CERTIFICATES OF ORIGIN FOR BRITISH GOODS EXPORTED TO SPAIN.

Her Majesty's Minister at Madrid has reported that, under the existing Spanish Customs Regulations, certificates of origin are required. A simple declaration of the shipper of goods to the effect that they are of British origin will, however, be deemed sufficient at the Spanish Customhouses. This declaration is to be made before the Chief Officer of Customs at the port of shipment; and shippers are recommended to make it on the specification of goods in the following form, viz.:—

In Regulation 2 on every person liable to the payment of the tax, setting forth the details of the amount claimed and informing such person that any objection which he may have to make to the charge must be sent in to the Secretary in writing within ten days from the date of the receipt of the notice, and that if no such objection is made, the amount must be paid into the Cantonment Office within fifteen days amount must be paid into the Cantonment Office within fifteen days from the date of receipt of the notice.

6. Every objection duly made under Regulation 5 shall be heard and disposed by the Cantonment Committee and the amount of tax, if Hearing of objections. any, which the Committee adjudge to be payable shall be paid as aforesaid within fifteen days from the

date of their decision. 7. The tax shall not be payable for any half-year by any person who has not been a resident in that

half-year. A resident who keeps any Refunds. vehicle or animal for use in the Cantonment for a period not exceeding two months in any half-year, shall be

entitled to a refund of two-thirds of the amount of the tax he may have paid for that half-year: provided that previous to the expiry of the said period of two months he gives written notice of his claim to such refund to the Secretary of the Cantonment Committee.

Tax on vehicles and animals acquired during currency of a half-year.

8. If any resident comes into possession or receives charge of a vehicle or animal during the currency of a half-year after the list aforesaid has been prepared, he shall be liable to the tax, notwithstanding that his

name is not entered in the said list, and notice of demand may be served upon him at any time. Every such resident shall forthwith give written information to the Secretary of the Cantonment Committee of the number and description of vehicles and animals which have come into his possession or charge, and in the event of his failure so to do, he shall, at the discretion of the Cantonment Committee, forfeit his claim to any refund of tax to which he may otherwise be entitled under these Regulations.

9. If any tax is not paid within the period prescribed in this behalf by these Regulations, the same Recovery of tax not paid when may be recovered, together with such penalty not exceeding one-fourth of the amount of tax due as shall be adjudged by the Magistrate, by a summary proceeding before the Cantonment Magistrate, in the manner provided in the Criminal Procedure Code for the recovery of fines.
