Notice to Mariners.

No. 71.—With reference to Notification No. 46, dated 8th June 1886, intimating the intended

alteration of the position of a bell buoy at the entrance to the Bhávnagar creek in the Gulf of Cambay, it is hereby notified for general information that the buoy has been placed on the three fathom line near the southern end of the Rukh bank at a distance of one and three quarter miles from the Bhavnagar Light-house and on the magnetic bearing from the Light-house of S. 63° 30' E.

No. 72.—Under the provisions of Section 43 of the Bombay Port Trust Act, 1879, item "24, Bagatelle Tables," in the Dock Table of Rates, and item "25, Bagatelle Tables," in the Table of Wharfage Fees chargeable at Bandars, are struck out of these lists, and Bagatelle Tables will hereafter be charged as "Unenumerated Goods."

PUBLIC ORDERS TO REGULATE THE RELIGIOUS PROCESSIONS of the MOHURRUM, and for the PRESERVATION of the PUBLIC PEACE during the Festival, sanctioned by the Right Honourable the Governor in Council under the provisions of Section 77 of Act No. XIII. of 1856.

1st.—Every person desirous of erecting or carrying about a *Taboot*, *Punja*, or *Dholeeka Punja*, at the ensuing Mohurram, must obtain a License from the Commissioner of Police. Such Licenses will be granted to Mahomedans only, and all persons obtaining them are hereby required to produce them when demanded by any Magistrate or Officer of Police.

2nd.—Every such License-holder will be held responsible for the peaceable behaviour of the persons composing any assemblage or procession connected with his *Taboot*, *Punja*, or *Dholeeka Punja*, and in the event of any such persons being guilty of any riotous or disorderly conduct in any such assemblage or procession, the Commissioner of Police may, should he see fit, at once withdraw such License, disperse such assembly or procession, and positively prohibit and prevent any re-assemblage thereof, or any carrying about of the *Taboot*, *Punja*, or *Dholeeka Punja*, belonging thereto.

3rd.—No music will be allowed in any of the streets or thoroughfares of Bombay, except under the authority of a License issued by the Commissioner of Police.

4th.—No Procession accompanied by country music will be permitted to parade any of the streets or thoroughfares until the commencement of the 5th day of the Festival.

5th.—The use of country music in the streets on the 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th, and 10th of the Mohurram will be permitted under license as above stated.

6th.—No *Taboots* will be allowed to go in procession on the last night of the Mohurram before 12 o'clock, or to continue so after 3 o'clock on the following morning, nor on the last day before 1 o'clock; and it is directed that the ceremony be concluded by sunset.

7th.—*Taboots* will not be permitted to go abreast on the public road, and on meeting are to give way, each keeping to the left. On meeting carriages and horsemen, persons accompanying the *Taboots* are strictly enjoined to cease playing country music, the *Taboots* keeping to their left side of the road.

8th.—No Procession of the *Zool-Junnah*, or Horse, through the public streets or roads will be permitted.

9th.—All dealers in Spirituous Liquor, and all Vendors of Opium, Muddut, Chundool, Ganja, and Bhang are hereby ordered to keep their shops closed; persons found selling anything of an intoxicating nature during the last three days of the Festival will be taken into custody.

10th.—Any person carrying a sword, dirk, bludgeon, or other offensive weapon, will be taken into custody.

11th.—Any persons violating the above rules, or behaving in any manner likely to create a breach of the peace, or making a disturbance of any kind, will be immediately taken into custody and dealt with according to Law.

اول—آنکه هرکس که در اين ماه محرم خواهد
که بناے تابوت يا پنجه يا پنجه دولا بگذارد يا در
شوارع بگذراند بايد که از کمشنر صاحب پوليس
پروانه بگيرد و آن پروانجات فقط بمسلمانان
داده خواهند شد و همه کسانیکه آن پروانجات
داده شوند لازم است که بر طلب هر ماجستيريت
يا عملدار پوليس آنها را بنمایند:.

دويم—آنکه هرکس چنين پروانه گرفته
است ضامن حرکات کسانی است که در حين
جمعيت يا گردش متعلق بتابوت و پنجه و پنجه
دولانی او هستند و اگر احياناً از يکے از اشخاص
مزبوره فسادى يا حرکت خلاف قاعده در حين
جمعيت يا گردش تابوت سر بزند کمشنر صاحب
پوليس مامور است که اگر مصلحت بداند فوراً
پروانه را گرفته جمعيت يا گردش ایشانرا متفرق
سازد و بعد از آن به هيچ وجه نگذارد که دوباره
جمعيت يا گردش کنند يا اينکه تابوتى يا پنجه
يا پنجه دولا بگردانند:.

سیوم—آنکہ بدون پروانہ کمشنر صاحب پولیس از کد امین شوارع یا گذرگاہ بمبئی بر ہیچ یک شوارع یا گذرگاہ نواختن ساز و سرود را اجازت نخواہند داد .:

چہارم—آنکہ تاصبح پنجم محرم ہیچ جمعیتی را برائے گشتن با ساز و سرود ملکی در کد امین کوچہا و شوارع اجازت نخواہند داد .:

پنجم—آنکہ در روز پنجم و ششم و ہفتم و ہشتم و نہم و دہم محرم از روی پروانہ مذکورۃ الصدر استعمال ساز و سرود ملکی را در شوارع اجازت خواہند داد .:

ششم—آنکہ بشب دہم ماہ محرم قبل از ساعت دوازده و بعد از ساعت سہ تابوتہارا ہیچ نگراندن و بروز عاشورا یعنی دہم قبل از ساعت یک نگراندن و حکم است کہ تا غروب آفتاب از جمیع شرایط آن فارغ شوند .:

ہفتم—آنکہ ہیچ تابوت را بشارع عام نزدیک و بہ پہلوے یکدیگر نخواہند گذاشت و بر مقابل شدن باین کہ ہر یک بدست چپ شدہ بروند بایکدیگر را راہ بدہند و در وقت باہم مقابل شدن گاڑی و سوارہ مردمان ہمراہی تابوت را مکرر تاکید دادہ میشود کہ سرود ملکی را موقوف نمودہ تابوتہائے خود را بدست چپ شارع خویش داشته بروند .:

ہشتم—آنکہ گردانیدن ذوالجناح در شارع عام یا راستہ ہاے وسیع نخواہند گذاشت .:

دہم—آنکہ نزد کسی گہر شمشیر یا خنجر یا چوب و یا از ہر قسم اسلحہ کاری باشد اورا گرفتار خواہند نمود .:

یازدہم—آنکہ کسانیکہ خلاف آئین مرقومۃ الصدر رفتار نمایند یا کارے بکنند کہ در امنیت خلل شود یا رفتاری کہ متضمن فتنہ و فساد بودہ باشد از ہر طریق بکنند انہارا فوراً گرفتار نمودہ بموجب قانون معمول خواہند داشت .:

احکام مقرر فرمائے ہیں:-

پہلا—بہر کہ جو کوئی چاہے کہ اس آتے
محرم میں تابوت بناوے یا پنچہ یا پنچتہ
دولا رکھے یا عام رستے پر لیجاوے تو
آسکولازم ہے کہ پولیس کے کمشنر صاحب
سے پروانہ لیوے اور وے پروانے فقط
مسلمانوں کو دیتے جائینگے اور جن شخصوں
کو پروانے ملیں انکو چاہئے کہ جسوقت
کوئی ماجسٹریٹ یا پولیس کا عملدار طلب
کرے تو وے پروانے انکو دکھلانا .:

دوسرا—یہر کہ اوپر لکھے ہوئے قسم کا پروانہ لینے والے کے تابوت کے یا پنچہ کے یا پنچہ دولا کے باعث جو جماعت اکتھی ہوئے یا اکتھے ہو کر چلے آس جماعت کے آدمیوں میں سے کچھ فتنہ و فساد نہوئے اسباتکی جو اب دھی اس پروانے والے پر ہی اور اوپر لکھے ہوئے موجب جماعت اکتھی ہوئے یا اکتھے ہو کر چلے تب انہیں سے کوئی آدھی ہنگامہ یا فساد کرے اور پولیس کے کمشنر صاحب کے نظر میں برابر آوے تو اوپر لکھے ہوئے قسم کا پروانہ ایک دم پیچھے لینے کا اور وہ جماعت اکتھی ہوئی ہو یا اکتھی ہو کر چلتی ہو اس کو متفرق کر نیکا اور اس جماعت کو پھر کر اکتھی ہونیکی بالکل منہای کر نیکا اور وہ جماعت پھر ہرگز اکتھی ہوئے نہ دینے کا یا انکا تابوت یا پنچہ یا پنچہ دولا پھر انکو منع کر نیکا یا ہرگز پھرنے نہیں دینیکا اختیار صاحب موصوف کو ہی .:

تیسرا—یہر کہ پولیس کمشنر صاحب کے پروانے بغیر بمبئی کے کونسے بھی رستوں میں سے یا گذرگاہ کے ٹھکانوں میں سے کونسے بھی رستے میں یا گذرگاہ کے ٹھکانے میں کوئی قسم کا باجا بجانے نہیں دینگے .:

چوتھا—یہر کہ عاشوریکے پانچویں دن کے فجر تک کونسے بھی رستے میں یا گذرگاہ کے ٹھکانے کوئی بھی جماعت کو ملکی باجا بجاتے ہوئے جانے نہیں دینگے .:

پانچواں—یہر کہ محرم کی پانچویں اور چھٹی اور ساتویں اور آٹھویں اور نویں اور دسویں تاریخ کو اوپر ذکر کئے ہوئے موجب پروانے پر سے رستے میں ملکی باجے بجانے نہیں دینگے .:

چھٹا—یہر کہ عاشورے کی رات کو بارہ بجے کے آگے یا تین بجے کے پیچھے یا عاشورے کے دن ایک بجے کے آگے کسی تابوت کو پھرانے نہیں دینگے اور حکم ہی کہ آفتاب غروب ہونے تک سب شرایط سے فارغ ہو جاویں .:

ساتواں—یہر کہ عام رستے پر کوئی تابوت دوسرے تابوت کے نزدیک اور پہلو میں چلنے نہیں دینگے اور اگر کوئی تابوت سامنے آ جاوے تو چاہئے کہ ہر ایک بائین ہاتھ پر ہو کر چلیں اور ایک دوسرے کو رستہ دیوین اور اگر کوئی گاری یا سوار سامنے نکل آوے تو جو آدمی کہ تابوت کے ساتھ ہیں انکو تائیداً ظاہر کیا جاتا ہے کہ اسوقت ملکی باجا بند کر کر اپنے تابوتوں کو رستے کے اپنے بائیں بازو پر لیویں .:

آٹھواں—یہر کہ ذوالجناح کو برے یا عام رستے پر پھرنے نہ دیا جاوے .:

نواں—یہر کہ تمام شراب بیچنے والے اور آفیوں اور مدت اور چند اور گانچہ اور بھنگ بیچنے والوں کو حکم ہی کے اپنی دکانیں بند رکھیں اور جو کوئی کہ عاشورے کے آخری تین دن میں کونسی بھی نشے کی چیز بیچے گا تو وہ قید کیا جاوے .:

دسواں—یہر کہ جس شخص کے پاس تلوار یا خنجر یا سونتر یا کسی قسم کا ہتھیار کاری ہوگا تو وہ قید کیا جاوے .:

گیارہواں—یہر کہ جو اشخاص اوپر لکھے ہوئے قاعدوں کے برخلاف کرینگے یا امنیت میں خلل ہوا پس کچھ رفتار کرینگے یا کسی طرح کا فتنہ یا فساد آٹھانگے تو تڑت انکو گرفتار کر کے قاعدے کے موافق عمل کیا جاوے .:

जाहिरनामा.

ऐसाजे.—मोहरमचे दिवसांत ताबूत बाहेर फिरावयास काढितात त्यांचा वंदोवस्त ठेवण्याविषयी व लोकांस हल्लाहरकत न होई अशी तजवीज ठेवण्याविषयी, सन १८५६ च्या १३ व्या आक्टाच्या ७७ व्या कलमांतील ठरावांभन्वये बंदेगान आलीनवाब मुस्तताब हजरत राइट आनरबल गव्हर्नर साहेब बहादूर दरइजलास कौन्सिल यांनी हुकूम मंजूर केला आहे तो येणे प्रमाणे:—

१. येते मोहरमचे दिवसांत ताबूत, पंज्या अथवा दुल्याचा पंज्या करावयाची अथवा मिरवीत नेण्याची ज्याची खुशी असेल याणे पोलीस कमिशनर साहेब यांजपासून परवाना घेतला पाहिजे. असे परवाने मुसलमानांस मात्र दिले जातील, व जे लोक परवाने घेतील यांनी कोणताहि माजिस्ट्रेट अथवा पोलीसचा अमलदार याणे ते पहावयास मागितले असतां यास दाखविले पाहिजेत.

२. सदहू प्रकारचे प्रत्येक परवानेवाल्याचे ताबूताचे, पंज्याचे किंवा दुल्याचे पंज्याचे संबंधानें जी मंडळी जमा होईल किंवा जमा होऊन चालेल त्या मंडळींतील मनुष्यांनीं लोकांचे स्वस्थतेचा भंग न होई अशा रीतीनें चालण्याची जबाबदारी त्या परवानेवाल्यावर आहे, आणि सदहूप्रमाणें मंडळी जमा होईल किंवा जमा होऊन चालेल तेव्हां त्यांतील कोणी मनुष्ये गर्दी किंवा धांदल करतील, तर पोलीस कमिशनर साहेबांस योग्य वाटल्यास सदहू प्रकारचा परवाना लागलाच परत घेण्याचा, ती जमलेली मंडळी किंवा जपून चालणारी मंडळी मोडण्याचा आणि ती मंडळी पुनः जमा होण्याची अगदीं मनाई करण्याचा, व ती मंडळी पुनः अगदीं न जमू देण्याचा, अथवा त्यांचा ताबूत, पंज्या किंवा दुल्याचा पंज्या फिरविण्याची अगदीं मनाई करण्याचा व अगदीं न फिरवू देण्याचा अधिकार पोलीस कमिशनर साहेबांस आहे.

३. पोलीस कमिशनर साहेबांचा परवाना असल्याबाजून, मुंबईचे रस्त्यापैकी किंवा रहदारीचे ठिकाणांपैकी कोणतेहि रस्त्यांत किंवा रहदारीचे ठिकाणांत कोणतेहि वाद्य वाजवू देणार नाहीत.

४. ताबूताचे ९ वे दिवसाचे प्रातःकाळपर्यंत कोणतेहि रस्त्यांत किंवा रहदारीचे ठिकाणांत कोणतेहि मंडळीस एतद्देशीय वाद्ये वाजवीत जाऊ देणार नाहीत.

५. मोहरमचे ९ वे, ६ वे, ७ वे, ८ वे, ९ वे व १० वे दिवशीं रस्त्यांत वर सांगितल्याप्रमाणें परवान्यावरून एतद्देशीय वाद्ये वाजवू देण्यांत येतील.

६. कत्तलचे रात्रीस बारावरांपूर्वी किंवा पाहांटेचे तीन वरानंतर, किंवा शेवटचे दिवशीं एक बारापूर्वी ताबूतांस मिरवू देणार नाहीत; आणि सूर्यास्तापूर्वी हे काम सर्व पुरें केलें पाहिजे.

७. सार्वजनिक रस्त्यावर एकेकाचे बरोबर ताबूतांस चालू देणार नाहीत, आणि समोरासमोरे आल्यावर हरएक ताबूतांनें आपली डावी बाजू धरून एकमेकांस रस्ता करावा. गाड्या व घोडेस्वार भेटले असतां ताबूतांबरोबर जे लोक असतील त्यांनीं एतद्देशीय वाद्ये बंद करून आपले ताबूत रस्त्याचे आपले डावे बाजूस न्यावे अशी त्यांस सक्त ताकीद आहे.

८. झुलजना हणजे घोड्याची स्वारी सार्वजनिक रस्त्यावरून मिरवू देणार नाहीत.

९. दारू, अफू, मदत, चंडोल, गांग्या व भांग विकणारे सर्व लोकांनीं आपलीं दुकाने बंद ठेविलीं पाहिजेत; व कैफ्री जिन्स जो कोणी ताबूतांचे शेवटले तीन दिवसांत विकतांना सांपडेल तो कैद केला जाईल.

१०. जीं मनुष्ये तरवार, खंजीर, सोटा किंवा दुसरे काहीं मारक हत्यार आपले बरोबर नेतील तीं मनुष्ये कैद केलीं जातील.

११. सदहू कानू जीं कोणी मनुष्ये मोडतील किंवा लोकांचे स्वस्थतेचा भंग होई अशी कोणतेहि रीतीनें वर्तणूक करतील किंवा कोणतेहि तऱ्हेचा फसाद करतील तर तीं मनुष्ये तेचक्षणीं कैद केलीं जातील व त्यांची कायद्याप्रमाणें तजवीज करण्यांत येईल.

એવું જે—મોહારમના દાહાડામાં તાજુતો બાહાર ફેરવવા કાહાડે છે તેનો બંદોબસ્ત રાખવાબાખત તથા લોકોને હલો હરકત ન થાય તેવી તજવીજ રાખવા સારૂ સને ૧૮૫૬ ના ૧૩ માં આક્ટની ૭૭ મી કલમ પ્રમાણે બંદોગાન આલી નવાવ મુસ્તેતાબ હજરત રાઈટ આનરબલ ગવર્નર સાહેબ બાહાદુર દર ઇબલાસ કૉંસિલે હુકમ મંજૂર ક-યો છે તે હેઠળ લખ્યા પ્રમાણે છે.

૧. આવતા મોહારમના દિવસમાં તાજુતો અથવા પંજા અથવા દુલીના પંજા બનાવવાની તથા બાહાર ફેરવાની જેની પુશી હશે તેને યોલીસ કમિશનર સાહેબ પાસેથી પરવાનો લેવો જોઈશે. એવા પરવાના મુસલમાનને જ માત્ર આપવામાં આવશે. તથા જે લોકો પરવાના લેશે તેઓએ કોઈપણ માજીસ્ટ્રેટ અથવા યોલીસને અમલદાર તેને વાને માગે એટલે તેઓને દેખાડવા જોઈશે.

No. 6341.—In accordance with the provisions of Section 18, sub-section (1), of the Indian Explosives Act, No. IV. of 1884, and the directions contained in the Notification of the Government of India in the Home Department No. 1437, dated 14th August 1885, His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to publish for the information of persons likely to be affected thereby, the following draft of special rules to regulate the conveyance, shipping and discharging of gunpowder and other explosives within the limits of the Port of Karáchi, which His Excellency in Council proposes to prescribe under the Act.

The Draft Rules will be taken into consideration on the expiry of three months from the date of this Notification:—

DRAFT RULES.

1. No vessel having gunpowder or other explosives in excess of 100 lbs. weight on board entering the Port of Karáchi shall proceed farther than the Deep Water Point Moorings until such excess quantity has been discharged and deposited in the Port Department Magazine erected on the spit between the Island of Baba and the Quarantine Buildings or such other place as Government may direct, and no vessel shall take on board such excess quantity within the above limits.

2. When receiving or delivering such gunpowder or other explosives, the master of any vessel is to see that the platform in the vessel's hold, the gangways and combings of the hatchways are covered with tanned hides or other suitable paddings, that the barrels or boxes are carefully stowed and the hatches properly secured and locked, and that the key remains in his own possession.

3. A cushion (stuffed with white oakum) covered with leather is to be used for landing all such powder barrels or cases upon, whether in the hold of the vessel, in the boats, or on the wharf, when landing or discharging powder or other explosives.

4. After the vessel has been discharged, the hides, hair-cloths, &c., are to be removed and the hold carefully cleaned out.

5. Every such vessel as last aforesaid when at anchor at night in the roadstead, or in the track of shipping, is to show a mast-head light, and every such vessel when under weigh at night is to show side-lights, according to the Admiralty Regulations.

6. Barges, lighters, boats and vessels carrying such gunpowder or other explosives, shall not when at anchor lie closer than half a mile from any of the shipping or public landing places.

7. When any vessel has such gunpowder or other explosives on board, a red flag is to be hoisted at the foremast-head, and kept flying until the cargo is discharged. The master and all the crew are to remain on board until the gunpowder or other explosive stores are discharged, unless it be necessary to procure water or provisions, in which case notice is to be given to the Port Officer,

but the vessel is not to be left without an officer on board.

8. Vessels, barges and boats having or taking on board such gunpowder or other explosives, are to be kept scrupulously clean and free from loose gunpowder.

9. In shipping or discharging such gunpowder or other explosives, tanned hides or wadmiltits are to be laid down in that portion of the vessel over which the cases or barrels pass.

10. All boats laden with such gunpowder or other explosives are to remain at anchor off the magazine abovementioned, until orders are received to land the same.

11. Only decked boats with closed-in hatches under lock and key (the latter to remain in charge of the official deputed to superintend the discharge of the gunpowder or other explosives), are to be employed for the conveyance of gunpowder or other explosives, and they are to have a moveable board attached to the bow and stern a foot long with the word "Explosives" painted in white letters on a black ground, and a red flag is to be kept hoisted during the time any such gunpowder or other explosives are on board.

12. The consignee, agent or other person concerned, shall give written notice (twenty-four hours before the expected arrival or intended shipment of any such explosives) to the Port Officer, who shall depute an officer to remain in charge of such explosives until the same has been deposited in the magazine, or stowed on board any vessel conveying it elsewhere.

13. The Port Officer is authorized on occasions when he may deem it expedient to permit ammunition properly packed in cases, when such cases do not exceed 50 in number, to be shipped on board a vessel lying at the ordinary anchorage on the day or the day before such vessel is intended to sail. Shipment shall be effected under the same precautions and conditions as are prescribed in the rules for the shipment of explosives on board vessels lying off the Deep Water Point Moorings. Ammunition permitted to be shipped under this rule must be taken in immediately on the boat going alongside and no cargo boat or other vessel having fire on board shall be permitted to lie on the same side of the vessel during the time of such shipment.

No. 6505.—His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to direct the addition of the following rules to the draft rules for regulating the manufacture, possession and sales of explosives in the Bombay Presidency prescribed in Government Notification No. 4525, dated 24th

June 1886, published at pp. 561 to 570 of the *Bombay Government Gazette*, Part I, of 8th July 1886.

The additional rules will be taken into consideration on the expiry of three months from the date of this Notification:—

DRAFT RULES.

29. Every license granted under these rules shall be liable to be forfeited on breach of any of the conditions subject to which it is granted.

30. If a person licensed to manufacture, possess or sell an explosive dies or becomes bankrupt or becomes mentally incapable or otherwise disabled, the person carrying on the business of such licensee shall not be liable to any penalty or forfeiture under the Act or the rules made thereunder for carrying on the business or acting under the license during such reasonable time as may be necessary to allow him to make an application to the authority granting the license for a new license in his own name during the currency of the unexpired portion of the original license. Such new license shall be granted on the payment of one rupee.

31. The fees leviable under these rules shall be taken in the shape of 'impressed stamps.' Ordinarily the applications for licenses or renewals of licenses shall, if not otherwise provided, be written on 'impressed stamps' of value equal to the amount of fee leviable in respect of such licenses or renewals; the licenses themselves being issued on plain paper. But when the licenses themselves are written or printed on impressed stamps, the application may be on plain paper. When an application for a license is written on an impressed stamp, and the license is refused, the value of the stamp will on application be refunded to the applicant.

32. All licenses except licenses to manufacture an explosive under Rule 12 or to possess explosives of the 5th (fulminate) class under Rule 21 shall expire on the 31st December of the year for which they are granted. Licenses granted under Rules 12 and 21 shall be current for the term therein specified. But the currency of a license may, unless the circumstances have so changed that the grant of a new license would either not be authorized under the Act and rules or is deemed objectionable by the licensing authorities, on application previous to its expiration, be renewed, on payment of the original fee.

33. When a license granted in accordance with these rules is lost, or accidentally destroyed, a duplicate may be granted to the licensee on payment of a fee of eight annas.

34. Any person holding a license, or acting under a license, granted in accordance with these rules, shall be bound to produce the same, when called upon to do so by any Magistrate or by any police officer in charge of a police station, or by any police officer of higher rank.

35. All magistrates or other authorities acting under these rules will perform their duties subject to the control of their executive superiors and of Government.

36. Any authority empowered to grant a license under the foregoing rules may, if he thinks fit, direct by an order written on the license that it shall have the effect of a like license under the Indian Arms Act, 1878.

37. Any persons lawfully entitled under the Indian Arms Act, 1878, or the rules made thereunder, to possess any explosive coming under the head of ammunition as defined in that Act, may possess, without license under these rules, any such explosive in reasonable quantities for his own private use.

No. 6506.—In exercise of the power conferred by Section 216 of the Bombay Land Revenue Code, 1879, the Governor in Council is pleased to authorize the extension of the provisions of Chapters VIII. and IX. of the said Code to the village of Chik-Nargund in the Navalgund Taluka of the Dhárwár District.

I have the honour to append for your information and guidance a copy of the rules for conversion of Stock Notes into Book Debt Certificates received from the Comptroller General, and to request that you will be so good as to carry out these instructions on receipt of this circular.

RULES FOR CONVERSION OF STOCK NOTES INTO BOOK DEBT CERTIFICATES.

1. Under the orders conveyed in Government Resolution No. 2566, dated the 20th August 1885, the restriction to pay interest on Stock Notes in the particular circle from which they issue has been removed, and notes of any circle can, on application of the holder, be now transferred to another circle, and the interest thereon drawn at the option of the holder either from any treasury situated within that circle or from the Presidency-town itself.

2. It is therefore no longer necessary for Treasury officers to retain in their own custody Stock Notes deposited as security under Rule 9, Chapter 11, or as endowments under Rule 29A, Chapter 16, of Civil Account Code, and with a view to relieve the Treasury officers concerned of such work, the following procedure should be adopted in respect of Stock Notes so held :—

(I) All Stock Notes so held at present by Treasury officers should be returned to the officers from whom they were originally received, the interest to last due date being paid.

(II) The officers to whom they are so returned should forward them with lists in duplicate to the officers to whom they render accounts, who will, in their turn, forward them as follows :—

In Madras Presidency,—	Accountant General,	Madras.
In Bombay Presidency,—	Ditto,	Bombay.
In the N. W. Provinces,—	Ditto,	N. W. P.
„ Punjab	Ditto,	Punjab.
Elsewhere,—	Comptroller General.	

N.B.— These rules do not apply to Stock Notes tendered by land-owners in payment of Land Revenue.

3. On receipt of each batch of Stock Notes in the above offices they will be entered up in a Register to be opened for the purpose (Form I attached), as well as in a Personal Ledger, and an acknowledgment sent, the balance at credit of the officer, who may forward them, being increased accordingly.

4. As soon as a sufficient supply is in hand, they will be forwarded (Form II) to the Circle Office concerned, to be cancelled, and a Stock Certificate issued in lieu thereof in the name of Comptroller General or Accountant General, as the case may be, carrying interest from the date to which interest was last paid.
