No. 3612.—In exercise of the power conferred by Section 25, clause (b), of the Indian Forest Act, (VII of), 1878, as amended by Section 7 of the Forest Act (V of) 1890, the Governor in Council is pleased to make the following rules regarding the kindling of fires or the leaving of fires burning so as to endanger a reserved forest (namely) :

1. Fire shall not be kindled or left burning upon any public or private Kindling, &c., of fire on roads in reserved forests prohibited. way, which lies within the boundaries of a reserved forest but is not included

in the area thereof, except at such spots as may from time to time be notified locally by the Divisional Forest Officer.

2. No person shall ignite materials for making ash-manure in a field

Precautions to be taken in making ash-manure near a reserved forest.

adjoining a reserved forest unless he has cleared a fire-path twenty-five feet

in width and taken such other precautions, such as employing watchers, as are reasonably necessary to prevent fire spreading to the forest.

Kindling of fire in neigh-bourhood of a reserved forest prohibited.

3. Except for the purposes of making ashmanure, no fire shall be kindled, elsewhere than in a place used as a human

dwelling or in premises appertaining to such dwelling, within a distance of two hundred yards from the boundary of a reserved forest, without the previous written permission of a Forest officer not lower in rank than a Sub-Assistant Conservator.

These rules not to operate in the rainy season.

4. Nothing in these rules shall have operation in the rainy season commencing on the 15th June and ending on the 31st October.

No. 2132-8.R.—In exercise of the power conferred by Section 8, sub-section (a), of the Indian Stamp Act (I of 1879), the Governor-General in Council is pleased to remit, retrospectively, all stamp duty in excess of Rs. 15 leviable on any trust-deed hitherto entered into in compliance with the rules for the time then being in force in the Presidency of Bombay regulating grants-in-aid made by Government for building purposes to schools in that Presidency, and he is further pleased to reduce the stamp duty leviable on any such deed which may hereafter be entered into in compliance with the rules from time to time regulating such grants-in-aid to the duty payable on a bond for like amount or value or the sum of Rs. 15, whichever shall be less.

BY THE COMMISSIONER OF CUSTOMS, SALT, OPIUM AND A'BKA'RI.

No. 2078.—In continuation of this office Notification No. 4465, dated 7th September 1894, published at pages 946—948 of the Bombay Government Gazette, Part I, dated the 13th idem, the following subsidiary rules approved by the Commissioner of A'bkari under the provisions of Section 35 of the Bombay A'bkari Act, 1878, for the management of the Central Distillery at Ahmedabad and for the regulation of the storage, removal and transport of spirits made therein, are published for general information:—

I.—Each cask before being used in the distillery and employed for transport shall be taken by the farmer's men to the Inspector, who shall gauge its capacity by means of the measures provided for the purpose, and shall paint upon it—

1 the name of the distillery, 2 the consecutive number of cask,

3 the capacity of the cask in gallons and drams,

4 the date of painting.

II.—Each cask so painted shall be again gauged once in every six months, or whenever it undergoes any repairs, by the Inspector, by means of measures provided for the purpose, and shall be painted anew, if necessary.

III.—Casks used for storage shall not be used for purposes of conveyance of liquor from one place to another.

No. 1771.—It is hereby notified for general information that the following amended rule regarding the performance of Sunday work by the Preventive and Wharf Departments of the Custom House at Karáchi, framed under the provisions of Section 9 of Act VIII of 1878 and approved by the Government of Bombay, is substituted for the rule published in Government Notification No. 4649, dated the 19th June 1883 (vide page 432 of the Bombay Government Gazette of the 21st idem, Part I):—

"With the written permission of the Collector of Customs, Sunday working on board steamers within the limits of the Port of Karáchi may be permitted on payment, in addition to the ordinary charges at present levied, of a fee equal to one day's demurrage, subject to a minimum charge of Rs. 50 and a maximum charge of Rs. 200 for each ship on board which work is carried on; demurrage for this purpose to be calculated at the rate of 64 annas per ton of registered tonnage. It shall be within the discretion of the Collector of Customs to remit or reduce the fees leviable on mail steamers which cannot avoid working on Sundays; such remission or reduction shall ordinarily be made at ports of call only."
