EDUCATIONAL DEPARTMENT.

No. 4160.—His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to sanction the following rules for regulating the grant of stipends to passed students of the Workshop Classes attached to the College of Engineering, Poona, in supersession of those issued in Government Notification No. 3150, dated the 10th October 1914 :—

Rules regulating the grant of stipends to passed students of the Workshop Classes of the College of Engineering, Poona.

1. Stipends will be granted for a period of two years to thirteen students of the College Workshops who have gone through the three years' course for Mechanical or Electrical Apprentices and satisfactorily passed the final examination. They will be required to serve for two years in a practical workshop in the Bombay Presidency, approved by the Director of Public Instruction, or in one of the following workshops :—

B. B. and C. I. Railway Works, Ajmer.

Tata Iron and Steel Works, Jamshedpur.

M. and S. M. Railway Works, Perambur.

E. I. Railway Works, Jamalpur.

B. N. Railway Works, Khargpur near Calcutta.

The amount of each stipend will be Rs. 15 per mensem in the first year and Rs. 10 per mensem in the second year.

2. Applications for the stipends should be made to the Principal, College of Engineering, Poona, on or before the 1st June. Those selected should join the approved workshops to which they are assigned by the College authorities on the 1st July.

3. A holder of a stipend may, with the permission of the Principal on sufficient grounds, be transferred from the workshop to which he is assigned to another approved workshop as defined in rule 1. No holder of a stipend may leave the workshop to which he has been assigned without the permission of the Principal in writing.

4. The stipends are payable monthly, in arrears, subject to the usual conditions of good conduct, regular attendance and satisfactory progress.

5. The holder of a stipend who has completed this period of two years of outside apprenticeship, will receive a special endorsement on his certificate provided that he obtains a report of good work and good conduct from the managers of the Workshops in which he has served.

6. Every apprentice must, before drawing his first stipend, sign an agreement to the effect that he is prepared to serve in an approved workshop for a period of two years and that in case of failure to carry out this undertaking, he will forfeit a sum equal to the total amount of the stipends drawn by him.

“ Where after the expiration of three years and six months from the commencement of the License ”

were substituted.

5A. A driving license granted under rule 2 may be cancelled or suspended by a written order for a period not exceeding one year by the authority by which it was granted and for reasons to be recorded by such authority, provided that no such license shall be cancelled or suspended unless the driver has been convicted of an offence under the Act or the rules made thereunder, or of any offence under the Indian Penal Code arising out of the use of a motor vehicle."

Draft Notification.

No. —In exercise of the powers conferred by section 9 of the Indian Petroleum Act, 1899 (VIII of 1899), the Governor in Council with the previous sanction of the Governor-General in Council, is pleased further to amend the rules for the importation, possession and transport of carbide of calcium into and in the Presidency of Bombay, published in Government Notification in the General Department, No. 2692, dated the 4th May 1906, as follows, *namely* :—

In rule 3 of Part I of the said rules after the words " by rule I of Part V " the following shall be inserted :—

" and these vessels shall be of such strength and construction or so protected as not to be liable to be broken or to become defective or insecure in conveyance, otherwise than by gross negligence or extraordinary accident."

2. In rule 3 of Part I of the said rules the word " substantial " shall be omitted.

3. In Part I of the said rules, after rule 7 the following rule shall be added, *namely* :—

" 7A. All carbide of calcium landed from any ship shall be removed without unnecessary delay to some duly licensed place of storage, and, if conveyed by water, shall be conveyed only in an open barge duly licensed by the Trustees of the Port of Bombay for the conveyance of carbide of calcium."

No. 7243, dated Simla, the 23rd October 1920.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 7 of the Indian Aircraft Act, 1911 (XVII of 1911), and in supersession of the notification of the Government of India in the Department of Commerce and Industry, No. 117-C.A.,* dated the 14th February 1920, the Governor General in Council is pleased to prohibit the navigation of aircraft over the areas specified in the Schedule hereto annexed.

 - (d) *Sind*—the triangular area enclosed between the Karachi-Kotri Railway and the River Indus (right bank) below Kotri; the Indus to be crossed anywhere southward of a point five miles below Kotri Railway Bridge.
 - (e) *Mekran*—a ‘corridor’ 20 miles wide along the Mekran coast.
- (2) All territory lying within 3 miles of the arsenal at Quetta.
- (3) All territory lying within 5 miles of the light-house at Manora (near Karachi).
- (4) All territory lying within 3 miles of the arsenals at:—
 - (i) Rawalpindi.
 - (ii) Ferozepore.
- (5) All territory lying within 1 mile of Viceregal Lodge, Delhi.
- (6) All territory lying within a radius of one mile from the main gate of the Kirkee Arsenal.
- (7) The Town and Island of Bombay including the docks and bulk oil installations.
- (8) The Kidderpore docks (Calcutta).
- (9) The site of the new King George’s docks (Calcutta).
- (10) The jetties (Calcutta).
- (11) The River Hooghly between the Botanical Gardens and Howrah Bridge (Calcutta).
- (12) The petroleum depôt at Budge Budge.
- (13) The powder magazine at Moyapore.
- (14) All territory lying within 3 miles of Fort Chingri Khal (near Diamond Harbour, Calcutta).
- (15) All territory lying within 7 miles of the Syriam Pagoda, Rangoon.
- (16) The oil refineries at Syriam on the Pegu River (Burma).

No. C./333.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 43 of the Indian Income Tax Act, 1918 (VII of 1918), such powers having been delegated by the Government of India in their Notification in the Finance Department, No. 778-F., dated 28th March 1918, the Governor in Council is pleased further to amend the Bombay Income Tax Rules, 1918, published in Government Notification in the Revenue Department, No. 7771, dated 26th July 1918, as follows, namely:—

1. After rule 19 of the said rules, the following rule shall be inserted, namely:—

19-A. (1) Any firm constituted under an instrument of partnership specifying the individual shares of the partners may, for the purposes of clause (12 A) of section 2 of the Act, register with the Collector the particulars contained in the said instrument on application in this behalf made by the partners or by any of them in the manner hereinafter provided.

(2) The application referred to in sub-rule (1) shall be forwarded with the return of income under section 17 (2) of the Act in Form P. annexed to these rules and shall be accompanied by the original instrument of partnership under which the firm is constituted together with a copy thereof; provided that if the Collector is satisfied that for some sufficient reason the original instrument cannot conveniently be produced, he may accept a copy of it certified in writing by one of the partners to be a correct copy, and in such a case the application shall be accompanied by a duplicate copy.

(3) (a) On the production of the original instrument of partnership or on the acceptance by the Collector of a certified copy thereof, the Collector shall enter in writing at the foot of the instrument or copy, as the case may be, the following certificate, namely:—

" This instrument of partnership (or this certified copy of an instrument of partnership) has this day been registered with me, the Collector of Income Tax forin the province of, under clause (12 A) of section 2 of the Indian Income Tax Act, 1918. This certificate of registration has effect from the..... day of19 .."

(b) The certificate shall be signed and dated by the Collector, who shall thereupon return to the applicant the instrument of partnership or the certified copy thereof, as the case may be, and shall retain the copy or duplicate copy thereof.

(4) In the case of an application made in any financial year under sub-rule (2) and forwarded with the return of income under section 17 (2) as required by that sub-rule, the certificate of registration granted under sub-rule (3) shall have effect from the beginning of that financial year; provided that the Collector may allow an application to be put in at a date later than the last date fixed under section 17 (2) of the Act for the return of income; in that case also registration shall have effect from the beginning of the financial year in which the application is made.

(5) A certificate of registration granted under sub-rule (3) shall, save as hereinafter provided in these rules, have effect up to the end of the financial year in which it is granted, but shall be renewed by the Collector from year to year on application made to him in that behalf at the time of putting in the return of income under section 17 (2) of the Act, and accompanied by a certificate signed by one of the partners of the firm that the constitution of the firm as specified in the registered instrument of partnership remains unaltered. Such renewal shall have effect from the beginning of the financial year in which it is made; provided that the Collector may allow an application for renewal to be put in after

the submission of the return under section 17 (2); in that case also the renewal shall have effect from the beginning of the financial year in which the application is made.

(6) If at any time the firm ceases to be constituted under the instrument of partnership registered with the Collector or any addition to or alteration of the instrument of partnership is made, the person or persons who had applied for registration under sub-rule (2) or renewal of registration under sub-rule (5) shall immediately give to the Collector information thereof and the certificate of registration of the firm shall cease to have effect from the date of such cessation, addition or alteration; provided that if within one month from the date of such cessation, addition or alteration a fresh application is made under sub-rule (2) a certificate of registration granted on such application shall have effect from the said date.

(7) The Collector shall keep a register of all registered firms in Form Q appended to these rules.

2. After rule 22 of the said rules, the following rule shall be inserted, namely:—

22A. A partner in a registered firm, on which income tax has been levied at the maximum rate in accordance with the proviso to section 14, claiming a refund on the share of the profits of the firm received by him, shall present to the Collector an application in the Form JA and a return in the Form D (if not already submitted). The Collector may make such enquiries as he may deem necessary as to the total income of the applicant and if he is satisfied that the applicant is entitled to any refund, provided that the firm has paid the tax due on its profits, he shall pay or authorise payment in cash of such refund as may be due.

3. In Form D add at the foot of the covering letter above the words "Collector of Income Tax", the words:—

"If your firm is to be assessed as a 'registered firm' you will send with Form D an application in Form P and, on page 3 of Form D, state the share of profit due to each partner while giving his name and address. If you are a member of a Joint Hindu Family, please enter in the form *the total income of the family*."
