No. 2825-D. C. S.—In modification of Government Notification No. 2654-D.C.S., dated 9th June 1920, the Governor in Council is pleased to fix the following prices for the sale of charcoal in the Town and Island of Bombay and its suburbs:—

Any person found selling charcoal at a price in excess of that fixed above will be punishable under No. 11-J of the Defence of India Rules, 1915, with imprisonment for a term which may extend to six months or with fine which may extend to Rs. 1,000 or to three times the price received by him for the commodity as sold, whichever is most.
