## MARINE DEPARTMENT.

No. 2026.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 36 of the Indian Steam Ships Act, 1884 (VII of 1884), His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased, with the previous sanction of the Governor-General in Council, to make the following amendments in Rule 16 (1) of the rules for the examination of and grant of certificates of competency to engine-drivers of sea-going steamships having engines of under 50 nominal horse-power, published in Government Notification, Marine Department, No. 98, dated the 16th January 1917, as subsequently amended, namely :—

1. Clause (a).—Between the words "horse-power" and "or" insert the words "or three years in the case of steam dredgers or tugs with engines of 50 nominal horse-power or over".

2. *Clause (b).*—For this clause the following shall be substituted :—  
 “(b) have served at sea for at least 5 years in the engine-room of a foreign-going or home trade steam ship, 3 years of which service must have been as serang or principal tindal under a certificated engineer and, if the service was performed in a home trade ship, have also acted as driver under him for at least six months; or he must have served for at least 10 years in sea-going dredgers or tugs with engines of 50 nominal horse-power or over, 6 years of which service must have been as principal tindal or serang and have also acted as a driver for at least 12 months.”
3. *Clause (c).*—Between the words “horse-power” and “whilst,” insert the words “or two years in the case of steam dredgers or tugs with engines of 50 nominal horse-power or over.”
4. *Clause (d).*—Between the words “horse-power” and “whilst,” insert the words “or four years in the case of steam dredgers or tugs with engines of 50 nominal horse-power or over.”

2. In sub-rules (1) and (2) of rule 21 and in rules 22 and 23 of the said rules, clause (a) and the letter '(b)' shall be omitted.

(a) has been medically re-examined and has obtained a certificate in a form approved by the Governor General in Council by order in writing and granted by an officer of the Royal Air Force Medical Service or by a medical officer specially authorised in this behalf by the Governor General in Council by notification in the *Gazette of India*, showing that he is medically fit to fly, or, as the case may be, assist in flying, aircraft or

(b) has been exempted from such re-examination by an order in writing of such medical officer on receipt of a report as to the nature and effects of such illness or accident from the medical practitioner who attended him'; and

(b) for sub-rule (2) the following sub-rule shall be substituted, namely :—

'(2) Any licence issued under this Part may be renewed for a further period of six months by the officer authorised under rule 19 to grant such licence, provided that—

(a) no licence shall be so renewed unless the person to be licensed produces a medical certificate in a form approved by the Governor General in Council by order in writing, and granted not more than fourteen days previously by an officer of the Royal Air Force Medical Service or a medical officer specially authorised in this behalf by the Governor General in Council by notification in the *Gazette of India*;

(b) the officer authorised under rule 19 to grant such licences may before renewing the licence require the person applying for renewal to undergo practical or theoretical tests.'

4. For rule 26 of the said rules the following shall be substituted, namely :—

'26. A fee of Rs. 64 shall be payable by every person submitting himself for <sup>Fee for medical</sup> medical examination for the purpose of obtaining a medical ~~examination.~~ certificate as required by clause (d) of sub-rule (1) of rule 20 and a fee of Rs. 32 shall be payable by every person submitting himself for the purpose of obtaining a medical certificate as required by sub-rule (1) or sub-rule (2) of rule 25. This fee shall be payable to the medical officer making the examination.'

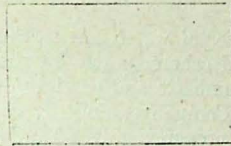

11. In these rules " day " means the period between sunrise and sunset ; " night " means the period between sunset and sunrise.

12. In these rules " Public Conveyance " means and includes both carriages drawn by horses, ponies or mules and carts drawn by bullocks.

13. List of stands or places at which alone public conveyances running on these roads may stand.

(1) Satara to Satara Road Station—

1. Open space in front of the new Rajwada.
2. Open space at the back of the Pir Powal Dharamshala.
3. Old market place in Sadar Bazar.
4. Satara Road Station.

(2) Karad to Hajarmachi (Karad Road)—

1. Near the Ramoshi's Wada in Mangalwar Peth.
2. Near Milestone No. 1.
3. Karad Road Station.
4. Open space on the banks of the Krishna River when it is unfordable.

(3) *Islampur to Takari Station—*

1. Open space in front of the Dharamshala near the tank of the Urun village.
2. Open space on the south of the Mamlatdar's Office, Islampur.
3. Open space near the Dharamshala at Takari Station.
4. Open space on the banks of Krishna River when it is unfordable.

(4) *Tasgaon to Bhilavdi Road—*

1. Open space in front of Shidoba's temple in Tasgaon.
2. Open space near Bhilavdi Road Station.

(5) *Wathar to Mahableshwar—*

1. Wathar Station.
2. Circlewadi.
3. Snirgaon.
4. Joshi's well.
5. Wai.
6. Dhandeghar.
7. Gureghar.
8. Malcolmpeth.

*Note.*—Dhamnis and carts with two bullocks and Ekkas, Chakadas or dhamnis with one bullock running on the Wathar-Mahableshwar Road are exempted from this rule.

14. Horses, ponies or mules used in licensed conveyances running on the road between Wathar Station and Mahableshwar shall be changed for fresh animals at each of the stages specified below, and for that purpose not less than the specified number of horses, ponies or mules shall be maintained in a fit condition for each conveyance actually plying. A reserve of licensed carriages may be kept to replace any carriage withdrawn from the road in consequence of accident or for repairs, provided that the number of carriages in use at any time shall not exceed that for which horses, mules or ponies or bullocks are provided according to the scale laid down.

15. Horses, ponies or mules used in licensed conveyances plying for hire on the road between Wathar Station and Wai only need be changed for fresh animals at Shirgaon Stage, only, and for that purpose not less than the specified number of horses, mules or ponies shall be maintained in a fit condition for each conveyance actually plying.

16. In any case in which a public conveyance is called from a stand or from an owner's stable to any place distant more than one-fourth mile, the driver or owner shall be entitled to charge 2 annas in addition to the prescribed fare for each half mile.

17. A complete rest as specified below to horses, ponies or mules used in public conveyances must be given as shown below :—

1. Satara to Satara Road and <i>vice versa</i> ...	... 4 hours.
2. Karad to Karad Road and <i>vice versa</i> ...	... 1 hour.

18. The number of horses, mules or ponies to be maintained for each class of conveyance plying between Wathar-Mahableshwar Road and the places at which changes of animals must be made shall be as follows :—

19. At each stage fresh animals must be brought and used. Provided that tongas and phaetons plying between Wai and Panchgani only need not change animals at Dandeghar. A fresh animal is one which has not been worked within four hours previously.

20. Phaetons when laden shall be driven up the Pasarni Ghat by double the number of horses, mules or ponies as far as Dhandeghar.

21. Bullocks licensed for dhamnis, carts and ekkas or chakadas shall be given 8 hours complete rest after a journey of 20 miles before they are again used in a public conveyance.

*General rules.*

22. All licensed carriages drawn by horses, ponies or mules and dhamnis drawn by bullocks shall be supplied with two clear burning lights to be carried on each side and in front of the conveyance and the bullock carts with one clear burning light visible both from front and behind, during the period between half an hour after sunset and half an hour before sunrise except when there is sufficient moon light. Provided that on the Wathar-Mahableshwar road such lights shall always be carried at night, whether there is a moon or not.

23. No pony shall be used in a licensed conveyance if below 12-2 hands in height.

24. Every licensed conveyance shall carry a plate affixed in a prominent position to the conveyance showing the number of passengers including the driver and the amount of luggage allowed to be carried.

25. All licensed phaetons, tongas, and dhamnis shall bear the license number on both sides of the top or close to both front lamps as may be directed by the District Superintendent of Police, Satara.

26. Licensees of public conveyances shall bring their conveyances and animals whenever required to a place specified by the District Superintendent of Police, Satara, for inspection by him and shall satisfy him that the conveyances, animals and harness, etc., are in all respects in sufficiently good order and that the drivers are clean, sober, capable, and of good character.

27. Every driver shall when engaged in his occupation be cleanly and decently clothed. Drivers of tongas and phaetons shall when engaged in their occupation wear uniform of description prescribed by the District Superintendent of Police, Satara.

28. The driver of a licensed conveyance shall when on duty carry with him his license and the list prescribed in section 20 of the Act for inspection by any Police Officer, Magistrate or passenger when required to do so.

29. A licensed driver when on duty shall wear a metal badge in a place on his person specified by the District Superintendent of Police, Satara.

30. Any infringement of the conditions shall make the license-holder liable to be prosecuted and punished according to law as stated in the license.

# LATE NOTIFICATIONS.

## JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT.

Secretariat, Fort, Bombay, 19th October 1920.

*Rules under section 20 of Act III of 1911 for the Control of the Criminal Tribes in the Districts of the Central and Southern Divisions of the Bombay Presidency.*

No. 9828.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 20 of the Criminal Tribes Act, 1911 (III of 1911), and in supersession of Government Notifications in the Judicial Department Nos. 5520 and 6767, dated 18th August 1916 and 19th October 1917, respectively, the Governor in Council is pleased to make the following rules to carry out the purposes and objects of the said Act in respect of the tribes declared to be criminal tribes under section 3 of the Act, in the Central and Southern Divisions of the Bombay Presidency :—

1. *Form of Register.*—The register prescribed in section 4 shall be in the form of appendix A to these rules. It shall be written in English and every entry shall be signed by the officer making the entry.

2. *Person under 15 not to be registered.*—No person who is under the age of 15 years shall be registered. The decision of the officer making the entry shall be final as to the question of age.

3. *Notice under section 5.—Form and Publication.*—(a) The District Magistrate shall cause copies of the notice under section 5 of the Act to be affixed to the village chawdi or other meeting place and also to the house or houses of one or more of the principal inhabitants of each village or hamlet in his jurisdiction in which any member of the criminal tribe is believed to reside or to be in hiding or to which he is likely to resort. He shall also cause the notice to be proclaimed by beat of drum in such villages.

(b) Alternatively if more convenient the notice may be served on the persons whom it is proposed to register in the manner prescribed in the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1898, for the service of summonses.

(c) In the case of unregistered members of a criminal tribe residing in a settlement, the person in charge of the Settlement shall publish the notice in such manner as he shall consider sufficient.

(d) The District Magistrate shall also publish the notice at the place where the register is to be made in the manner described in the first paragraph of clause (a) of this rule, in all cases.

(e) The notice under section 5 of the Act shall be in the form of appendix B to these rules.

4. *Notice under section 7, cancellation of entry in register.*—(a) The notice under section 7 (2) shall be in the form of appendix B to these rules and shall be served on the person concerned in the manner prescribed in the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1898, for the service of summonses.

(b) The District Magistrate shall not cancel the registration of any person registered as a member of a criminal tribe without consultation with the District Superintendent of Police and unless such person proves to the satisfaction of the District Magistrate that he is not a member of a criminal tribe or that he has reformed and is earning an honest living.

5. *Intimation of absence or change of residence under section 10 (b).*—(a) No registered member of a criminal tribe notified under section 10 (b) shall absent himself from the village in which he resides unless he has previously notified his intention of so doing to the headman of such village, giving the date on which he intends to start, the name of the village and the address therein to which he intends to proceed, and the period of his absence. He must state the villages if any at which he intends to halt by night *en route*.

(b) No such person shall absent himself from the village in which he resides with the intention of being absent for more than seven days, or of changing his residence, unless he has previously notified his intention in person to the officer in charge of the police station, within the limits of which such village is included, giving the date on which he intends to start, the name of the village, the address therein to which he intends to proceed, and the period of his absence (if he intends to return). He must state the villages if any at which he intends to halt *en-route*.

(c) Every such person shall, within 24 hours of his arrival in the village to which he is proceeding or at which he has halted, notify his arrival to the headman of the village.

(d) Every such person desiring an extension of the period of absence given in his original statement to the headman of the village in which he resides or officer in charge of the police station, shall notify the fact in person before the expiry of such period to the officer in charge of the police station within whose jurisdiction he is residing for the time being.

(e) Whenever application has been made under this rule to a headman or to an officer in charge of a police station, the headman or officer in charge shall give to the applicant an acknowledgment in the form of Appendix C to these rules.

6. *Village of residence.*—For the purposes of rule 5 the village in which a person was residing at the time of registration, or the village to which he has subsequently changed his residence after notification under rule 5, shall be considered to be the village in which he resides.

7. *Registered Member to report daily under section 10 (a).*—Every registered member of a criminal tribe notified under section 10 (a) shall report himself to the headman of the village in which he is residing for the time being every evening between the hours 9 p.m. and 10 p.m. at the village meeting place or other place prescribed by the District Magistrate for this purpose: the District Magistrate may by special or general order exempt any such member from reporting himself in this manner, or may order him to report himself on specified days only.

8. *Passes to persons restricted under sections 12 and 13.*—(a) No registered member of a criminal tribe restricted in its movements by a notification under sections 12 or 13 of the Act shall proceed beyond the area to which the tribe is restricted without a pass in the form of appendix D to these rules, for which he must apply in person or in writing to the District Superintendent of Police or to the Criminal Tribes Settlement Officer, stating the date on which he wishes to start, the name of the village and the address therein to which he wishes to proceed, the period of his absence, and the villages if any, at which he intends to halt for the night on the way. Upon receipt of such application the District Superintendent of Police or the Criminal Tribes Settlement Officer may in his discretion grant or refuse the pass.

(b) The District Superintendent of Police may by special or general order and subject to such conditions as he may impose, authorize any police officer not below the rank of sub-inspector or a settlement inspector or a village headman to grant a pass to any such member to proceed beyond the limits to which his tribe has been restricted; provided that a police officer or settlement inspector shall not issue a pass for a period exceeding six months and that a village headman shall not issue a pass for a period exceeding seven days or a pass to proceed to a place more than 20 miles from the village of which he is the headman.

(c) Any person proceeding under a pass granted by this rule shall within 24 hours of his arrival in the village to which he is proceeding or at which he has halted for the night notify to the headman of the village his arrival therein and shall thereafter report himself according to rule 7.

9. *Settlements: Limits: Escapes.*—(a) A registered member of a criminal tribe who is placed in a settlement (hereinafter called a settler) shall, unless exempted by special or general order remain within such limits as the Criminal Tribes Settlement Officer may determine.

(b) Any settlement official may arrest any settler who escapes or attempts to escape from the limits defined in accordance with rule 9 (a). Settlement official includes any person charged with the duty of guarding or supervising the settlers.

10. *Settlements: Roll Call.*—Except when absent upon a pass granted under these rules a settler shall attend a roll-call held every day at day break and at 8 p.m. or at other times fixed by the Criminal Tribes Settlement Officer, in the settlement buildings or other place appointed by the aforesaid officer before such person as may be appointed by the aforesaid officer.

11. *Settlements: Passes.*—(a) A pass in the form of Appendix D to these rules for a period of not longer than two months may be granted to a settler to proceed to any place by the person in charge of the settlement or by any other person authorized by the Criminal Tribes Settlement Officer.

(b) A pass for an unlimited period may be given to a settler by the District Superintendent of Police or the Criminal Tribes Settlement Officer.

(c) Any person proceeding under a pass granted by this rule shall, within 24 hours of his arrival in the village or settlement to which he is proceeding or at which he has halted for the night, notify to the headman of the village or to the person in charge of the Settlement his arrival therein, and shall thereafter report himself to the headman according to rule 7 or attend the roll-call according to rule 10 as the case may be.

12. *Settlements: Rules.*—(a) The following rules shall be observed in settlements established under section 16 :—

(i) A settler shall not refuse to perform any suitable work which is provided for him.

(ii) He shall not obey the calls of nature in or near the settlement buildings, except in the places prescribed for the purpose by the person in charge of the settlement.

(iii) He shall not drink to intoxication or cause any disturbance by quarrelling or gamble.

(iv) He shall be bound to give a true account of his movements to the person in charge of the settlement.

(v) He shall not neglect or refuse to send to school his children who are of school-going age.

(b) A copy of these rules in English and in the vernacular of the district shall be hung up in a prominent place within the settlement.

13. *Settlements: Penalties.*—The Criminal Tribes Settlement Officer, or if so empowered in this behalf by the Criminal Tribes Settlement Officer, the person in charge of the settlement, may in his discretion deal with any settler endeavouring to escape or offending against the rules in any one of the following ways :—

(a) Fine not exceeding Rs. 10.

(b) Confinement not exceeding 3 full days.

(c) Action under Section 22 of the Criminal Tribes Act.

14. *Settlements: Official Visitors.*—The District Magistrate, the Sub-Divisional Magistrate, the District Superintendent of Police, the Assistant Superintendent of Police and the Deputy Superintendent of Police shall be the official visitors of settlements established under Section 16.

15. *Appointments to perform duties as headmen.*—The District Magistrate may empower any other person to perform any of the duties assigned by the rules to the village headman.

16. *Notices under Rules 5 and 7.*—Every notice prescribed under rules 5 and 7 shall be given in person by the person who is required to give it unless he is prevented from doing so by illness, in which case it may be sent either by letter duly signed by him or orally by a messenger authorized to give the notice on his behalf.

It should be noted that it is illegal to refuse to permit any such person to go on a journey. If however the person intends to be absent for more than seven days, or if he intends to change his residence from one village to another, he should be told to go to the officer in charge of the police station.

(2) The middle form should be sent by the headman at once to the police station.

(3) In the event of the person not returning within the period notified, the patel must report the fact at once to the officer in charge of the police station.

(4) The officer in charge of the police station must give one copy of the acknowledgment to any registered person residing in his jurisdiction who notifies his intention to be absent from his village or to change his village. It should be noted that it is illegal to refuse to permit any person to go on a journey or to change his residence.
