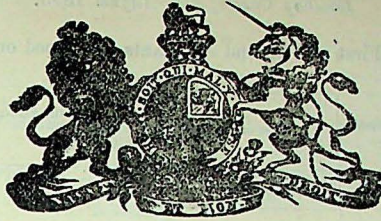

Information has been received from the Commissioner of Customs, Salt, Opium and A'bkári, dated 7th instant, that on 1st April 1895 a light was exhibited from an iron structure recently erected at Gogha Bandar.

Gogha Light is a 6th order dioptric fixed white light elevated 25 feet above high water spring tides and is visible from seaward between the bearings of N.W. through west and south to S.S.E. from a distance of ten miles in clear weather.

Longitude 72° 15' 38' E.”
