed and of sufficient strength. They should be so placed that any overflow shall not accumulate on wood work, or where it can be readily ignited. The filling nozzle or inlet for the petrol or other liquid fuel should, where possible, be brought to the outside of the body.

17. When a guard or tray is fixed underneath, it must be so constructed that any overflow of petrol from the carburettor shall not be retained in the tray.

18. The machinery must be so constructed or placed that oil from the bearings shall not be allowed to drop on to the roadway. When trays are fixed to prevent this, they must have suitable webs for retaining the oil when ascending or descending hills or be otherwise suitably constructed with that object; the oil must be cleaned out frequently and not allowed to accumulate from day to day.

19. The lubrication of the engine and the carburation of the working mixture must be so controlled that smoke is not ejected with the exhaust or from any other part.

20. The outlet from the silencer should not be so placed as to eject the exhaust directly on the roadway, or so placed, or so directed, as to alarm horses immediately behind the motor vehicle.

21. Each car must be capable of being readily steered and able to turn on each lock and proceed in a contrary direction within a reasonable space.

22. Provision must be made for the conveyance of a reasonable quantity of luggage and efficient means provided by chains, straps or other means of securing it. When it is intended to carry luggage on the roof there must also be an approved fixed roof guard rail.

Provided that the District Superintendent of Police may grant exemption from this rule either generally or in particular cases.

23. Where acetylene or other gas is used to light the carriage, the cylinders or vessels which contain the gas or in which it is generated must be fixed outside in such a position as to be removed as far as possible from the danger of accidental ignition.

24. The floor must be covered with mats of rubber, coir or of some other suitable material.

25. No printed, written or other matter shall appear on the inside or outside of the motor vehicle or be carried by way of advertisement.

26. No celluloid or xylonite fittings shall be placed inside or outside the motor vehicle, but this rule does not apply to the inside of the accumulators.

27. The cushions of seats, where such are provided, must be covered with suitable material, and must be stuffed with suitable material.

28. The doors, windows, seats, roof, springs, cushions, wheels, linings, panels and all furniture and appointments of the motor vehicle must be in proper order and repair, the paint and varnish in good condition, and the inside perfectly clean.

29. The driver when on duty with his motor vehicle shall wear in a conspicuous place on his left breast a metal badge which shall be numbered and supplied to him by the District Superintendent of Police.

30. The driver shall not transfer or lend his permit or badge to any person, and on his permit being suspended or cancelled or ceasing to be in force, the permit and badge shall be surrendered to the District Superintendent of Police.

31. As often as the driver changes his residence he shall give notice thereof at the office of the District Superintendent of Police in writing, within one week after such change.

32. No vehicle shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare or opposite the entrance of any street or carriage way.

33. No driver shall, without reasonable excuse, refuse to accept a fare.

34. The driver shall, in the absence of reasonable cause to the contrary, proceed to the destination named by the hirer by the shortest and quickest route.

35. No driver of a motor vehicle shall—

(a) be drunk during his employment;

(b) make use of insulting or abusive language or gesture;

(c) stand (elsewhere than at some stand or other place appointed for the purpose) or loiter for the purpose of being hired, in or upon any public street or road or place;

(d) refuse to give way (when reasonably and conveniently may and should do so) to any other vehicle;

(e) wilfully obstruct or hinder the driver of any other motor vehicle in taking up or setting down any person into or from such other vehicle;

(f) wrongfully prevent or attempt to prevent the driver of any other motor vehicle from being hired;

(g) terminate the hiring before he has been discharged by the hirer;

(h) ply for hire any motor vehicle which is at the time unfit for public use;

(i) shout in order to attract the attention of the public or of a possible hirer, or, for any other reason, act in such a way as to cause inconvenience or annoyance to the public;

(j) make use of the motor vehicle in connection with or for the furtherance of prostitution, or act as a habitual procurer for prostitutes or live on the earnings of prostitutes;

(k) allow a cleaner or any other attendant to sit in the motor vehicle when hired by a passenger, or

(l) carry any passenger or luggage in excess of the number of passengers or the quantity of luggage entered on the owner's permit under the provisions of rule 3.

36. No driver or owner of a motor vehicle or agent employed on behalf of such driver or owner shall exact or demand more than the proper fare to which he is legally entitled.

37. The driver shall be properly dressed in clean uniform of the description prescribed by the District Superintendent of Police.

38. The holder of an owner's permit granted for a motor vehicle to be let or plied for hire shall not knowingly make use of the motor vehicle, or cause it to be used, in connection with or for the furtherance of prostitution or act as a habitual procurer for prostitutes, or live on the earnings of prostitutes.

39. The District Superintendent of Police may in his discretion suspend or cancel any public driver's permit or owner's permit where the holder thereof has committed any breach of these rules.

IN THE MATTER OF THE "JEHANGIR DINSHAW VAKIL COMMERCIAL SCHOOL FUND" IN CONNECTION WITH THE R. S. DALAL HIGH SCHOOL, BROACH.

Vesting Order and Scheme.

No. 1311.

Whereas application has been made to the Governor of Bombay in Council by Mr. Dinshaw Bomanji Vakil, a Parsi gentleman of Broach, that the securities to the amount of rupees forty-six thousand and two hundred (46,200) specified in the second schedule hereto bearing interest at $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. per annum be vested under the Charitable Endowments Act, 1890 (VI of 1890), in the Treasurer of Charitable Endowments for the territories subject to the Governor of Bombay in Council in order and upon the terms that the income accruing therefrom may be applied for the purpose of maintaining a School of Commerce attached to the R. S. Dalal High School at Broach in memory of his deceased son, Jehangir Dinshaw Vakil, and also that a scheme for the administration of the property so to be vested be settled under the provisions of the said Act;

And whereas the Governor in Council has approved of, and agreed to, the said terms as to the application of the said income as the same are hereinafter set forth and has in pursuance of section 5 of the said Act, with the concurrence of the aforesaid Mr. Dinshaw Bomanji Vakil, settled the scheme for the administration of the said property which is set forth in the first schedule hereto annexed;

Under and by virtue of the powers conferred by sections 4 (1) and 5 (1) of the said Act, the Governor in Council is hereby pleased on the application aforesaid of the said Mr. Dinshaw Bomanji Vakil, to order that the Government Promissory Notes to the amount of rupees forty-six thousand and two hundred (46,200) particulars whereof are set forth in the second schedule hereto be and the same are hereby vested in the Treasurer of Charitable Endowments for the Presidency of Bombay, upon the terms that the same shall be

held as an endowment for the purposes and objects mentioned in the said scheme set forth in the first schedule hereto and that he shall collect or draw the income or interest thereof as and when the same becomes due and payable and shall pay the same as and when the same shall from time to time be received to the person or the persons appointed to administer the same under the said scheme and that such scheme shall come into operation as on the date hereof.

The First Schedule above referred to.

SCHEME.

1. The endowment fund shall be known as "the Jehangir Dinshaw Vakil Commercial School Fund."

2. The income accruing from the fund shall be administered by the Educational Inspector, Northern Division, and the Head Master of the R. S. Dalal High School, Broach.

3. The income accruing from the fund shall be devoted to the maintenance of a commercial school at Broach to be called "the Jehangir Dinshaw Vakil Commercial School", in the following manner:—

(a) the school shall consist of a junior and a senior class and for the purposes of supervision and management, shall be attached to the R. S. Dalal High School, Broach, and shall be subject for the said purposes to the control of the Head Master of the said High School, but for all other purposes it shall constitute a separate unit. The rules governing discipline shall be the same as those in force in the said High School;

(b) the course of studies shall cover a period of two years and the subjects and syllabus shall be the same as those prescribed for the London Chamber of Commerce Examinations;

(c) students who have passed the 5th standard examination of any Anglo-Vernacular school recognised by the Educational Department of Government shall be eligible for admission to the school;

(d) the monthly fees payable in the school shall be one rupee in the junior class and two rupees in the senior class;

(e) the staff shall consist of two teachers holding the London Chamber of Commerce and Pitman's Diploma qualifications and one peon;

(f) while the school occupies rented premises, the fees realized shall be devoted to paying the rent of such premises but any balance remaining to be paid shall not be defrayed from the income accruing from the fund;

(g) any savings that may accrue from any cause whatsoever shall be utilised from time to time in such manner as the administrators may deem fit;

(h) the administrators of the income of the fund shall adhere so far as may be to the scheme of administration herein outlined but shall be deemed to have full authority to alter or add to the said scheme as circumstances shall require.

4. The trust shall operate in favour of any other institution by which the Jehangir Dinshaw Vakil Commercial School, Broach, may with the approval of the Governor in Council be replaced and for such other purposes of a like nature or in furtherance of the intent specified as shall at any time seem proper to the Governor in Council and the investment, management and dispensation of the fund shall be at the discretion of Government.

The following extract from the Board of Trade Journal, dated the 19th February 1920, is published for general information :—

GOVERNMENT NOTICES AFFECTING TRADE.

IMPORT AND EXPORT SECTION.

TRADING WITH GERMANY.

The information as to the conditions under which commercial and financial transactions are permissible with German nationals and with persons and firms carrying on business in Germany, published in December last in a Parliamentary Return, Cmd. 512, is rendered out of date by the ratification of the Treaty of Peace with Germany and the issue of an Order-in-Council fixing 10th January 1920 (the date on which the Treaty came into force) as the legal date of the termination of the war with that country.

Trade with Germany is in general no longer subject to any restrictions other than those imposed on trade with other foreign countries.

Any goods may be exported to Germany without licence, except goods on Lists A and B of Prohibited Exports,* and any goods may be imported into the United Kingdom from Germany except goods on the importation of which from all countries restrictions have been or may be imposed.

The following considerations must, however, be borne in mind in transacting business with German nationals :—

- (a) All property, rights, and interests within the British Empire belonging to German nationals at the date on which the Treaty of Peace came into force (namely, 10th January 1920, unless acquired as the result of a transaction undertaken since the resumption of trade with Germany was authorised (*i.e.*, since 12th July 1919), are subject to charge under the Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, and no transaction of a commercial and financial nature is therefore permissible which involves the delivery, sale, or transfer of any such property, rights or interests.
- (b) The settlement of all outstanding debts between British subjects resident within the United Kingdom, and German nationals resident in Germany, with the exception of debts arising out of transactions undertaken since 12th July 1919, must be effected through the medium of the Clearing Office for Enemy Debts, and any transaction involving the settlement or transfer of such debts is prohibited.

Subject to such restrictions as may be imposed by the German authorities, individuals and firms of British nationality are at liberty to invest money in German businesses and to establish firms or agencies in Germany.

The freedom of Germans to trade, to carry on business, and to acquire property in the United Kingdom is limited by the following special restrictions imposed on nationals of Germany, Austria, Hungary, Bulgaria and Turkey :—

- (a) For a period of three years from 23rd December 1919, no national of the above-mentioned countries may enter the United Kingdom without a special licence or remain in this country for a longer period than three months, except as provided in section 10 of the Aliens Restriction (Amendment) Act, 1919.
- (b) For a period of three years from 23rd December 1919, no national of the above-mentioned countries will be permitted to acquire any interest in land, in any concern carrying on a 'key industry' (as presently to be defined by the Board of Trade), or in any company owning a ship registered in the United Kingdom. [Vide section 11, Aliens Restriction (Amendment) Act, 1919.]

* For the export to Germany of goods on Lists A and B export licenses must be obtained from the Imports and Exports Licensing Section, Board of Trade, Great George Street, S. W. 1.

- (c) For a period of five years after the termination of the war no business connected with certain non-ferrous metals and metallic ores may be carried on by, or under the influence or control of, a national of the abovementioned countries, except under licence of the Board of Trade. [Vide Non-Ferrous Metal Industry Act, 1918, and Non-Ferrous Metal Industry Rules, 1918.]
- (d) For a period of five years after the termination of the war, and thereafter until Parliament may otherwise determine, no banking business may be carried on for the benefit or under the control of a national of the abovementioned countries. [Vide section 2, Trading with the Enemy Act, 1918, and Enemy Banking Business Rules, 1918.]
- (e) No national of the abovementioned countries may act as master, officer, or member of the crew of a British ship registered in the United Kingdom. [Vide section 12, Aliens Restriction (Amendment) Act, 1919.]

With the above reservations Germans are at liberty to acquire shares or interests in British firms or companies and to establish business houses or agencies in the United Kingdom, subject only to the same restrictions as aliens of any other nationality.

With reference to the Open General Licence for the Export of Industrial Explosives, Smooth-Bore Guns, and Munitions for use therewith, announced in the 'Board of Trade Journal' of 8th January 1920, the Board of Trade (Licensing Section) announce that

ICELAND

is now added to the List of Countries to which the Open General Licence applies, and that in accordance with Article 6, Chapter 2, of the 'Convention for the Control of the Trade in Arms and Ammunition' all consignments of Arms and Ammunition proceeding into or through any of the Prohibited Areas set out below will require a Specific Export Licence.

The prohibited areas are :—

- (1) The whole of the Continent of Africa with the exception of Algeria, Libya, and the Union of South Africa.

(Within this area are included all islands, situated within a hundred nautical miles of the coast, together with Prince's Island, St. Thomas Island, and the Islands of Annobon and Socotra.)

- (2) Transcaucasia, Persia, Gwadar, the Arabian Peninsula, and such Continental parts of Asia as were included in the Turkish Empire on 4th August 1914.
- (3) A maritime zone, including the Red Sea, the Gulf of Aden, the Persian Gulf, and the Sea of Oman, and bounded by a line drawn from Cape Guardafui, following the latitude of that cape to its intersection with longitude 57 deg. east of Greenwich, and proceeding thence direct to the eastern frontier of Persia in the Gulf of Oman.
