No. 2027.—The following draft of a notification which it is proposed to issue in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (k) of sub-section (1) of section 6 of the Indian Ports Act, 1908 (XV of 1908), is published as required by sub-section (2) of the said section for the information of persons likely to be affected thereby, and notice is hereby given that the draft will be taken into consideration by the Governor in Council on or after the 11th day of January 1921.

2. Any objections or suggestions which may be sent to the Secretary to Government in the Marine Department from any person with respect to the draft before the date aforesaid will be considered by the Governor in Council:—

Draft Notification.

- No. .—In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (k) of sub-section (1) of section 6 of the Indian Ports Act, 1908 (XV of 1908), and in supersession of the rules published in Government Notification in the Marine Department, No. 354, dated the 18th February 1919, the Governor in Council is pleased to make the following rules for licensing and regulating passenger boats plying for hire within the Port of Bombay and for determining the number of persons to be carried by any such vessels, namely:—
 - Places from which boats to ply for hire.—Licensed boats may ply for hire from the following landing places:—
 - (1) Sassoon Dock;
 - (2) Apollo Bunder;
 - (3) Ballard Pier;
 - (4) Mody or Carnac Bunder;
 - (5) Prince's and Victoria Docks;
 - (6) Malet Bunder.
 - (7) Mazagon Bunder Pier;
 - (8) Lakdi Bunder;
 - (9) Sewree Salt Fish Wharf.
 - 2. Boats plying for hire not to lay alongside landing places longer than necessary and to obey orders of the Police for regulating traffic.—Boats plying for hire at any of the abovenamed landing places shall not lay alongside any such landing places or gangway ladders longer than actually necessary to embark or land passengers and their luggage, etc., but shall keep off at a distance of at least 30 yards from such landing place or gangway ladders so as not to obstruct the approach thereto, and shall obey any orders given them by the Police for the regulation of the traffic at the landing places or gangways of vessels.
 - Licensed boats not to go alongside a vessel under way unless called by Commander.—No licensed boat shall go alongside a vessel under way unless specially called by her Commander.
 - Touting for hire at a distance forbidden.—Tindals and boatmen are forbidden to tour for hire at a distance from the landing places to the annoyance of people pass, ing by.
 - 5. Tindals and boatmen not to carry on the business of a hawker.—Tindals and boatmen are forbidden to carry on the business of a hawker.
 - 6. No person to keep or let for hire any boat without a license and without being numbered.—No person shall keep or let for hire any boat without having a license in force for the same and unless there be painted or branded on such parts of the said boat and in such manner as the Port Officer may direct a number corresponding with that of the license.
 - 7. Notice to be given of change of residence.—Every licensee shall give notice in writing to the Port Officer of any change in the place of his residence as entered in the license.
 - 8. Licenses when and by whom to be issued.—Licenses issued under rule 6 shall be for one year and will usually be granted on the 1st January in each year by the Port Officer. The Port Officer may however grant licenses at any other time and

- shall at the time of granting a license and at all other times when necessary cause to be painted or branded upon a conspicuous part of the boat such number and inscription as are required by rule 6.
- 9. When Port Officer may refuse to grant license.—The Port Officer may in his discretion refuse to grant any such license for any boat which he may consider to be insufficiently found, or otherwise unfit for the conveyance of the public, or to any applicant whom he may consider, from youth, bad character, or for any other reason, unfit to be entrusted with the same.
- 10. Fees for license.—For any such license granted there shall be levied a fee in accordance with the class of license granted, as shown in the following scale:—

- 11. Licenses to be renewed annually.—The Port Officer shall, as soon as possible after the 1st day of January in each year, renew the licenses and numbers of the boats on payment of the prescribed fee by the licensees:
 - Provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent the Port Officer from altering or changing the number of any such boat, or from refusing absolutely to renew the license of any boat which he may consider to be insufficiently found or otherwise unfit, or the owner of which he may consider unfit to be entrusted with such renewed license.
- 12. Port Officer may suspend or revoke licenses.—In the event of any licensed boat being at any time insufficiently found or otherwise unfit for the conveyance of the public or of the licensee or other attendant thereof appearing unfit to be entrusted with the charge of the same or of the boat being used for any purpose other than that for which the license is granted or in case of breach of any of the conditions entered in the license the Port Officer may suspend or revoke the license and order the number of the boat to be erased.
- 13. Boats of which the license has been suspended or revoked or number erased not to ply for hire until restoration or renewal of license and number.—The owner of any boat the license of which shall have been suspended or revoked or whose number is ordered to be erased, shall not again permit the same to ply for hire before he shall have obtained a restoration or renewal of such license from the Port Officer and affixed a number to such boat according to the directions of the Port Officer.
- 14. Suspended or revoked licenses to be returned to the Port Officer.—Suspended or revoked licenses shall be returned to the Port Officer within 24 hours of such suspension or revocation.
- 15. Port Officer may issue duplicate licenses in certain cases.—On proof of a license having been lost or mislaid or the particulars written in such license having been accidentally obliterated or defaced, the Port Officer may grant a duplicate license on payment of the fee prescribed in rule 10.
- 16. Licenses not transferable without the sanction of the Port Officer endorsed thereon.—No license granted under these rules shall be transferable without the sanction of the Port Officer endorsed thereon. Any transfer made without such sanction shall forthwith render the license null and void.
- 17. No person to use or authorize the use of a license, number or inscription, other than for the boat for which it has been issued.—The Port Officer shall keep a register containing full particulars of each boat as entered in the license thereof, and no person shall use or authorize the use of a license, or number, other than for the particular boat for which it has been issued, as apparent from the register.
- 18. Boats not to carry passengers in excess of the number licensed to carry.—No licensee or other attendant of a boat shall carry or permit to be carried by the same more passengers than such boat is licensed to carry.
- 19. Number of a boat to be open to public view.—No licensee or other attendant of a boat shall, in any manner or by any means, conceal or permit to be concealed

- from public view the number of the boat nor shall he in any way attempt to prevent or obstruct any person taking or noting the number of such boat.
- 20. Licensee not to permit persons in a boat without the consent of the hirers.—No licensee or other attendant of any boat, the whole of which has been hired or taken by one or more persons, shall permit or suffer any person to be carried in or upon such boat without the express consent of the person or persons hiring the same.
- 21. Licensee always to have with him license, etc., and to produce the same when demanded by hirer or passenger.—Every licensee or other attendant of a boat shall always have his license and rules and table of fares with him, and shall on demand produce the same for the information of any hirer of, or passenger by, such boat.
- 22. Rules and table of fares to be prepared in the office of the Port Officer and issued to applicants on payment of price.—Rules and table of fares relating to boats shall be prepared in the office of the Port Officer, and shall be issued to all applicants on payment of four annas for each copy.
- 23. Licensee not to refuse to give way to any private boat or obstruct any public boat.—No licensee or other attendant of a boat shall refuse or neglect to give way, if he conveniently can, to any private boat nor shall he obstruct or hinder the licensee or other attendant of any other public boat in embarking or landing any person from such boat.
- 24. Licensee to be sober and obedient to hirers and to keep his boat clean.—Every licensee or other attendant of any boat shall at all times during such employment be sober and shall obey the reasonable orders of the person hiring or using his boat, and shall always, when plying for hire, keep the inside of his boat clean.
- 25. Licensee not to demand prepayment of fare, or refuse to convey persons desirous of hiring, or refuse or delay to proceed with reasonable expedition or demand more than legal fare or anchor or lay off other than appointed pier or bunder.—

 No licensee or other attendant of any boat plying for hire shall demand prepayment of his fare, or refuse to convey any person desirous of hiring his boat or refuse or delay to proceed with reasonable expedition, or exact or demand for the hire thereof more than the regulated sum, or anchor or lay off any other pier or bunder than that for which his license is granted.
- 26. Dispute between licensees and hirers to be referred to the officer in charge of the nearest Police Station.—In case of any dispute, the hirer of any boat may require the licensee or other attendant, and the licensee or other attendant may require the hirer, to proceed forthwith to the officer in charge of the nearest Police Station, who shall, if necessary, refer the matter to a Magistrate for decision.
- 27. Licensee or other attendant bound to ply for hire when required by a Police Officer.—Every licensee or other attendant of any boat shall be bound, when required by a Police Officer to do so, to cause the same to ply for hire.
- 28. Property left in a boat to be deposited in the office of the Commissioner of Police, and returned to the owner.—Property left in any boat shall be forthwith deposited by the licensee or other attendant in the office of the Commissioner of Police, to be returned to the person who shall prove to the Commissioner of Police that the same belonged to him, on payment of all expenses reasonably incurred.
- 29. Interpretation.—Attendants on boats licensed under these rules include serangs, tindals, lascars, and boatmen.
- 30. Penalty for breach of rules.—Whoever commits a breach of any of these rules shall on conviction before a Magistrate be punishable with fine which may extend to one hundred rupees under section 54 of the Act.
- 31. Short title.—These rules may be called the Port of Bombay Passenger Boats Rules, 192

 - "VIII. Where land used for non-agricultural purposes is assessed under the provisions of this rule, a sanad shall be granted in the Form EE, if the land is used for building purposes, and in the form E in all other cases."

- (7) Code provisions applicable.—Save as herein provided, the grant shall be subject to the provisions of the said Code.
- (8) Execution.—The applicant shall bear all costs incurred in the preparation, execution, stamping and registration of these presents.

SAMPLES.

An Open General Licence has been issued which permits the free export of all bond fide samples of prohibited goods to all destinations with which trade is now permitted. Samples exported under this licence may be used only for genuine sample purposes, i.e., for obtaining orders from foreign buyers, and may not be sold except with the written consent of the Import and Export Licensing Section; but such consent may be dispensed with when it is desired to sell the articles in the country of destination after they have fulfilled their purpose as samples. Exporters will be required to satisfy the Customs Authorities that the goods presented for export under this licence are bond fide samples, and to make a declaration to that effect on the relative shipping documents.

This notice only applies to samples of goods which require licence for export to the particular destination concerned.

In addition, the consent of the Import and Export Licensing Section is not required for the sale of samples which, though within this scheme at the actual time they were exported, could be exported outside the scheme at the actual time of the proposed sale.

OPEN GENERAL LICENCE FOR COAL EXPORTS.

An Open General Licence has been issued, with effect from Thursday, 1st January 1920, permitting the export of coal, coke and manufactured fuel to all destinations abroad except Russia, Germany, Hungary, Austria, Turkey and Bulgaria, subject always to the approval, previously obtained, of the Controller of the Coal Mines or his duly authorised representative, and subject to shipment being made in a vessel approved by the Commissioners of Customs and Excise or their Officers.

The Customs Authorities will require pre-entry to be made in all cases; and at ports where there is a duly authorised local representative of the Controller of Coal Mines (see list below), the approval referred to above will be signified by his endorsement on the pre-entry form, which must be presented to him for the purpose before shipment.

Where shipment is proposed to be made from a port not included in the list given below it will be necessary for application for the Controller's approval to be made to the Export Branch of the Coal Mines Department in London. Shipments from all ports in the United Kingdom to the destinations excluded from the purview of the general licence must still be covered by an export licence from the Coal Mines Department.

OPEN GENERAL LICENCE FOR THE EXPORT OF SMOOTH-BORE GUNS AND MUNITIONS FOR USE THEREWITH.

An Open General Licence has been issued for the export of smooth-bore guns and munitions for use therewith to the destinations given below, to which, therefore, exports may be made subject to the usual Customs formalities without applications for specific licences to the Import and Export Licensing Section!—

In accordance with Article 6, Chapter 2, of the 'Convention for the Control of the Trade in Arms and Ammunition,' all consignments of Arms and Ammunition proceeding into or through any of the Prohibited Areas set out below will require a Specific Export Licence.

The Prohibited Areas are :-

- (1) The whole of the Continent of Africa, with the exception of Algeria, Libya, and the Union of South Africa. (Within this area are included all islands situated within a hundred nautical miles of the coast, together with Prince's Island, St. Thomas' Island and the Islands of Aunobon and Socotra.)
- (2) Transcaucasia, Persia, Gwadar, the Arabian Peninsula and such continental parts of Asia as were included in the Turkish Empire on August 4, 1914.
- (3) A maritime zone including the Red Sea, the Gulf of Aden, the Persian Gulf and the Sea of Oman and bounded by a line drawn from Cape Guardafui, following the latitude of that cape to its intersection with longitude 57° east of Greenwich, and proceeding thence direct to the eastern frontier of Persia on the Gulf of Oman.

OPEN GENERAL LICENCE FOR THE EXPORT OF AIRCRAFT, etc.

An Open General Licence has been issued for the export of the undermentioned goods to all destinations except Russia, Germany, Hungary. Austria, Turkey and Bulgaria. Applications are no longer to be made to the Import and Export Licensing Section of the Board of Trade in respect of the export of these goods to countries other than those mentioned:—'Aeroplane engines and their component parts. Aircraft, other than balloons of all kinds, and their component parts, together with accessories and articles suitable for use in connection with aircraft.'

OPEN GENERAL LICENCE FOR THE EXPORT OF PARCELS CONTAINING MISCELLANEOUS FOODSTUFFS.

An Open General Licence has been issued for the export by parcel post of parcels containing one or more varieties of foodstuffs (for the personal use of the addressee and not for trading purposes) to all destinations with which trading is allowed, provided that any such parcel may not contain more than two pounds of sugar or more than one pound of butter. Applications need, therefore, no longer be submitted to the Import and Export Licensing Section in respect of the export of such parcels by parcel post.

NOTES REGARDING EXPORT TO CERTAIN COUNTRIES.

Exporters are warned that there are import prohibitions in some foreign countries, information regarding which can be obtained from the Department of Overseas Trade, 35, Old Queen Street, Westminster, S. W. 1, and 73, Basinghall Street, E. C. 2. The issue of an export licence implies no guarantee that the goods will be admitted into the country of destination.

There is no parcel post to Esthonia, Jugo-Slavia (except Dalmatia), Lettland (Latvia), Lithuania, Poland.

Germany.—Gift parcels sent by parcel post may enter Germany without import licence and also free from duty and taxes, provided they do not contain more than 2 kilos (70 ozs.) of tobacco.

Russia (European).—Conditions under which trading with European Russia will be permissible are at present under consideration.

Syria.—A parcel post service is in operation north of Acre to Alexandretta and west of Aleppo, including—

Beyrout, Damascus, Hamah, Homs, Latakia, Rayak and Tripoli.

Turkey.—Parcels for civilians in Turkey and Smyrna will only be accepted if they are fully addressed 'c/o Poste Restante, British Army Post Office, Constantinople' (or Smyrna), and parcels must be called for at the British Post Offices

URGENT ORDERS.

The Import and Export Licensing Section, Board of Trade, announces that firms receiving orders which require immediate acceptance may telegraph details of any such order to ascertain whether a licence will be granted for the export of the goods if the order is accepted.

In the event of an applicant being promised a licence he will be enabled to deal with the order straightaway with the knowledge that upon application being made in the proper form to the Import and Export Licensing Section (Board of Trade) the licence will be granted.

The telegrams should be addressed to 'Derestim, London.' They should give in each case in addition to the name and postal or telegraphic address of the applicant the quantity and description of the goods comprised in the order and the country of destination. A reply of 24 words must be prepaid.

Applicants are requested in their own interest to confine their enquiries to orders needing a very urgent decision, since the fewer the enquiries the more promptly can answers be given.

In exercise of the power conferred by section 21 of the Press and Registration of Books Act, 1867 (XXV of 1867), the Governor General in Council is pleased to direct that the following proviso shall be inserted after item 11 of the Notification of the Government of India in the Home Department, No. 5604, dated the 21st December 1871, namely:—

'Provided that notwithstanding anything above contained, no publication issued by or in support of any person who is a candidate at any election either to any legislative body constituted under the Government of India Act or to any local authority shall be so exempted.'

No. 11125.—The Governor in Council is pleased to direct that the following changes should be made in the Rules relating to the examination of Police Officers published with Government Notifications Nos. 2435 and 5348-A., dated the 26th April 1909 and 13th August 1918, respectively:—

For the words "be gazetted as a third grade Assistant Superintendent of Police and draw pay at Rs. 300 per mensem" occurring in

the fifth and sixth lines of rule I of the rules accompanying Government Resolution, Judicial Department, No. 2434, dated the 26th April 1909, substitute the following:—

"be gazetted as a probationary Assistant Superintendent of Police and draw pay at Rs. 325 (plus Rs. 125 as overseas allowance if his domicile be non-Indian) and his pay thereafter will be regulated by the time-scale laid down in Government Order, Judicial Department, No. 1439, dated 12th February 1920, subject to rule IV and to the general orders of Government regulating the grant of increments."

For rule IV printed in Government Resolution, Judicial Department, No. 5348, dated the 13th August 1918, substitute the following:—

"IV (1). The four tests prescribed in rule V of the rules published with Government Resolution, Judicial Department, No. 2434, dated the 26th April 1909, should be passed within two years from the day on which the probationary Assistant Superintendent of Police reports to the authorities for duty."

(2) Failure to pass the prescribed four tests within two years will entail postponement of the increment due at the end of the second year until the tests are passed. The increment withheld shall become payable with effect from the date of the Government Notification notifying the passing of the last test passed by the probationary Assistant Superintendent of Police concerned and all future increments shall accrue as if no postponement of increment had taken place. But Government reserve power to relax this rule in any exceptional case (such for instance as unavoidable detention of the officer at the time fixed for the examination by some pressing emergency or by the express order of his superior officer) in which the literal application of the rule would work inequitably.

(3) Officiating and substantive promotion to the grade of Superintendent of Police on the senior scale will be regulated by the order of dates of appointment and shall be subject to satisfactory conduct.

(4) The provisions of clauses (1) to (3) above also apply to probationary Deputy Superintendents of Police who under the foregoing rules have to undergo a course of training at the Police Training School.

(5) The seniority between Deputy Superintendents of Police promoted from Inspectors rank or appointed under paragraph 3 of rule I of the rules published with Government Resolution, Judicial Department, No. 2434, dated the 26th April 1909, and probationary Deputy Superintendents of Police who pass through the Central Police Training School will be regulated according to the dates of their substantive appointments as Deputy Superintendents of Police.

(6) Passing of departmental tests will not entitle to promotion an Assistant Superintendent of Police or a Deputy Superintendent of Police whose conduct is not otherwise satisfactory."

For rule XIII of the rules accompanying Government Resolution, Judicial Department, No. 2434, dated the 26th April 1909, substitute the following:—

"XIII. Notwithstanding anything contained in clause (2) of rule IV a probationary Assistant Superintendent of Police or Deputy Superintendent of Police who does not qualify by passing the prescribed tests within two years or at the first examination held after two years from the date of his reporting to authorities for duty will be liable to be removed from his appointment."
