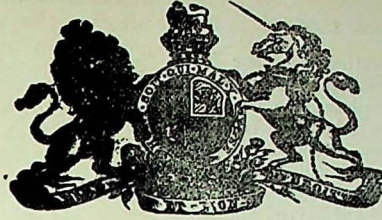

No. 2312.—In exercise of the power conferred by Act I of 1870, the following Rules for Quarantine against Cholera have been made by the Government of Bombay, with the previous sanction of the Governor General in Council: they have effect from the 3rd instant in the Ports of Aden, Perim and the Somali Coast as a temporary measure:—

I.—The Commander of every vessel, including buggalows or other native craft, arriving from Arabian Ports of the Red Sea shall, before entering the harbour, indicate by signal the port from which such vessel has come.

II.—Such Commander shall not, except as hereinafter provided, allow any communication, either with the pilot boat, except orally, or with the shore, or with any other vessel or boat in the harbour.

III.—Immediately on arrival the Commander shall cause the letter R of the Commercial Signal Code to be hoisted, and shall keep the said flag flying during his stay in port or until authorized by the Health Officer to haul it down. If communication with the shore is not desired, the vessel shall anchor at such place as may be pointed out by the Port authorities, having regard to the season of the year. If communication with the shore is desired, the Health Officer shall go alongside the vessel, and, after all necessary enquiries, shall direct the Commander to take the vessel to the quarantine anchorage duly appointed and notified in that behalf by the Resident, there to remain for a period of seven days from the date of arrival, or for the shorter period prescribed in Rule IV, and undergo disinfection, which should apply as well to crew, passengers, effects, and susceptible goods.

IV.—If the Health Officer of the Port has sufficient evidence that no cases of a suspicious nature have taken place on board during the voyage, and if the vessel is besides in good hygienic condition, the duration of the quarantine will be diminished according to the following scale:—

After eight days of voyage	six days of quarantine.
Do. nine do.	five do.
Do. ten do.	four do.
Do. eleven do.	three do.
Do. twelve do.	two do.
Do. thirteen do.	and upwards	...	twenty-four hours of quarantine.

- V.—If during the period a vessel is at the quarantine anchorage aforesaid any case or cases of cholera should occur on board, the said vessel shall remain in quarantine for a period of seven days from the date of the last case occurring, and be subject to all the prohibitions provided for in Rule III.
- VI.—When any vessel has been placed in quarantine as aforesaid, the Health Officer may direct the removal of so many of the passengers and crew as may not be suffering from illness, and whose services may not be required on board the vessel, to such particular spots as may from time to time be selected by the Resident as places of quarantine, there to remain for a period of seven days. If a case of cholera occurs among such passengers and crew during any such period, they shall remain in a place of quarantine for a period of fifteen days from the date of the occurrence of the last case of such illness.
- VII.—Any mails or cargo which may be brought by any vessel so arriving shall be landed under such precautions as the Health Officer may deem necessary to prevent the spread of the disease.
- VIII.—It will be the duty of the Port Officer to facilitate the conveyance to all vessels in quarantine of such supplies of provisions, stores and other articles as may be required by those on board. Such supplies will be placed on the boats of the vessels in quarantine to be subsequently removed by members of their crews.
- IX.—All vessels arriving at Aden, Perim and the Somáli Coast which may have communicated with vessels coming from Arabian Ports of the Red Sea shall be subjected to the same quarantine as vessels arriving at Aden, Perim and the Somáli Coast from Arabian Ports of the Red Sea.
- X.—All vessels which have undergone quarantine in the manner above prescribed should have the fact clearly stated on their Bills of Health.

SUBJECT.—*Revision of postage rates for Soldiers' and Seamen's privileged letters.*

The Government of India have sanctioned the rate of postage collected in Indian currency on soldiers' and seamen's letters which are entitled to the privilege of transmission through the post at the statutory rate of 1/4 per letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight, being raised from 9 pies to one anna from the 1st April 1895; and on and after that date the following will be the special postage rates applicable to soldiers' and seamen's letters posted in India for the United Kingdom or any British possession or colony, in supersession of the rates at present entered in clause 204 of the Postal Guide:—

(a) To the United Kingdom or any British possession or colony served through the United Kingdom.	By P. & O. contract steamer <i>via</i> Brindisi.	By ordinary train service across the Continent of Europe ...	1	Prepayment compulsory.
(b) To Cyprus (through Egypt)	...	By special train service across the Continent of Europe ...	2	
(c) To any British possession or colony direct by British or Indian Services only	...	(and Zanzibar) served	1	

There will be no reduced or privileged rate for soldiers' and seamen's letters except in the cases mentioned above. In other cases the ordinary rate (2½ as. per ½ oz.) will be applicable.

2. On and after the 1st April 1895 any undefaced 9-pie embossed envelopes or stamps presented by soldiers or seamen at post offices should be exchanged for one anna postage stamps on pay-

ment into the post office of the difference, viz., 3 pies per envelope or stamp. This exchange should be made even in the case of envelopes on which there may be any writing, provided that the embossed 9-pie stamp is clear and undefaced. The 9-pie embossed envelopes collected in this manner should from time to time be exchanged at the Treasury for ordinary postage stamps by post offices situated at Government Treasury Stations. Post offices which are not situated at Government Treasury Stations should send such envelopes for exchange to the post offices from which they receive their supplies of ordinary postage stamps, the face value of the envelopes being written off as cash remittances from the former to the latter.

3. A supply of 9-pie embossed envelopes has been overprinted with the value of one anna, and, on and after the 1st April 1895, these overprinted envelopes will take the place of the embossed 9-pie envelopes at present used for soldiers' and seamen's privileged letters.
