No. 1008.—In accordance with Rule 8 of the Notification by the Government of India in the Department of Finance and Commerce, No. 2748, dated 17th August 1883, republished in the Bombay Government Gazette of the 23rd idem (Part I., page 610) under No. 3091, dated the 22nd idem, Financial Department, His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to publish the following application from the Municipal Commissioner for the City of Bombay on behalf of the Municipal Corporation of Bombay for permission to raise a Loan of Rs. 17,00,000 in the market under the provisions of the Local Authorities Loan Act, XI. of 1879:—

SIR,—With reference to Government Resolution No. 561, dated the 15th ultimo, General Department, I have the honour to request, on behalf of the Municipal Corporation of Bombay under Act XI. of

1879, the favour of the sanction of Government to the raising of a Loan of 17 lákhs from the Public, being a portion of the estimated cost of Tánsa Water Works, viz. Rs. 1,23,00,000. A statement of particulars pursuant to Rule 5 of the rules relating to loans so raised is sent herewith.

Statement showing particulars pursuant to Rule 5 of the Rules published by the Government of India for the raising of Loans by Local authorities.

- I. The loan is required for the construction of a lake in the Tansa Valley, and other works incidental to bringing the water from the said lake into Bombay. The estimate of the cost of the said works is Rs. 1,23,00,000.
 - II. The amount which it is at present proposed to borrow is the sum of Rs. 17 lákhs.
- III. It is proposed to borrow the said sum on the security of the general revenue of the Bombay Municipality, aggregating nearly 43\ lakes, as per supplemental Statement A. hereto annexed.
- IV. The laws under which funds, duties, taxes, rates, cesses, &c., are levied, received, or held, are Act IV. of 1857 and Bombay Acts VI. of 1863, III. of 1872 and IV. of 1878, V. of 1878, and VI. of 1882.
- V. The loan is required for such period or respective periods as may be agreed upon, not exceeding 60 years from the completion of the work, say from the end of the year 1892. It is proposed to raise the loan by instalments from time to time of such amounts respectively as will suffice for the prosecution of the works up to the monsoon of 1887. Interest will be paid half-yearly, and on completion of the works as aforesaid provision will be made for annually setting aside such equal sums as after payment of interest will suffice for the liquidation of the whole debt in the period or respective periods agreed on as aforesaid, either by the creation of a sinking fund or by the redemption from time to time of portions of the debt as opportunity may offer.
- VI. The yearly proceeds of each separate source of income are shown in the supplemental Statements A. and B. hereto annexed. Application has already been made for the fresh legislation necessary to increase the present revenue from Town Duties by Rs. 1,20,000 and a further revenue of Rs. 2,30,000 is anticipated as soon as the Tánsa Works are completed.
- VII. All expenditure incurred by the Bombay Municipality in each of the three last preceding years 1882, 1883-84, and 1884-85 is shown in supplemental Statement C. hereto annexed.
- VIII. All existing prior charges upon the funds of the Municipality are shown in supplemental Statement D. hereto annexed, from which it will be observed that the annual liabilities in respect of previous loans will be diminished by Rs. 31,000 from the year 1888.

THE SECRETARY TO GOVERNMENT, FINANCIAL DEPARTMENT, BOMBAY.

SIR,—We, the undersigned Commissioners of the Town Municipality of Rajapur in the Ratnagiri District, have the honour to apply to Government, under the provisions of the Public Works Loan Act (XI. of 1879), for permission to borrow from Mr. Bhaskar Vishnu Fadke a loan, and in respect to it to state the following details in conformity to the rules made by the Government of India under Section 4 of the said Act:—

- (1) The loan is required for the laying of a 5" iron main over half the distance from the Kodawli dam to the Town. The estimate of the cost of this work prepared by the Executive Engineer, Ratnágiri, accompanies.
- (2) It is proposed to borrow a loan of Rs. 12,000.
- (3) The Municipal revenues of the Town are offered as security for the repayment of the loan.

- (4) The said revenues, which are made up by rates and taxes, are levied under the Bombay Municipal Act VI. of 1873.
- (5) It is proposed to repay the loan by 12 half-yearly instalments of Rs. 1,205-8-9 each, including interest at the rate of 6 per cent. per annum payable on 30th June and 31st December each year, so that the loan shall be paid off with interest in 6 years. This is to be carried out when the old loan borrowed by the Municipality of Mr. Fadke is cleared off, until then only interest on the loan is to be paid yearly.
- (6) A statement showing the yearly Municipal revenues of the Town of Rájápur is appended.
- (7) A statement showing all the receipts and expenditure in each of the three last preceding years is also appended.
- (8) The Rajapur Town Municipality have to repay a portion of a loan already borrowed by them of Mr. Fadke in eight half-yearly instalments, the first to be paid at the end of next December and the last at that of the month of June 1889, all amounting together to Rs. 11,754-3-2. Each instalment is of Rs. 1,468-11-0 except the last, which is of Rs. 1,473-6-2.

REPORT ON THE MAYO PRIZES FOR ART WORKMANSHIP AWARDED IN 1886.

Inlaid Work.

A prize of Rupees 180 and a silver medal for the best specimen of inlaid work.

For this competition the following specimens were received:

- 12 specimens of koft-gari (silver and gold damascened in iron or steel) from Fate Din Rahim Bux of Sialkote.
- 6 specimens from Buddha Mistri of Sialkote.
- 8 specimens from Nur Din Mistri of Sialkote.
- 41 specimens from Háji Muhammad of Sialkote.

One specimen from Guláb Din of Sialkote.

One large lota and plate of copper inlaid with silver from Káshirám Pándia of Tanjore.

One table inlaid with different coloured woods, ivory and mother of pearl from J. D'Esperance of Bhuj.

The prize was awarded to Haji Muhammad of Sialkote for a plate (No. 2) damascened in gold on iron or steel, the design and workmanship of which are excellent.

The article described as a lota, in the form of a coffee pot, by Haji Muhammad; a plate and a box by Buddha Mistri; and two plates (Nos. 3 and 4) by Nur Din were considered worthy of commendation.

The large copper lota encrusted with silver is effective, but not a very good specimen of Tanjore work. There is a monotonous repetition in the figures, and in this respect it differs from the old work which is characterized by greater originality and variety in detail.

As a specimen of workmanship the inlaying in the table from Bhuj is excellent, but the design, both of the table and of the ornament, is decidedly bad.

Although it is considered worth while to send for the competition koftwork from Sialkote, and silver incrusted on copper from Tanjore, it is disappointing to find that no specimens are sent of Bombay inlaid work; of Hushiarpur work (ivory and brass inlaid in wood); of the brass wire inlaying in wood of Mainpuri, and of Bidri work.

Embroidery.

A prize of Rupees 180 and a silver medal for the best specimen of embroidery.

For this competition the following limited number of specimens was received:

- 3 caps, 1 handkerchief, and 6 cushions fron. Mochi Valji Liladhar of Bhuj.
- 1 cushions and 1 cap from Ramji Purshotam of Bhuj.

- 1 kudti and 1 bodicecloth (angia) from Hurbai, mother of Nur Muhammad Khamisa of Bhuj...
- 1 jacket and two caps from Allibhoy Tajbhoy of Surat.

The prize was awarded to Hurbai, mother of Nur Muhammad Khamisa of Bhuj, for a native dress (kudti) of red silk embroidered with native dyed silk thread. Small pieces of looking glass (shishadar) are very effectively introduced in the design. The specimen is excellent in design, colour, and workmanship.

As the subject of the education and employment of native women forms one of the public questions of the day, it is interesting to note that this prize should be carried off by a woman.

A cap in gold thread embroidery on cloth (háth jari ká kám) and a jacket and cap embroidered on velvet in gold and silver thread and spangles (jigchalk ká kám) from Allibhoy Jajbhoy of Surat, are highly commended.

Specimens of silk embroidery from Bhuj, although well worked, are marred by the use of aniline dyes, and by an attempt at too realistic treatment in the designs.

SIR,

I have the honor to forward for your use 25 copies of a table for the calculation of Income Tax due upon salaries and allowances disbursed from your Treasury. From it the amount due upon any sum is easily arrived at, e.g., for Rs. 2,573, at 5 pies in the rupee:—

I would request your special attention to the Act (No. II. of 1886) and to Government of India Notification No. 593, dated 5th February 1886, as well as to Government of India letter No. 595 of the same date. Both of these have been published in the Government Gazette of February 11th, pages 112 and 119, and the instructions are so clearly given in these papers that little further explanation seems necessary.

Deductions made by you from payments due by Government need not be credited in your accounts. The payments should be shown net and the book adjustments will be made in this office.

The Treasury Cash Account form for the coming year has been revised and copies may be obtained on indent from the Government Central Press. Forms Nos. 4, 5, 19, 20 and 20A of the Civil Account Code will be altered so as to show deductions made on account of the tax; but until your present stock of these forms is exhausted, manuscript entries should be made for this purpose showing clearly the amount deducted for each individual.

The allowance of exemption on fund deductions will not cause any difficulty. In a few cases the amount of payment to an Assurance Company may exceed the of the payment from which it is deducted: in that case it will be necessary for you to refer to previous payments to ensure that on the whole the proportion is not in excess.

You will notice that the definition of 'salary' in the Act is more comprehensive than in the Financial Codes. Local allowances are subject to the tax.

Receipts realised otherwise than by deduction from payments made by you should be credited in your cash account against one or other of the two heads—"Ordinary Collections" and "Penalties" subordinate to "VIII Assessed Taxes."

A schedule in the annexed form showing the particulars of the amount credited to Ordinary collections should be furnished with the Monthly Cash Account.
