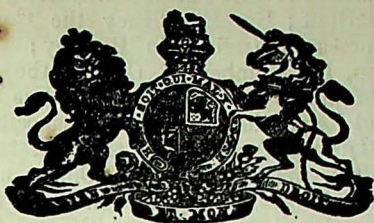

Notifications.

POLITICAL DEPARTMENT.

Bombay Castle, 28th January 1895.

No. 651.—His Excellency the Right Honourable LORD HARRIS, G.C.I.E., will take his departure for England in the P. & O. S. N. Co.'s S. S. *Clyde* from the Apollo Bandar on Saturday the 16th February 1895.

2. The arrangements connected with the departure of His Excellency from Government House will be made by the Military Secretary to His Excellency the Governor and will be timed so that His Excellency may reach the Apollo Bandar at 4-45 p.m. The Director of the Royal Indian Marine should be requested to consult with His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief of Her Majesty's Naval Forces in India, if in Bombay (or, in his absence, with the Senior Naval Officer), and act in concert with him in arranging the details of embarkation. The arrangements at the Bandar will be made by the Public Works Department.

3. His Excellency, escorted by a detachment of His Excellency the Governor's Body Guard and the Bombay Light Horse, will proceed to the Apollo Bandar *via* the Ridge, Gibbs Road, Gowalia Tank Road, Grant Road, Parel Road, Kálbádevi Road, Cruickshank Road, Hornby Road, and Esplanade Road to the Apollo Bandar. A Guard of Honour will be detailed, under the orders of His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief, to receive His Excellency at the Apollo Bandar, and the roads from the Flora Fountain to the Bandar will be lined by troops of the Garrison. A salute of 17 guns will be fired from the Saluting Battery on the embarkation taking place.

4. A deputation consisting of the Chief Secretary to Government, the Military Secretary to His Excellency the Governor, and one of His Excellency's Aides-de-Camp will accompany His Excellency on board the steamer.

5. His Excellency will be received at the Bandar by His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief and Staff; His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief of Her Majesty's Naval Forces in India, if in Bombay; the Chief Justice of Bombay, the Lord Bishop, the Members of Council, the Judges of the High Court, the Additional Members of the Council of His Excellency the Governor for making Laws and Regulations, the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Bombay, the Roman Catholic Archbishop, the Secretaries to Government, the Archdeacon of Bombay, the Senior Naval Officer at the Station, in the absence of His Excellency the Naval Commander-in-Chief, the Brigadier-General Commanding the Bombay District, the Naval Officers Commanding any of Her Majesty's Ships in Harbour, if able to attend on shore, the Director of the Royal Indian Marine, the Private Secretary and the Staff of His Excellency the Governor, the Municipal Commissioner, the Under Secretaries to Government, and the Heads of Departments, Civil and Military, the Sheriff of Bombay or such of the above high officials as are then in the Presidency Town, for whom a space marked A will be reserved.

6. An enclosed space marked B will be reserved at the Bandar for any Native Chiefs who, being in Bombay, may have intimated to the Secretary to Government, Political Department, their desire to be present.

7. The Consular representatives of Foreign Governments and the President of the Bombay Corporation are invited to be present on the occasion and a space marked C will be reserved for them at the Bandar.

8. All other officers of Her Majesty's Services, Civil, Naval, Military and the Royal Indian Marine, and officers belonging to Corps of Volunteers, then in Bombay, will be provided with seats as far as space is available. To all such who wish to attend cards of admission to space D will be supplied on application to the Executive Engineer of the Presidency. The same officer will also issue cards of admission to space A to any Heads of Departments, not specified by name in paragraph 5, who may intimate that they will be present. For all other officials and persons mentioned in paragraphs 5, 6 and 7 no cards will be necessary. As far as accommodation in space E is available it will be allotted to any Ladies or Gentlemen who may apply for tickets to the Executive Engineer. The arrangements at the Bandar will be made by the Public Works Department.

9. The Commissioner of Police will arrange for the maintenance of order and for keeping the streets clear.

10. Full Dress will be worn by all officers of Government entitled to wear uniform and morning dress by all others.

11. All honours due to the Governor of Bombay will be paid to Lord Harris until he passes Aden.

No. 652.—The Right Honourable LORD SANDHURST, appointed by Her Majesty the QUEEN-EMPRESS to be the Governor of this Presidency, is expected to arrive in Bombay at daybreak on the 18th February 1895 by the P. & O. S. N. Company's *S. S. Ganges*, and will be received on arrival with all the Naval and Military honours due to his position.

2. At 7 A.M. a deputation consisting of the Chief Secretary to Government, the Military Secretary to His Excellency the Acting Governor, and one of His Excellency's Aides-de-Camp will proceed on board the *Ganges* under arrangements to be made by the Director of the Royal Indian Marine.

3. Lord Sandhurst will leave the *Ganges* at 7-15 A.M. and the Director of the Royal Indian Marine should be requested to consult with His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief of Her Majesty's Naval Forces in India, if in Bombay

or with the Senior Naval Officer at the Station, in the absence of His Excellency, and to act in concert with him in arranging the details of His Lordship's disembarkation at the Apollo Bandar. The arrangements for landing at the Bandar will be made by the Director of the Royal Indian Marine. All other arrangements on the Bandar will be made by the Public Works Department.

4. On His Lordship's arrival at the steps of the Bandar, a salute of 17 guns will be fired from the Saluting Battery. A Guard of Honour of British Infantry with Band and Colours will be drawn up, and the road from the Bandar to the Flora Fountain will be lined by troops of the Garrison. A Guard of Honour of Bombay Infantry with Band and Colours will be at Government House, Malabár Point.

5. His Lordship will be received at the Bandar by His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief and Staff; by His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief of Her Majesty's Naval Forces in India, if in Bombay; by the Chief Justice of Bombay, the Lord Bishop, the Members of Council, the Judges of the High Court, the Additional Members of the Council of His Excellency the Governor for making Laws and Regulations, the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Bombay, the Roman Catholic Archbishop, the Secretaries to Government, the Archdeacon of Bombay, the Senior Naval Officer at the Station, in the absence of His Excellency the Naval Commander-in-Chief, the Brigadier-General Commanding the Bombay District, the Naval Officers Commanding any of Her Majesty's Ships in Harbour, if able to attend on shore, the Director of the Royal Indian Marine, the Private Secretary and the Staff of His Excellency the Acting Governor, the Municipal Commissioner, the Under Secretaries to Government, and the Heads of Departments, Civil and Military, the Sheriff of Bombay, or by such of the above high officials as are then in the Presidency Town, for whom a space marked A will be reserved.

6. An enclosed space marked B will be reserved at the Bandar for any Native Chiefs who, being in Bombay, may have intimated to the Secretary to Government, Political Department, their desire to be present.

7. The Consular representatives of Foreign Governments and the President of the Bombay Municipal Corporation are invited to be present on the occasion, and a space marked C will be reserved for them at the Bandar.

8. All other officers of Her Majesty's Services, Civil, Naval, Military and the Royal Indian Marine, and officers belonging to Corps of Volunteers, then in Bombay, as well as members of the Municipal Corporation of Bombay who are desirous of attending will be provided with seats as far as space is available. To all such who wish to attend cards of admission to space D will be supplied on application to the Executive Engineer of the Presidency. The same officer will also issue cards of admission to space A to any Heads of Departments, not specified by name in paragraph 5, who may intimate that they will be present. For all other officials and persons mentioned in paragraphs 5, 6 and 7 no cards will be necessary. As far as accommodation in space E is available it will be allotted to any Ladies or Gentlemen who may apply for tickets to the Executive Engineer. The arrangements at the Bandar will be made by the Public Works Department.

9. As the Municipal Corporation of the City of Bombay has expressed its desire to present an Address to His Excellency on his arrival, a space marked F will be reserved at the Bandar to which the Governor elect will be conducted, and where His Lordship will be received by the representatives of the Corporation. The Executive Engineer will send a card of admission to each member of the Corporation whose name is communicated to him by the President of the Corporation.

10. His Lordship will, after the presentation of the Address, proceed to Government House, Malabár Point, escorted by a Detachment of His Excellency the Acting Governor's Body Guard and the Bombay Light Horse, *via* Esplanade

Road, Hornby Road, Cruickshank Road, Kalbadevi Road, Parel Road, Grant Road, Gawalia Tank Road, Gibbs Road and the Ridge. No procession of carriages will be formed. The Commissioner of Police will maintain order and keep the streets clear.

11. Full Dress will be worn by all officers of Government entitled to wear uniform and morning dress by all others.
