No. 85.—The following Notice to Mariners by the Port Officer, Aden, dated the 12th instant, is published for general information :—

" NOTICE

Is hereby given that all the glass panes have been removed from the Light-house, Obstruction Point, Perim Island. The occulting light is very bright and distinct between N. 42° W. through West to S. 8° E., except between N. 64° W. and N. 67° W. between S. 69° W. and S. 65° W. and between S. 22° W. and S. 13° W., when the light becomes very dim and no occultation is visible. The obscuration is caused by

three frames or stanchions intervening between the eye of the observer and the light. This defect will be modified or remedied at an early date. The arc of visibility will be increased on the north side when sundry alterations to the lamp room are completed. Due notice will be given. The alterations are expected to be finished about the end of November. The bearings are magnetic from the ship."

Notice is hereby given that on and after November 1, 1886, until February 28, 1887, a Red Buoy with the words 'Torpedo Buoy' painted on it, and a red flag on the top, will be placed at the entrance to Trincomalee Harbour between Ostenburg Point and Little Sober Island, and 250 yards from the latter.

The water in the triangle formed by the Red Buoy, N.E. Head of Great Sober Island and Clappenburg Point, will be obstructed by mines.

All vessels should pass between the Buoy and Ostenburg Point.

No. 87.—The following alteration made by the Trustees of the Port of Bombay under Section 73 of the Bombay Port Trust Act, 1879, in the Bye-Laws for the regulation and management of the wet-docks, and published (in Notification No. 79, dated 12th October 1886,) in the *Bombay Government Gazette* of 14th, 21st and 28th instant, has received the approval of Government, as required by Section 74 of the Act above referred to:—

"The following words are added to the note appended to Dock Bye-Law No. 46, 'or to Bickford's safety slow-burning fuze,' and in Bye-Law No. 50 the words 'Bickford's safety slow-burning fuze' are inserted after 'Lucifer Matches' and before 'or other goods.'"

No. 88.—Under the provisions of Section 6 of the Indian Ports Act, 1875, the following is

declared to be the western limit of the Port of Bombay in supersession of that laid down in Government Notification dated 7th June 1866:—

The eastern shore of the Island of Bombay from the Fort of Siwri to Colaba Light-House, and the shore of Back Bay from Colaba Light-house to Malabar Point, thence a line drawn to the outer Light-Vessel and continued to the west point of Khanderi (Kenery) Island and thence by the north along the eastern shore of the Island to the south point thereof;

and the following is declared to be the southern limit of the Port of Bombay:—

A line drawn from the south point of Khanderi (Kenery) through the south point of Oondari to a boundary mark on the mainland south of the village of Navagam.

No. 89.—Under the provisions of Section 7 (G) of Act XII. of 1875 (The Indian Ports Act) the following addition is made to the Bombay Port Rules published under Notification No. 47, dated 17th August 1881:—

Rule No. 12A.—No vessel shall anchor within that portion of the Port of Bombay comprehended as follows:—*On the north* by a line drawn from the extreme northern point of Khanderi (Kenery) Island to the patch of isolated rocks situated near and to the north-eastward thereof, and thence to the south brow of Kunkeshwar Hill. *On the east* by the line of coast extending along the fore-shore from a point due west of the south brow of Kunkeshwar Hill to the boundary mark erected on the beach close to the fishing village of Navagam at the mouth of a creek about 2 miles to the south of the south brow of Kunkeshwar Hill. *On the south* by a line drawn westward from the boundary mark above referred to through the southern extreme of Oondari Island to the beacon to the eastward of Khanderi (Kenery) Island and thence to the south extreme of the latter, and *on the west* by the eastern shore line of Khanderi (Kenery) Island.

4. The Viceroy will leave the "Clive" at 4-45 p.m., and the Senior Naval Officer is requested to make all the necessary arrangements for the landing of His Excellency at the Apollo Bandar, and for the proper salutes being fired from Her Majesty's ships in Port.

5. On His Excellency's arrival at the steps of the Apollo Bandar, a Salute of 31 guns will be fired from the Saluting Battery. A Guard of Honour of British Infantry with Band and Colours will be drawn up on the Bandar, and the road will be lined by Troops of the Garrison as far as the Statue of the Queen Empress. A Guard of Honour of Bombay Infantry with Band will be at Government House, Malabár Point.

6. His Excellency will be received at the Bandar by His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief and Staff, the Chief Justice, the Lord Bishop, the Members of Council, the Judges of the High Court, the Additional Members of the Council of His Excellency the Governor for making Laws and Regulations only, the Secretaries and Under Secretaries to Government, the Brigadier-General Commanding the Bombay District, the Private Secretary and Staff of His Excellency the Governor, the Chairman of the Municipal Corporation, the Municipal Commissioner, the Sheriff of Bombay, and the Heads of Departments, Civil and Military, or by such of the abovementioned officials as are at this time in the Presidency town. All officers of Her Majesty's Services now in Bombay and off duty are requested to attend. An enclosed space will be reserved at the Bandar for officials and Native Chiefs.

The necessary arrangements at the Bandar head will be made by the Public Works Department, who will reserve accommodation for European and Native Ladies and Gentlemen who will be admitted by ticket.

Full Dress will be worn.

7. An address of welcome will be presented to His Excellency by the Municipal Corporation.

8. His Excellency will proceed direct to Government House, Malabár Point, escorted by a detachment of the Governor's Body Guard.

The Commissioner of Police will maintain order and keep the streets clear.

9. His Excellency will be received by His Excellency the Governor on the steps of the great entrance of Government House.
