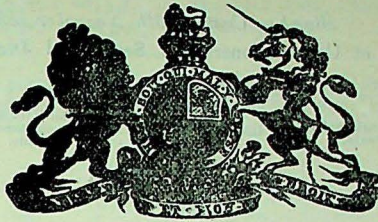

“The boundary line between pillars 14 and 1 is in the shape of a rectangle, the shorter sides of which are 100 yards long, as indicated by red dotted lines on the plan dated the 10th September 1894, filed in the District Staff Office, Deesa. The position of the points in the bed of the river in the said plan to be fixed every year at the close of the monsoon with temporary pillars.”

RESOLUTION.

In paragraph 4 of the Resolution read above, the Government of India authorized the grant to officers employed in Sind of a reward of Rs. 1,000 for passing an examination in the Turki language. It has now been represented that this language is unknown in Sind and on the frontiers of Sind, and that there is a difficulty in arranging for the examination in Turki, while its study is productive of no benefit. In these circumstances the Governor General in Council is pleased to direct that Turki shall be struck out of the list of languages for passing in which rewards are admissible to officers serving in Sind.

by Section 5 of the Opium Act, 1878, and in continuation of the Notifications quoted in the margin, the Governor in Council is pleased, with the previous sanction of

the Governor General in Council, to modify No. 8 of the rules made under the said section and published under Government Notification No. 4472A, dated 3rd June 1885, at pages 704 to 715 of the *Bombay Government Gazette*, Part I, dated 4th idem, by directing as follows:—

"Provided that for the transport from the City of Bombay of preparations of opium for *bona fide* medical purposes it shall not be necessary to produce a written permission signed by the Collector of the district to which a transport is applied for."

2. In further exercise of the said powers the Governor in Council is pleased, with the like sanc-

tion to direct that the following conditions of the license in the Form A referred to in Rule 6 (a) of the said rules as amended by the Notifications mentioned in the margin shall be modified as follows,

viz. :—

The following should be substituted for condition 9 of the said license :—

“9. That if he wishes to take or send any such preparation as aforesaid in quantity exceeding 10 tolas from any place other than the City of Bombay to another district or to the City of Bombay, he shall, when applying to the proper authority for a permit to cover the transport thereof, produce a written permission from the proper authority of the place to which the same is to be transported.”

In condition 10 after the words ‘wishes to export’ there shall be inserted the following, viz. :—

‘from any place other than the City of Bombay’; and the words ‘(4 ozs.)’ occurring after ‘10 tolas’ shall be omitted.

In conditions 6, 7 and 8 the words ‘(4 ozs.)’ occurring after ‘10 tolas’ shall be omitted.

No. 5427-S. R.—In exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 49 (b), 134, and 111 of the Sea Customs Act (VIII of 1878), the Governor General in Council is pleased to direct that the ports of Goa and Daman in Portuguese India shall be added to the list published in the Notifi-

cation of the Department of Revenue, Agriculture and Commerce No. 77,* dated the 7th May 1879, of foreign ports in India in respect of which the payment of drawback upon the re-exportation of goods, the transhipment of goods liable to Customs duties on importation, and the shipment for exportation of warehoused goods have been prohibited.

MARINE DEPARTMENT.

No. 104.—The following Notice to Mariners issued by Her Majesty's Colonial Government, Ceylon, on the 16th October 1895, is published for general information:—

“Notice is hereby given that a screw pile will shortly be placed at the point of intersection of the lines of the N.E. and N.W. breakwaters, about to be constructed, for the purpose of setting out the work. When the pile is placed in position a white light showing all round will be exhibited from the top of it at an elevation of 30 feet above the sea for the present; but later on a green light showing all round will be substituted for the white light.

The position of the pile will be as follows:—

Red light on end of S.W. breakwater bearing S. 33° 30' W., distant 3,200 feet.”

No. 105.—The following Notice to Mariners is published for general information:—

“INDIA—WEST COAST—KARÁCHI HARBOUR.

Lighting of Channel Buoys at Night.

Information has been received from the Port Officer, Karáchi, dated 4th instant, that on or about the 1st of January 1896, the channel buoys in the Port of Karáchi will be lighted at night with the Cera Wax Company's patent lamps to enable vessels to enter or leave the port.

The starboard hand buoys will show red lights: the port hand green.”

No. 103.—The following Bye-laws made by the Trustees of the Port of Aden under the provisions of Section 52, sub-section 2 (a), of the Aden Port Trust Act, 1888 (Act V of 1888), have received the approval of Government as required by Section 54 of that Act:—

1. A staff of six Pilots will ordinarily be maintained in the grades and with the monthly remuneration stated below:

One Pilot in the First Grade (to be called the Senior Pilot) on Rs. 350.

Two Pilots in the Second Grade on Rs. 200, rising by annual increments of Rs. 10 to Rs. 250.

Three Pilots in the Third Grade on Rs. 150, rising by annual increments to Rs. 200.

2. The Senior Pilot will be selected by the Board on the occurrence of a vacancy in the First Grade from among the Pilots of the Second and Third Grades.

3. Promotion from the Third to the Second Grade will ordinarily be by seniority, but the Board may, for sufficient reason, select a Pilot other than the Senior Pilot of the Third Grade for promotion to the Second:

Provided that no Pilot shall be promoted from the Third to the Second Grade till he has earned the maximum pay of the Third Grade.

4. In addition to the monthly remuneration specified above, the Pilots will receive fees for the following services: for bringing vessels into the Inner Harbour by day or by night, and for taking vessels out of the Inner Harbour by night, but not for taking vessels out of the Inner Harbour by day, or for service rendered in the Outer Harbour, whether by day or by night.

5. The fees payable to Pilots under Bye-law No. 4 will be according to the following scale:—

Tonnage of Vessel.	For bringing a vessel into the Inner Harbour by day.	For bringing a vessel into, or taking a vessel out of, the Inner Harbour by night.
	Rs.	Rs.
Not exceeding 1,000 tons ...	5	10
Exceeding 1,000 but not exceeding 2,000 tons... ..	7½	15
Exceeding 2,000 tons ...	10	20

6. A fee for night service shall be deemed to be due only when a vessel is brought or taken past the Light Vessel between sunset and sunrise.

7. The amount of fees earned by a Pilot will not be remuneration which he is entitled to have taken into account in fixing his pension or any leave allowance or acting allowance.

8. One Pilot of those in the Second and Third Grades will always be present on the Light Vessel ready for service, and will remain on it for twenty-four hours, unless he has in the meantime to proceed on service with a vessel, in which case he shall be relieved forthwith by the next of the Pilots of those grades who is on the roster of service drawn up to prescribe the order in which Pilots of those grades shall go on board the Light Vessel on duty.

9. The Senior Pilot will ordinarily serve only the vessels of the Peninsular and Oriental Steam Navigation Company, but will also serve other vessels, when not required for a vessel of that Company, if all the Pilots of the Second and Third Grades are employed on service. In case the Senior Pilot is so employed, any Second or Third Pilot who is relieved from service in the meantime will do service with any vessel of the Peninsular and Oriental Steam Navigation Company requiring a Pilot.
