Sir,—In order to enable me to furnish information of Public Works Expenditure by Civil Officers as required by the Comptroller General, Calcutta, I have the honour to request that you will be so good as to furnish it in the accompanying form for the year 1894-95. The figures

should be for the whole year and not by months, the totals being agreed with the 12-monthly totals of your Local Fund cash accounts.

2. A similar statement giving the figures in the above form should also be furnished up to the end of November 1895. The abstract of Public Works Expenditure by Civil agency should, in future, be prepared in accordance with the new classification now prescribed, commencing with the accounts for December 1895.

3. With the abstract for March each year, a memorandum showing the total amounts of contributions credited to Local Funds during year, on account of Works or Repairs falling (1) Civil Buildings, (2) Roads and other of Communication, and (3) Miscellaneous Public Improvements, should be furnished.
