PART I. Government Notifications, Appointments, etc. NOTIFICATIONS. POLITICAL DEPARTMENT.

Secretariat, Fort, Bombay, 23rd November 1920.

No. 8720.—Whereas it appears to the Governor in Council from the report of the Political Agent, Palanpur, that in the local areas hereinbelow specified, subject to the jurisdiction of the said Political Agent, cattle are habitually allowed to stray and that such cattle trespass on land and damage crops or other produce thereon :

Now therefore in exercise of the power delegated under the Indian (Foreign Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1902, by the Governor General in Council in the Notification of the Government of India in the Foreign Department, No. 2859-I.A., dated the 19th June 1903, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, the Governor in Council is pleased to direct that section 61-A of the Bombay District Police Act, 1890 (Bom. IV of 1890), with the modifications hereinbelow stated, shall in respect of all cattle other than sheep and goats apply to the said areas on and after the day of 1st December 1920.

Local areas above referred to:—

Palanpur Agency:—The Thana Circles of Kankrej, Diodar, Warahi and Santalpur.

Modifications above referred to :—

In sub-section (2), after the word "restraint", the clause "or to control them in such a way as to prevent them from trespassing on cultivated land" shall be added.

In sub-section (3) after the word "restraint", the words "or under control" shall be added.

Revision in the pay of Chaplains on the Ecclesiastical Establishment as well as the rate of allowances given to other Clergy.**RESOLUTION.**

As a sequel to the action taken on the Report of the Royal Commission on the Public Services in India, the Government of India have for some time had under consideration the question of the pay of chaplains on the Ecclesiastical Establishment as well as the rate of allowances given to other clergy. The Government of India are pleased to announce, with the approval of His Majesty's Secretary of State for India, the following revision.

2. Chaplains of the Indian Ecclesiastical Establishment (Anglican and Scottish).

(i) The rates of pay will be as follows.—

- (ii) No pay higher than Rs. 600 will be granted to any chaplain appointed at an earlier age, until he has completed his twenty-eighth year of age. On completing 28 years of age he will be entitled to draw Rs. 625, if he has already put in 12 months' service, and from that point will advance by the ordinary annual increments.
- (iii) A chaplain, who on appointment is over 30 years of age, will start in the time-scale one year in advance of the minimum for each completed year, up to a maximum of 5 years, by which his age on appointment exceeds 30 years.
- (iv) Time spent in India on service under the Additional Clergy Society or on other approved service, which already, under Article 576, Civil Service Regulations, counts for probation and pension, will in future be permitted to count also for increments of pay up to a maximum of two years.
- (v) The concessions announced in sub-paragraphs (iii) and (iv) above will not be cumulative.

(vi) Furlough allowances will be given under the ordinary rules contained in Articles 316 (c), 316-A (e) (ii), 317 (ii) and 319 of the new Leave Rules published with the Finance Department Resolution No. 1367-C.S.R., dated the 29th July 1920. But, as this change involves a lower rate of allowance after the expiry of the first two years of each separate period of furlough, any chaplain who was on furlough between the 1st December 1919 and the 30th September 1920 (the date of the Secretary of State's orders) may have his choice of continuing on the old rates or coming under the new rates until the conclusion of his furlough. The allowances will invariably be governed by the new scale in the case of chaplains taking furlough with effect from any date subsequent to the 29th September 1920.

(vii) A further announcement will be made regarding rates, etc., of pension.

(viii) All other conditions of service will remain as at present, with this exception, that Article 600 (a), Civil Service Regulations, under which a chaplain is compelled, unless specially exempted, to retire after 25 years' service, will be cancelled.

In announcing these terms of pay, the Government of India desire to point out that claims had been urged from various quarters that rent-free houses or allowances in lieu of house-rent should be accorded to chaplains. This point has been carefully considered. It has, however, been decided, that a more appropriate method would be to accord a rate of pay sufficient to meet expenses in connection with housing. It is to be clearly understood that the rates of pay announced above have been definitely calculated so as to take such expenses into account.

3. *Aided clergy.*—(Anglican and Scottish). Clergy officiating under Article 602, Civil Service Regulations, will be eligible for an allowance of Rs. 125 a month. The allowance granted to clergy under Article 603, Civil Service Regulations, will be Rs. 200 a month, the amounts which local Governments and Administrations are permitted annually to spend for meeting the provisions of that Article being proportionately raised.

4. *Roman Catholic chaplains in civil stations.*—Where a Roman Catholic priest receives an allowance of Rs. 100 a month, he will now receive Rs. 125 a month. Where such a priest receives Rs. 150 he will receive Rs. 200 a month.

5. *Clergy employed at railway centres.*—Such clergy ordinarily receive allowances of Rs. 150 a month. These allowances will now be raised to Rs. 200 a month. In cases where the present allowance is less than Rs. 150, a proportionate increase will be given.

6. The revision announced in the preceding paragraphs will take effect from the 1st December 1919 in all cases [with the exception of furlough allowances in any case where a chaplain elects to remain under the old rules in the manner described in paragraph 2 (vi) above].

7. The revision now sanctioned does not apply to ministers of religion whose grants and allowances are dealt with in Army Regulations, India, Volume I, Articles 380 to 396. The case of these is under separate consideration.

No. K-Misc.—The following Resolution by the Government of India, Commerce Department, is republished :—

“INSURANCE.

No. 7792, dated Simla, the 5th November 1920.

Rules 3 (a) and (b) of the Rules of the Postal Insurance Fund prescribe that no person admissible to its benefits may effect an insurance on his life, or purchase an endowment assurance policy, for a sum exceeding Rs. 4,000. There is a considerable volume of opinion among Government servants in India that the limit should be raised. The Government of India have examined the matter and consider that the limit is no longer suitable in view of the rise of prices and the general standard of living in this country. With the sanction of His Majesty's Secretary of State for India, the Governor-General in Council is therefore pleased to increase from Rs. 4,000 to Rs. 10,000 the maximum amount for which an insurance may be effected or an endowment assurance may be purchased under the rules of the Fund.

ORDER.—Ordered that this Resolution be communicated to the several Departments of the Government of India, to all Local Governments and Administrations, to all heads of Departments subordinate to this Department and to the Accountant-General, Posts and Telegraphs.

Ordered also that a copy be forwarded to the Director General of Posts and Telegraphs, for necessary action.

Ordered further that the Resolution be published in the *Gazette of India*.

No. 10942.—Whereas it appears to the Governor in Council from the report of the District Magistrate, Bijapur, that in the area hereinafter specified in the Bijapur District, cattle are habitually allowed to stray and that such cattle trespass on land and damage crops or other produce thereon :

Now, therefore, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 61A of the Bombay District Police Act, 1890 (Bom. IV of 1890), is pleased to direct that the provisions of the said section shall have operation in respect of all cattle other than milch cattle in the following local area in the said district, namely :—

The land for the time being included for the purposes of the land revenue administration within two miles of Bagalkot municipal limits.

No. 11231.—In exercise of the power conferred on the Local Government by section 18 (1) of the Indian Motor Vehicles Act, 1914, the Governor in Council is pleased to cancel the license to drive motor vehicles (No. 968-A of 1919) granted to Darabsha Edulji Elavia by the Commissioner of Police, Bombay, and further to declare that the said Darabsha Edulji Elavia is disqualified from obtaining a fresh license under the said Act for a period of one year.

No. 10949.—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 8 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1898 (V of 1898), and in supersession of Government Notification in the Judicial Department, No. 6192, dated 26th June 1920, the Governor in Council is pleased to divide the district of Ahmednagar into five sub-divisions, each comprising the mahals or talukas as from time to time constituted under the Bombay Land Revenue Code, 1879 (V of 1879), specified in the following table:—

No. 11230.—On account of the alteration in the limits of the West Khandesh District by the inclusion of the villages of the Mewasi Chieftains in the district from 20th October 1920 as published in Government Notification No. 9867, dated 20th October 1920, and in supersession of the previous notifications in this respect, the Governor in Council is pleased, under section 8 (1) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1898, to divide the West Khandesh District into three sub-divisions comprising the following areas, respectively:—

- (1) The City Sub-Division—Comprising the area within the limits of the Dhulia City Municipality.
- (2) Western Division—Comprising the talukas of Nawapur, Nandurbar, Shahada and Taloda including the Dhadgaon Peta and the villages of the six Mewasi Chieftains of Kathi, Raisingpur, Singpur, Chikhali, Nala and Nawalpur.
- (3) Eastern Division—Comprising the talukas of Dhulia, Sindkheda, Shirpur and Sakri.

No. 10947.—The following notifications by the Government of India, Home Department (Police), are republished:—

“ No. 2204, dated Simla, the 4th November 1920.

In exercise of the powers conferred by sections 17 and 27 of the Indian Arms Act, 1878 (XI of 1878), the Governor General in Council is pleased to direct that the following further amendments shall be made in the Indian Arms Rules, 1920, namely:—

I.—In sub-rule (1) of rule 3 the word ‘and’ at the end of proviso (b) shall be omitted and shall be inserted at the end of proviso (c), and after proviso (c) the following ‘firearms’ wherever it occurs, the word ‘arms’ shall be substituted.

‘(d) the Governor General in Council may, by notification in the *Gazette of India*, direct that any such exemption conferred on a class of persons shall cease to extend to any person included in that class who may be named in the notification.’

II.—In rule 28 of the said rules, and in Form XII in Schedule VII, for the word ‘firearms’ wherever it occurs, the word ‘arms’ shall be substituted.

III.—In rule 29 of the said rules—

(a) in sub-rule (1)—

(i) the word ‘or’ at the end of clause (a) shall be omitted, and shall be inserted at the end of clause (b); and

(ii) the following shall be inserted as clause (c), namely:—

‘(c) in the case of a person residing in a State in India—by the Political Officer for such State’; and

(b) in sub-rule (2)—

- (i) the word 'and' at the end of clause (c) shall be omitted, and shall be inserted at the end of clause (d); and
- (ii) the following shall be inserted as clause (c), namely :—
'(c) when granted by a Political Officer under clause (c) of that sub-rule, throughout the whole or any specified part of British India, except Burma, Assam and the North-West Frontier Province.'

IV.—In the second column of Schedule II to the said rules—

(a) in entry 1—

- (i) the figure '(i)' shall be omitted;
- (ii) for clause (b) the following shall be substituted, namely '(b) firearms'; and
- (iii) for head (ii) the following shall be substituted, namely :—
'Provided that the exceptions in respect of cannon and firearms shall not apply in the case of arms of these classes which are obsolete and unserviceable and of purely antiquarian value or which are in the possession of a regiment or military mess as trophies or curiosities or otherwise solely for purposes of ornament or display.'

(b) in entry 3—

- (i) in head (iv) for the words 'in Burma, ornamental arms, and in the Punjab and the North-West Frontier Province ornamental arms other than firearms' the following shall be substituted, namely :—
'in Burma and the Punjab, ornamental arms, and in the North-West Frontier Province ornamental arms other than firearms'; and
- (ii) for head (v) the following shall be substituted, namely :—
'(v) Arms which are in the possession of a regiment or military mess as trophies or curiosities or otherwise solely for purposes of ornament or display.'

V.—In Schedule V to the said rules—

- (a) in the fourth column against entries (2), (3) and (4), for the words 'For sporting shot guns and sporting ammunition only' the words 'For sporting rifles (other than sporting rifles taking ammunition of .303 or of .450 bore), sporting shot guns and sporting ammunition (other than ammunition which can be used in rifles of .303 or of .450 bore)' shall be substituted; and
- (b) after entry (2), the following entry shall be inserted, namely :—

(2-A The Chief Secretary to the Government of Bengal.	Calcutta	... (i) Ports within the political jurisdiction of the Political Resident in the Persian Gulf; and (ii) ports within the political jurisdiction of the Civil Commissioner, Baghdad. For sporting rifles (other than sporting rifles taking ammunition of .303 or of .450 bore), sporting shot guns and sporting ammunition (other than ammunition which can be used in rifles of .303 or of .450 bore) not intended for sale or for military purposes, but for the personal use of the consignee.'

V.—In Schedule VII to the said rules, in sub-clause (c) (i) of the headnote to Form XIII, before the word 'pistol' the word 'breech-loading' shall be inserted.

In exercise of the powers conferred by proviso (d) to sub-rule (1) of rule 3 of the Indian Arms Rules, 1920, the Governor General in Council is pleased to direct that the exemption from the operation of the prohibitions and directions contained in sections 13, 14, 15 and 16 of the Indian Arms Act, 1878 (XI of 1878), conferred by the said sub-rule on Jumma tenure holders in Coorg shall cease to extend to K. Somayya, a Jumma Coorg.

No. 3149-B.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 7 of the Bombay Land Revenue Code, 1879 (Bombay V of 1879), and in supersession of Government Notification No. 14968, dated 11th December 1917, the Governor in Council is pleased to direct:—

- (a) that the villages specified in Government Notification, Revenue Department, No. 3149, dated 15th November 1920, as forming the Bombay Suburban Revenue Division and heretofore included within the Salsette Taluka of the Thana District shall, with effect from the 1st day of December 1920, constitute (i) a new taluka to be known as the South Salsette Taluka with headquarters at Bandra and also (ii) a new district to be known as the Bombay Suburban District with headquarters at Bandra; and
- (b) that the existing Salsette Taluka in the Thana District which will thereafter include the remaining villages in that taluka inclusive of four villages in the Bandra Mahal, viz., Bhaindar, Rai Murdhe, Utan and Dongri, shall from that date be officially known and described by the name of North Salsette Taluka of the Thana District.

An agreement made this thirty-first day of August one thousand nine hundred and twenty between the Bombay Catholic Co-partnership Housing Society, Limited, a society registered under the Co-operative Societies Act, 1912 (II of 1912), and having its registered office at Willingdon, Santaacruz, Bandra in the district of Thana (hereinafter called "the society" which expression shall, unless excluded by or repugnant to the context, be deemed to include its successors and assigns) of the one part and the Secretary of State for India in Council (hereinafter called "the Secretary of State" which expression shall, unless excluded by or repugnant to the context, be deemed to include his successors in office and assigns) of the other part whereas the principal object for which the society is established is to acquire suitable plot of land in the vicinity of railway stations in Salsette as building sites for its members and whereas in furtherance of the said object the society is desirous of acquiring certain land in the village of Danda (Santaacruz) in the Bandra Mahal of the Thana district which land is more particularly described in the schedule hereto and is hereinafter referred to as "the said land" and whereas the society has applied to the Government of Bombay to put in force the provisions of the Land Acquisition Act, 1894 (I of 1894), (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), in order to acquire for the society the said land and whereas the Government of Bombay (hereinafter referred to as "the said Government") having caused an enquiry to be held in conformity with the provisions of section 40 of the said Act and being satisfied on the report of the result of such inquiry that the acquisition of the said land is needed for the furtherance of the said object of the society and is likely to prove useful to the public has consented to the provisions of the said Act being put in force in order to acquire the said land for the purposes of the society and has pursuant to section 41 of the said Act required the society to enter into the agreement with the Secretary of State herein contained Now These presents witness and it is hereby agreed by and between the parties hereto that the said Government shall put in force the provisions of the said Act in order to acquire the said land for the society on the following conditions:—

1. The society shall and will provide for and reimburse or pay to the said Government the entire cost as determined by the said Government of the acquisition under the provisions of the said Act of the said land, including all compensation damages interest costs charges and expenses whatsoever which have been or may be paid or incurred in respect of or on account of such acquisition and all law costs and other expenses which have been or may be incurred by the said Government upon or in respect of or incidental to such acquisition or any litigation arising thereout and either in the Original or Appellate Courts, and including the cost of any establishment and salary of any officer or officers of Government whom the said Government may think it necessary to employ or depute on special duty for the purpose of such acquisition. The monies which shall be payable by the society under this clause shall be paid by it by the initial deposit with the Collector of the sum of rupees five hundred only (Rs. 500) within seven days after the publication in the *Bombay Government*

Gazette of the notice under section 6 of the said Act with reference to the said land in pursuance of these presents; and by payment to the Collector within 14 days after demand by the Collector in writing of such amount or amounts as the Collector shall from time to time estimate to be required or provided by the society for the purpose of meeting or disbursing any of the monies compensation damages interest costs charges or expenses hereinbefore referred to. In these presents the expression "Collector" shall extend to mean and include (as the case may be) the Collector of the district in which the said land is or shall at any time be included and also the persons meant and included in such expression by the said Act.

2. On payment of the entire monies compensation damages interest costs charges and expenses incidental to the acquisition of the said land the whole of the said land shall, as soon as conveniently may be after the award of the Collector is made in respect thereof and possession has been taken by the Collector under the said Act, be transferred to the society at the cost in every respect of the society so as to vest in the society subject to the provisions of the Bombay Land Revenue Code, 1879, and the rules made thereunder, the rights in the said land which have vested in Government under section 16 of the said Act.
3. The said land when so transferred to and vested in the society shall be held by the society as their property to be used in furtherance of the aforesaid object, subject nevertheless to the payment of local fund cess and the agricultural, non-agricultural or other assessment, as the case may be, if and so far as the land required is liable to such assessment or to an assessment revised under the provisions of the Bombay Land Revenue Code, 1879, and the rules thereunder.
4. The society shall from time to time and at all times permit the said Government or any officer or officers deputed by the said Government in that behalf to inspect the said land and any works of the society upon the said land whether in course of construction or otherwise; and shall furnish to the said Government from time to time on demand correct statements of the monies expended by the society in the construction of the said works of the society upon the said land. The society shall at all times keep and maintain the said land in good order to the satisfaction of the Collector.
5. The said land shall be made available as building sites under the sanction of the Salsette Development Officer and disposed of in the manner provided in the by-laws of the said society within a period of five years from the date on which the said land shall have vested in the said society or within such further period as the Collector may allow.
6. If at any time or times any part or parts of the said land shall in the opinion of the said Government be necessary to be possessed by the said Government for purposes of Revenue administration or either by the said Government or by a local authority for the purpose of making any new public road or for any purpose connected with public health safety or necessity (as to which matters the society shall accept the decision of the said Government who shall be the sole judge), the society on being thereunto required by the said Government in writing (which shall be sufficient if signed by the Collector) shall transfer to the Secretary of State such part or parts of the said land as the said Government shall specify to be necessary for any of the purposes aforesaid; and in consideration of such transfer the Secretary of State shall pay to the society a sum equal to the amount of the compensation awarded under the said Act and paid by the society in respect of the land the subject of the transfer upon the acquisition thereof for the society, including the percentage awarded under section 23 (2) of the said Act; and such amount as shall be estimated by the Executive Engineer, whose decision in the matter shall be final, as the cost of development of the land the subject of the transfer which shall include a proportionate share of the cost of any accommodation roads that may have been constructed and also the value at the date of transfer of any structures standing thereon.
7. All the costs and expenses of and incidental to the preparation and execution of this agreement shall be paid by the society.

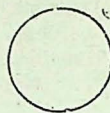

Subsidiary Rules.

(1) In these rules:—

(a) Public conveyance means a wheeled vehicle drawn by one or more horses or other animals which is used for the purpose of plying for hire for the conveyance of persons or goods.

(b) Day means a period from sunrise to sunset.

(2) The licensee of each conveyance shall provide for the driver a dress to be approved by the District Superintendent of Police, Ahmednagar.

(3) The transfer fee for change in the owner of a public conveyance shall be Re. 1.

(4) If a conveyance engaged for the day is detained after sunset, the detention period shall be paid according to rates after sunset (from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m.).

(5) All the horse-drawn conveyances shall be supplied with two clear burning lights and the bullock-drawn ones with one clear burning light during the period between three-quarters of an hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise, except when there is sufficient moonlight to render such light unnecessary.

(6) All conveyances drawn by two horses will be licensed to carry three passengers in addition to the driver, while those drawn by bullocks will be licensed to carry six passengers in addition to the driver. Children in arms will not be counted and two children not in arms but under the age of 12 will be counted as one passenger.

(7) Conveyances except bullock carts intended to carry goods only shall not be used for the carriage of goods except the personal luggage of the passengers and no conveyances carrying a full complement of passengers shall carry in addition more than 20 seers of luggage per passenger.

(8) It shall not be obligatory on the owner of any conveyance to carry less than the full complement for less than the full fare of conveyance. If there is only one passenger he cannot claim to pay for one seat only but must pay for the whole conveyance and similarly for two passengers.

(9) No horse shall be used in a licensed conveyance if below 13-0 hands in height.

(10) The driver of each licensed conveyance shall, when plying for hire, keep with him his license and shall produce the same when required to do so at any time by a Magistrate, Police Officer or passenger. He shall have the number and class printed on both sides of the hood. The numbers should also be printed on the lamps.

(11) The licensees of public conveyances shall, when the yearly licenses and numbers are renewed, bring the conveyance to the office of the District Superintendent of Police, Ahmednagar, or to anyone authorized by him for inspection and shall satisfy him that the conveyances, ponies and harness are in all respects in sufficiently good order and otherwise fit for the purpose intended, and that the drivers are clean, steady and capable.

(12) Every driver shall, when engaged in his occupation, be cleanly and decently clothed.

(13) All conveyances must be driven on the left side of the road except when passing another conveyance going in the same direction, when they should pass on its right.

(14) Whenever the District Superintendent of Police considers that an animal is unfit to ply the licensee, on receiving an order to that effect, shall produce another animal within the period fixed in the said order subject to the provisions of section 10 (2) of Act VII 1920. In the event of default, the license shall be liable to be revoked.

(15) Any infringement of the conditions shall make the license-holder liable to be prosecuted and punished according to law.

(16) Any driver of a conveyance leaving the roads in Cantonments and driving off the road except when directed to do so by the Police in regulating traffic will be prosecuted under section 141 of the Cantonment Code, maximum punishment under which is eight days' imprisonment or Rs. 50 fine.
