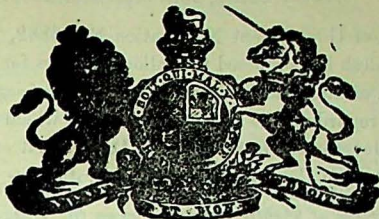

No. 6758A.—In exercise of the power conferred by Sub-section (2) of Section 1 of the Bombay District Police Act, 1890, His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to order that Section 25 of the said Act be introduced in Sind with effect from the date of the publication of this Notification.

No. 6758B.—Under the provisions of Section 1 of Act V of 1868, His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to delegate to the Commissioner in Sind the power conferred by Section 25 of the Bombay District Police Act, 1890, on the Governor of Bombay in Council as the Local Government of the Province of Sind.

No. 6889.—The Governor in Council is pleased to extend Section 41 of the Bombay District Police Act, 1890, to the town of Chiplûn in the Ratnâgiri District.

## Bombay Castle, 30th September 1895.

No. 6929.—Whereas it appears to His Excellency the Governor in Council that the conduct of the inhabitants in the village of Pâl in the Karâd Tâluka in the district of Sâtâra renders it expedient temporarily to increase the strength of the Police in the said village for a further period of one year in continuation of the period sanctioned in Government Notification No. 6894, dated the 12th October 1894, His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 25 of the Bombay District Police Act, 1890,—

(a) to direct the employment in the local area of the said village of additional Police of the strength and cost hereinbelow set forth for a period of one year from the 1st September 1895, and

(b) to direct that the cost of such additional Police, as hereinbelow set forth, shall be defrayed wholly by a rate charged on the inhabitants generally of the said village:

## MARINE DEPARTMENT.

*Bombay Castle, 24th September 1895.*

No. 79.—The following information received from the Bhavnagar State, Káthiáwár, is published for general information with reference to Government Notification No. 67, dated 7th August 1895 :—

“The bell buoy which marks the south-west edge Rhuk Bank at the entrance of the Bhavnagar creek was relaid on the 21st August 1895 for the fair season.”

No. 80.—The following Notice to Mariners is published for general information :—

“INDIA—GULF OF MARTABAN—  
TENNASSERIM COAST.

*Mergui Harbour—Revised Sailing Directions.*

The following revised Sailing Directions have been received from the Port Officer, Moulmein :

No stranger should attempt to enter until after the first quarter flood if of 10 feet draught, or till after half flood, if drawing more than 10 feet. At neaps, with local knowledge a vessel of 15 feet draught may enter after first quarter flood. Steer to pass about two cables to the westward of the beacon standing in 7 feet at low water, and marking the extreme of the sand spit projecting from the north-westward of Kalwin Point, and then shape course S.S.E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  E. with a white-washed basket on the beacon trees near the water (on the mangroves about one mile north of the town) in line with a white-washed pagoda on a hill behind the town,\* until the right extreme of the market, a conspicuous white shed near the water's edge comes nearly in line with the Deputy Commissioner's house (on the hill) bearing South  $\frac{3}{4}$  East.

From this position, which is 2½ cables from the mangroves on Mergui Island, steer for the Deputy Commissioner's house until the north end Pataw Island bears W. by N.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N.; the left extreme of the trees on Kalwin Point should now be kept astern bearing north a little easterly, this course taking the vessel 2 to 2½ cables off the Mergui Island shore, or steer to pass one cable west of the extreme of the main wharf, and anchor 1½ cables W.S.W. or W.N.W. of it. These directions reversed will guide a steam-vessel in leaving the harbour.

A spit with 14 feet over it in places extends west from the end of the wharf for 1½ cables. By anchoring as recommended this spit will be avoided, and vessels drawing not more than 15 feet, nor more than 200 feet in length, will have swinging room at low water.”

\* This pagoda is small and not easily distinguished; the most conspicuous pagoda is about half a mile south-westward of the first near the Deputy Commissioner's house.

No. 81.—The following Notice to Mariners is published for general information with reference to Government Notification No. 52, dated 3rd July 1895 :—

“GULF OF ADEN—NORTH SHORE—ADEN  
HARBOUR.

Information has been received from the Port Officer, Aden, dated 12th instant, that the bar across the entrance to the new channel outside the principal light-vessel has now entirely disappeared by scour and there is now a greater depth of water in this locality than before the formation of the bar.”

No. 88.—The following Notice to Mariners is published for general information :—

“INDIA—BAY OF BENGAL.  
BURMA.

*Temporary removal of Spit Light Vessel in the entrance to Rangoon River.*

Telegraphic communication has been received from the Port Officer, Rangoon, dated 24th instant, that the spit light vessel in the entrance to Rangoon River has been temporarily removed.”

No. 89.—The following additions made by the Trustees of the Port of Bombay to the scale of fees leviable at the Bandars of the Bombay Port Trust, and approved by Government under Section 43 of the Bombay Port Trust Act, 1879, are published for general information :—

*Table of Wharfage Fees, page 24.*

*Para. 1A.*—All square rigged vessels using the pier at the east end of the Mody Bay South Reclamation will be charged one pie per ton per diem. The minimum charge will be Rs. 25.

*Para. 1B.*—All coasting country craft (not square rigged), cargo boats and barges using the pier will be charged two pies per ton per diem.

*Para. 1C.*—The day that a vessel comes alongside and the day she leaves the pier shall be counted as one day.

*Para. 1D.*—Vessels will not be charged for Sundays or the holidays enumerated at page 32, para. 22, when no work is done.

*Table of Wharfage Fees, page 33.*

*Para. 27A.*—The ordinary charges for work at nights and on holidays will apply with regard to the pier at the east end of Mody Bay South Reclamation, subject in the former case to any regulations that may be made or are in force regarding landing petroleum at night.

No. 6766.—In continuation of Government Notification No. 2351, dated the 9th April 1895, His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased, under Section 14 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1882, to appoint Mr. Chanmallapa Chanasapa Tenginkai to be a Special Magistrate, and to invest him, within the municipal limits of the town of Dhárwár, with the powers of a Magistrate of the Third Class for the trial of Municipal cases.

No. 6838.—Mr. Govind Krishna Vannur, Clerk of the First Class Subordinate Judge's Court at Belgaum in the district of Belgaum, was in charge of the current duties of that Court, in addition to his own, from the 8th July to the 7th August 1895, both days inclusive.

Power to make orders prohibiting repetitions of nuisances (Section 143).

Power to make orders under Section 144.

Power to hold inquests (Section 174).

Power to take cognizance of offences upon complaint and upon police reports (Section 191 (a) and (b)).

No. 6857.—In exercise of the power conferred by clause (1) of Section 3 of the Bombay Mám-latdárs' Courts Act, 1876, His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to authorize Ázam Moreshwar Dinkar Vaidya, Mahálkari, petha Khálápúr, in the district of Kolába, to exercise within that petha the powers of a Mám-latdár under the said Act.

No. 6859.—In exercise of the power conferred by clause (1) of Section 3 of the Bombay Mám-latdárs' Courts Act, 1876, His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to authorize Ázam Govind Gopal Ambike, acting Mahálkari, petha Shirola in the district of Sátára, to exercise within that petha the powers of a Mám-latdár under the said Act.

No. 6860.—Under the provisions of Section 14 of Act II of 1864 (The Aden Courts Act), His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to invest Lieutenant J. W. B. Merewether, acting Fifth Assistant Political Resident, Aden, with the powers of a Judge of a Court of Small Causes as defined in Act IX of 1887 and Act X of 1888.

2. Under the provisions of Section 18 of the said Act, His Excellency in Council is also pleased to invest Lieutenant J. W. B. Merewether with all the powers, excepting the power under Section 407, conferred or conferrible on a Magistrate of the First Class under the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1882, for Aden and its dependencies wherein the said Code is in force.
