## PART I.

### Government Notifications, Appointments, &c.

#### NOTIFICATIONS.

##### PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT.

*Bombay Castle, 26th June 1886.*

No. 53.—The following rules to regulate the management of the Esplanade having been approved and sanctioned by Government, are published for general information :—

The area included in "the Esplanade," to which they apply, consists of three parts, viz. :—

- The "Esplanade proper";
- The "Cotton Green"; and
- The "Kennedy Sea Face."

The "Esplanade proper" comprises the portion of ground (exclusive of the public roads) bounded on the east by Rampart Row from St.

Andrew's Church to the Prince of Wales' Statue, the Esplanade Road from the Prince of Wales' Statue to the Frere Fountain and Hornby Road from the Frere Fountain to the Arthur Crawford Markets; on the west by the Queen's Road from its junction with Wodehouse Road to the First Marine Street; on the south by Wodehouse Road; and on the north by the Carnac Road, part of the Esplanade Road, Marine Hospital Lane and 1st Marine Street.

The "Cotton Green" is that portion of ground bounded on the east by the Colába Causeway, on the west by the B. B. and C. I. Railway, on the north by the Wodehouse Road, and on the south by the Colába Land and Mill Company's ground.

The "Kennedy Sea Face" is bounded on the east by the Queen's Road from Wodehouse Road; to the Railway Level Crossing at Chaupáti; on

the west by the sea shore from the Wodehouse Bridge to the Railway Level Crossing at Chaupáti; on the north by an iron fence near the Railway Level Crossing at Chaupáti, and on the south by an iron fence near the Wodehouse Bridge.

#### Esplanade Rules.

1. Cattle will be allowed to graze on such portions of the Esplanade as the Executive Engineer shall from time to time determine, but subject to the following rules:—

- (a) Except with the special permission of the Executive Engineer, no cattle shall graze on the rides.
- (b) No cattle shall graze on the Esplanade between the hours of 4 P.M. and midnight.
- (c) Before any cattle shall graze on the Esplanade, the owner thereof shall pay a grazing fee for the same according to the scale fixed in the schedule hereto, and shall obtain from the Executive Engineer a ticket for each head of cattle.
- (d) For each ticket annas two shall be deposited with the Executive Engineer as security for the due return of the ticket, and, at the expiration of the time for which each ticket is granted, the ticket shall be immediately returned to the Executive Engineer.
- (e) Each head of cattle shall, at all times whilst on the Esplanade, wear the ticket so granted for it safely fastened round its neck.
- (f) Every head of cattle shall at all times whilst on the Esplanade be under the immediate charge of a responsible keeper on behalf of the owner, who shall remain with and look after such cattle.
- (g) Owners of cattle will be responsible for and make good any damage their cattle may do to Government property, the amount of such damage to be fixed by the Executive Engineer.

2. In case of breach of rules (a), (b), (c) and (f) or either of them, the cattle shall be deemed to be trespassing, and shall be impounded and dealt with according to the provisions of the Police Act (Act XLVIII. of 1860).

3. If any cattle are found straying or grazing on the Esplanade, and the owner thereof has not complied with the above rules, the owner will be charged double the daily fees from the commencement of the month in which such cattle are found, or at the option of the Executive Engineer such cattle shall be impounded and dealt with as trespassing in accordance with the provisions of the said Police Act.

4. No tents shall be pitched, or excavation of any kind made on the Esplanade without the permission of the Executive Engineer.

5. No portion of the Esplanade ground shall be used for any purpose whatsoever, temporary or permanent, nor any stalls or shops be placed thereon, without the permission of the Executive Engineer.

6. No nuisance of any kind shall be committed on the Esplanade.

7. Persons found obstructing the officers and peons of the Executive Engineer in the performance of their duties will be prosecuted.

8. Washing and ablutions will be allowed only at such wells as may from time to time be set apart for that purpose by the Executive Engineer.

9. No person shall remove turf from the Esplanade grounds, or from any other property of Government on the Esplanade, except with the permission of the Executive Engineer. Persons found violating this rule will be prosecuted.

10. No vehicles shall be driven or taken off the roadway on any part of the Esplanade.

11. The Rides will be closed at such times as the Executive Engineer may consider necessary.

12. Horses, ponies, dogs, and children's perambulators will not be permitted to enter the gardens in charge of the Executive Engineer.

## REVENUE DEPARTMENT.

*Bombay Castle, 18th June 1886.*

No. 4352A.—The following draft rules under Section 31 and draft notification under Section 29 of the Indian Forest Act, No. VII. of 1878, are published for general information. Persons who have any objection to urge to the draft rules and notification are required to forward their objections in writing to the Secretary to Government, Revenue Department, before the noon of 20th August 1886:—

*Draft No. 1.*

The following rules, made by the Governor in Council under Section 31 of the Indian Forest Act, 1878, to regulate the management of the Protected Forest in the village of Sámrad in the Akola Táluka of the district of Ahmednagar are published, with the previous sanction of the Governor General in Council, for general information:

1. Lands of either of the two following descriptions may be cleared or broken up for cultivation in the said forest subject to the conditions, if any, respectively applicable thereto, viz.:

- (a) land the right to cultivate which has been recorded in an enquiry under Section 23 of the Forest Act, or
- (b) land let for cultivation under a lease which is at the time in force and has been granted under these rules.

2. The unoccupied land in the said forest suitable for cultivation having been divided off by the Survey Department, under the orders of Government, into fields which bear distinctive numbers and having been measured and assessed by the said Department at a moderate rent, any of the said fields (hereinafter called "numbers") may be let at the rent so assessed to any person who is, and has been for not less than five years previously, a resident of the said village, subject to the conditions contained in these rules.

3. The lease of a number may be sold by public auction or granted, at the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer, with or without payment of a premium.

4. Every lease granted under these rules shall be in the form A. hereto annexed and shall be executed by the Divisional Forest Officer, if he is competent under the rules in force in this behalf to execute such an instrument, or otherwise by the Conservator.

No such lease shall be granted until the intending lessee has executed a counterpart agreement in the form B. hereto annexed, bearing an endorsement of the tenor prescribed in the said form signed by the village officers.

5. In the first year in which these rules are in force leases shall be granted for a term of thirty years. Leases granted after the said first year shall be for terms which will expire simultaneously with the terms of the first year's leases.

6. The rent due annually in respect of lands leased under these rules shall be payable in two equal instalments on the 10th December and 10th January respectively.

7. On the expiry of the term of any lease granted under these rules the lessee shall be entitled to a renewed lease for such term and subject to such conditions and the payment of such rent as Government shall think fit to prescribe.

8. Every lease granted or renewed under these rules may at any time be cancelled by the Divisional Forest Officer or the Conservator of Forests:

- (a) if the lessee or any co-sharer of the land held by the lessee is convicted of any offence under Section 32 of the Forest Act and such conviction is not subsequently reversed or quashed; or
- (b) if the land included in the lease or any portion of it is subjected, without the previous sanction of the Divisional Forest Officer or of the Conservator of Forests, to any mortgage, charge, sub-lease or alienation; or
- (c) if the land included in the lease or any portion of it is subjected to *dalhi* cultivation; or
- (d) if any instalment of rent due in respect of the land is not paid or recovered, under Section 81 of the Forest Act, before the close of the revenue year in which it is payable; or
- (e) if the lessee ceases to be a resident of the said village.

When a lease is cancelled under this rule, it shall be deemed for the purposes of Rule 1 to cease to be in force from such date as shall be fixed in this behalf by the officer cancelling the same.

9. An appeal shall lie from any order made by the Divisional Forest Officer under the last preceding rule to the Conservator of Forests. The order of the Conservator of Forests shall be final.

10. No lease granted under these rules shall be deemed to confer upon the lessee any right in or over the trees or other forest produce of the land included in such lease; but, subject to a reservation of the right of Government at any time to re-consider and amend or cancel such concession and to the provision of Rule 11, the Governor in Council directs that the lessee of any land of which a lease is granted or renewed under these rules shall be permitted upon or from the said land:

- (a) to lop trees, not being trees which are reserved under Section 29 of the Forest Act, for the purpose of obtaining *ráb* for manure;
- (b) with the written authority of the Divisional Forest Officer to cut and remove trees, not being trees reserved as aforesaid and not exceeding 15 inches in circumference at the base, which in the opinion of the said officer impede cultivation;
- (c) to pasture and to cut and remove grass for his own cattle, sheep and goats;
- (d) to gather and remove edible fruits and roots:

- (e) to gather and remove dead wood for fuel;  
 (f) to quarry or gather and remove stones for his own use for any agricultural or domestic purpose.

11. Lessees exercising the privilege of lopping trees for obtaining *ráb* conceded by clause (a) of the last preceding rule, shall leave uncut a main leading shoot (*shendá*) of each tree which they so lop.

12. Any person permanently residing in the said village may, in any unoccupied number of the protected forest in the village, pasture, or cut and remove grass for his own cattle, sheep and goats without license or payment of any fee.

The Governor in Council reserves the right at any time to reconsider and amend or cancel this concession.

13. Except as provided in Rule 10 and in the last preceding rule, no cattle, sheep or goats may be pastured and no grass may be cut in the said protected forest without written authority from the Divisional Forest Officer.

#### Draft No. 2.

In exercise of the power conferred by Section 29 of the Indian Forest Act, 1878, the Governor in Council is pleased to prohibit, in the Protected Forest in the village of Sámrad, from the day of \_\_\_\_\_ 188\_\_\_\_ :

- (a) the breaking up or clearing for cultivation, for building, for herding cattle or for any other purpose, of any land in such forest except in accordance with the rules prescribed in that behalf under Section 31 of the said Act in the foregoing draft;
- (b) the quarrying of stone, the burning of lime or charcoal and the collection or the subjection to any manufacturing process or the removal of any forest-produce, except in accordance with the rules aforesaid and with the proviso to this notification :

Provided that, until further orders, any person permanently residing in the said village may, in any unoccupied number in the protected forest of the village:

- (c) gather and remove edible fruits and roots;  
 (d) gather and remove dead wood for fuel;  
 (e) quarry or gather and remove stones for his own use for any agricultural or domestic purpose.

And in further exercise of the power conferred by the said section the Governor in Council is pleased to declare all mango, hirda, and jámbul trees and bámBUS in the protected forest in the said village to be reserved from the said date.

No. 4526.—The Governor in Council is hereby pleased to cancel, with effect from the 1st August 1886, so much of Notification No. 2553, dated 25th March 1885, published at page 429 of the *Bombay Government Gazette* for the 26th March 1885, Part I., as prohibits the sale by retail, in the City of Bombay, at one time and to one and the same person in the aggregate on any one day, of country liquor other than toddy in quantity exceeding one Imperial gallon.
