## PART I.

### Notification.

#### POLITICAL DEPARTMENT.

*Bombay Castle, 2nd November 1895.*

No. 6851.—Their Excellencies the Right Honourable the EARL of ELGIN, P.C., LL.D., G.M.S.I., G.M.I.E., and the COUNTESS of ELGIN, C.I., are expected to arrive at the Poona Station of the G. I. P. Railway at 8-30 A.M. (Madras time) on Saturday the 9th November 1895, and will be received on arrival with all the honours due to the Viceroy of India.

2. The Commissioner\* of the Central Division will attend on His Excellency at Chálisgaon, which will be the first station at which His Excellency's train will stop after entering the limits of the Presidency; and the Military Secretary to His Excellency the Governor will join His Excellency's train at Loni. The Superintendent of Police, G. I. P. Railway, will be in attendance within the limits of his jurisdiction.

3. The Military authorities will arrange for a Salute of 31 guns being fired on His Excellency's alighting from the train at the Poona Railway Station and for the attendance at the Station of a Guard of Honour with Band and Colour and for lining the road with troops of the garrison from the Railway Station through Sassoon Road, Mál Road, and Wellesley Road to the G. I. P. Railway overbridge. The Military authorities will also arrange for a Guard of Honour with Band and Colour being in attendance on His Excellency's arrival at Ganesh Khind and for the mounting of a European Officer's Guard at Government House during His Excellency's stay at Poona.

\* In consequence of the hour at which His Excellency's train will reach Chálisgaon, the Viceroy has been pleased, as a special case, to excuse the Commissioner from attendance.

4. His Excellency the Viceroy will be received at the Railway Station by His Excellency the Governor with his Staff. The Lord Bishop of Bombay, the Ordinary Members of Council of the Government of Bombay, the Additional Members of the Council of His Excellency the Governor for making Laws and Regulations who may be in Poona at the time, the Chief Secretary to Government, the Secretaries to Government, the Deputy Adjutant General, Bombay Command, the General Officer Commanding Poona District, the Collector of Poona, the District Judge of Poona, the Under Secretary to Government, Political Department, and the Heads of Departments, Civil and Military, will be in attendance. The Consular representatives of Foreign Governments who may be in Poona at the time, and the Roman Catholic Bishop of Poona, are invited to be present.

5. All Officers of Her Majesty's Services, Civil and Military, in Poona, who are not otherwise on duty, are desired to attend.

6. The Railway Department should issue instructions for the necessary arrangements being made at the Railway Station for His Excellency's reception, and for the adequate provision of space for those invited or desired to attend. His Lordship will proceed to Government House, Ganesh Khind, escorted by a detachment of Cavalry along the route lined by troops.

7. The District Superintendent of Police, Poona, will arrange for the maintenance of order and for keeping the streets clear.

8. Full Dress uniform will be worn. Gentlemen not entitled to wear uniform will appear in morning dress.

9. By desire of His Excellency the Viceroy, his departure from Kirkee Railway Station at 3 P.M. on Tuesday the 12th November 1895 will be private, and the Military Secretary to His Excellency the Governor will make the necessary arrangements.

*Foot-note.*—All officers and gentlemen, to whom separate letters have been sent enclosing cards of admission to the reserved space on the platform, are requested to enter the station by the main entrance and to show their cards at the door.

The Civil and Military officers, referred to in paragraph 5 of the above Notification, will be admitted without tickets to the unreserved space on the east side of the platform, and are requested to enter and leave the platform by the gates at the east end of the station yard.

No carriages will be admitted into the station yard after 8-15 A.M., and it is particularly requested that all attending will be in their places by that hour.

Owing to the limited space available on the platform no cards of admission will be issued to the general public on this occasion.
