"After the word dock in line 3, add 'or alongside the walls on the outside of the dock,' and after the word dock in line 5, add 'or before coming alongside the walls or the outside of the dock.'"

No. 72.—In accordance with the provisions of Section 74 of the Bombay Port Trust Act, 1879, the following bye-law made by the Trustees of the Port of Bombay in substitution of Bye-law No. 3 of the Bye-laws for Pilots of coasting steamers approved by Government under Notifications No. 72, dated 1st July 1891, and No. 51, dated 23rd May 1892, is published for the information of all persons whom it may concern:—

"No. 3. Every such pilot must obtain and hold a license issued under the signature and seal of the Trustees of the Port. Such license shall entitle him to pilot coasting steamers on the passage to and fro between the open sea and any part of the harbour and to and fro from any part of the harbour to any other part thereof, except that a vessel though in charge of such pilot shall on no account take up any berth in the harbour amongst the shipping unless such berth shall have first been allotted to the vessel by the Port Officer. Such a license may at any time be withdrawn by the order of the Trustees and shall on withdrawal be returned to the Secretary to the Trustees at their office."

New Telegraph Oable in the Entrance to Bassein River.

Information has been received from the Port Officer, Bassein, Burma, that a new telegraph cable was laid in 1893 between Diamond Island and Pagoda Point in place of the old one which had become unserviceable.

The cable is laid in a N. 26° W. or S. 26° E. direction. The prohibited anchorage for the protection of the cable should be between the following bearings:

N.E. point of Diamond Island S.S.E. \(\frac{3}{4}\) E. and S. \(\frac{4}{4}\) E. (magnetic), and no vessel should anchor within 1\(\frac{1}{2}\) miles of the north extreme of Diamond 1sland."

- (2) Every certificate granted under Section 5 of the Act to any person employed or desirous of being employed in a factory shall be prepared by filling up in the consecutive order of the pages the foil and duplicate foil of the register kept by the occupier of that factory under this rule. Such foil and duplicate foil, when filled up, shall be signed by the Certifying Surgeon when satisfied as to the correctness of the entries therein, and the foil shall be detached and given to the person entitled to the certificate.
- (3) The counterfoil shall also be filled up with entries corresponding with those on the foils belonging to it, and the Certifying Surgeon, when satisfied that the entries in counterfoil and foils do so correspond, shall initial the counterfoil, which shall be retained in the register.
- (4) The occupier of the factory shall, from time to time, as circumstances require, enter and sign, or cause to be entered and signed, in the last column of the counterfoil, a description of the employment of the person to whom the certificate refers, with the date on which such employment, in each case, commenced; and shall, on such person ceasing to be employed in the factory, forthwith write and sign, or cause to be written and signed, across the counterfoil referring to such person, the words 'no longer employed in factory'.

(6) Except as in this rule provided, no entries shall be made on the foils, duplicate foils or counterfoils in any register."
