In pursuance of section 4 of the Rouble Note Act, 1920 (XXX of 1920), the Governor General in Council is pleased to authorise all District Magistrates and, in the case of Presidency towns, Commissioners of Police, to issue licenses under the said section permitting the withdrawal of rouble notes deposited in treasuries and currency offices within their respective jurisdictions.

In pursuance of section 5 of the Rouble Note Act, 1920 (XXX of 1920), the Governor General in Council is pleased to direct that all rouble notes confiscated under the said section shall be deposited in the nearest treasury or currency office pending further orders.

“ACCOUNTS AND FINANCE.—BANKS.

No. 658-A., dated Simla, the 15th October 1920.

Whereas by sub-section (2) of section 1 of the Imperial Bank of India Act, 1920 (XLVII of 1920), it is provided that the said Act shall come into force on such date as the Governor General in Council may appoint; and power is conferred under the said Act to appoint Governors of the Imperial Bank;

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 22 of the General Clauses Act, 1897 (X of 1897), read with clause (iii) of sub-section (1) of section 28 of the Imperial Bank of India Act, 1920 (XLVII of 1920), the Governor General in Council is pleased to nominate the following gentlemen, not being officers of Government, to be Governors of the Imperial Bank of India, on and from the date on which the Imperial Bank of India Act, 1920, comes into force, namely:—

## JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT.

Secretariat, Fort, Bombay, 20th October 1920.

No. 9866.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 of the Schedule Districts Act, 1874 (XIV of 1874), the Governor in Council is pleased to amend Government Notification in the Judicial Department, dated 17th March 1854, prescribing rules for the civil and criminal administration of those parts of the Parganas of Nandurbar, Sultánpur and Kukurmunda in the province of Khándesh which are specified in the First Schedule annexed to the said Act, as follows, namely :—

- (1) In the preamble to the said notification, the words " and criminal " shall be deleted.
- (2) In Chapter I, rule 1, First, the words " the superintendence of the police, and " shall be deleted.
- (3) Chapter III containing rules XXVI to XLVIII with the heading " Criminal Branch " shall be cancelled.

No. 9867.—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (2) of section 7 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1898 (V of 1898), and in modification of Government Notification in the Judicial Department, No. 5959, dated 7th November 1906, the Governor in Council is pleased to alter the limits of the district of West Khándesh by directing that the villages of the Mehwássi Chiefs mentioned in item IV of Part II of the First Schedule annexed to the Scheduled Districts Act, 1874 (XIV of 1874), shall, with effect from the 20th day of October 1920, be included in and form part of the said district.

No. 9872.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 20-A of the Stage-Carriages Act, XVI of 1861, the Governor in Council is pleased to make the following rules for the regulation of stage carriages plying for hire between Bárdoli Railway Station and Bárdoli town, and Bárdoli Railway Station and Sarbhon in the Surat District :—

1. Licenses under section 2 of the Act shall be issued by the Sub-Divisional Magistrate in charge of Bárdoli Táluka. For each license the proprietor of the stage carriage shall pay a fee of annas eight. Licenses which shall remain in force for one year from the date of their issue, if not otherwise cancelled, may be renewed on payment of the above fee.
2. Such licenses shall be granted in the form hereto annexed (Form A).
3. A register shall be kept in which shall be entered a description of every stage carriage, licensed under these rules, which has been inspected and approved for use as a stage carriage.
4. Before a license is issued for any carriage under these rules the carriage shall be produced before the Sub-Divisional Magistrate or any other officer appointed by him in this behalf to whom shall be furnished all the information required for filling up the register and the license.
5. Every holder of a license issued under these rules shall produce or cause to be produced the carriage with its horses for which the license is given, for inspection by the Sub-Divisional Magistrate or by any officer appointed by him in this behalf, at any time at which he may be called on to do so during the currency of the license unless at the time engaged in plying for hire.
6. The proprietor of every stage carriage licensed under these rules—
  - (a) shall, whenever he may change his residence or office, give notice in writing to the Sub-Divisional Magistrate of such change within one week thereof, and
  - (b) shall not transfer or lend to any person any license granted under these rules without obtaining an endorsement in writing from the Sub-Divisional Magistrate on the reverse of such license, sanctioning such transfer or loan.
7. Every proprietor of a stage carriage licensed under these rules, or agent or driver of such proprietor, who shall disobey the provisions of rule 6, or knowingly permit them to be disobeyed, and every proprietor, who shall disobey the provisions of rule 5, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 100 (one hundred only).
8. Every conviction for a breach of these rules shall be entered on the license and noted in the register.

## FORM A.

STAGE CARRIAGE LICENSE No.

*Head Office of the Proprietor.*

By virtue of the powers vested in me by the rules made by the Local Government under section 20-A of the Stage-Carriages Act, XVI of 1861, as amended by Act I of 1898, I hereby



grant to you.....resident of.....this license to keep and let for hire the carriage numbered as above for one year on the conditions hereunder set forth :—

1. It shall be drawn by <sup>one horse.</sup>  
two horses.
2. It shall not carry more than four passengers in a horse carriage.
3. It shall not carry more than the following number of passengers and weight of luggage below mentioned :—
  - (a) A one-horse carriage may carry half a maund of luggage and three passengers and an extra maund of luggage for every passenger less than that number.
  - (b) A two-horse carriage may carry one maund of luggage and four passengers and an extra maund of luggage for every passenger less than that number.
  - (c) A child under 14 shall count as half a passenger and infants in arms shall not be counted at all.
  - (d) The driver shall be exclusive of the number of the passengers above quoted.

*Note.*—Infringements of the conditions of the license are punishable on conviction under section 8 of the Act with fine not exceeding Rs. 100 in the case of first conviction and Rs. 500 in the case of any subsequent conviction. This license is liable to be cancelled if the stage carriage or any harness or any yoke used with such carriage is unserviceable or unsafe or otherwise unfit for public accommodation or use.

“ JUDICIAL.

No. 1650, dated Simla, the 27th September 1920.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 5, clause (b), of the Whipping Act, 1909 (IV of 1909) and in supersession of the Home Department Notification No. 62, dated the 4th April 1917, the Governor General in Council is pleased to specify the offences under the enactments and rules mentioned in the schedule hereto annexed, being offences punishable under the said enactments and rules with imprisonment, as offences for the abetment or commission of, or attempt to commit which, juvenile offenders may be punished with whipping in accordance with the provisions of the said section.

No person shall remove timber or other forest produce from any reserved or protected forest and no person shall remove any timber or charcoal from any land which is not included in a reserved or protected forest from or to any place within ten miles of such forest, without obtainning a pass from the Forest Officer in charge of the Sind Forest Circle or from an officer specially empowered by him in this behalf or from a person duly authorised under rule 2 to issue such pass, nor otherwise than in accordance with the conditions of such pass, except as is hereinafter provided :

Provided that nothing in this rule shall be deemed—

- (1) to apply to timber or forest produce which is the property of Government; or
- (2) to apply to timber or forest produce the property of one person or the joint property of two or more persons which is conveyed in a quantity not exceeding one cart or camel load; or
- (3) to require a pass for the removal of any timber or other forest produce within the limits of the zemindari estate in which it was produced.”

No. 3029.—In accordance with the provisions of section 69 of the Indian Registration Act, 1908 (XVI of 1908), the Governor in Council is pleased, in modification of Government Notification in the Revenue Department, No. 3883, dated 3rd April 1911, to approve, with effect from the 15th day of December 1920, the following further amendments in the rules under the said section, framed by the Inspector General of Registration, namely:—

1. Substitute the following for the illustrations to rule 20 of the said rules:—
  - (1) When a District or Sub-Registrar impounds a document for insufficiency of stamp duty,
  - (2) When a Sub-Registrar postpones registration pending receipt of sanction to the levy of fine,
  - (3) When a Sub-Registrar refuses registration, he shall enter a note in the Minute Book.
2. In rule 56 of the said rules, for the words “ shall be copied by the ..... column 4 ” the words “ the substance of the order, with a brief statement of the reasons therefor in case of refusal, shall be copied by the latter in column 5 ” shall be substituted.
3. In rule 65 of the said rules, the words “ the first four columns of ” shall be deleted.
4. In Appendix B of the appendices to the said rules:—
  - (a) for the heading in column 5, the following shall be substituted—“ order under sections 72, 75, 76 (1) (a) or 77 with brief statement of reasons in case of refusal,”
  - (b) in note 3, for the words “ copied *verbatim*,” the words “ entered briefly ” shall be substituted.

In rule 3 of Part I of the said rules after the words " by rule I of Part V " the following shall be inserted :—

" and these vessels shall be of such strength and construction or so protected as not to be liable to be broken or to become defective or insecure in conveyance, otherwise than by gross negligence or extraordinary accident."

2. In rule 3 of Part I of the said rules the word " substantial " shall be omitted.
3. In Part I of the said rules, after rule 7 the following rule shall be added, *namely* :—

" 7A. All carbide of calcium landed from any ship shall be removed without unnecessary delay to some duly licensed place of storage, and, if conveyed by



water, shall be conveyed only in an open barge duly licensed by the Trustees of the Port of Bombay for the conveyance of carbide of calcium."

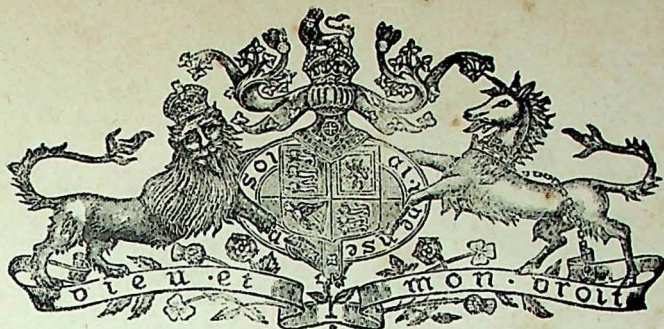
