Sir,

I have the honour to request, on behalf of the Municipal Corporation of Bombay under Act XI. of 1879, the favour of the sanction of Government to the raising of a loan of 7 lakhs from the public for Drainage and other Sanitary Works, as per accompanying Statement, which gives the particulars required by Rule 5 of the Rules relating to loans so raised.

It will be observed that the Sanitary Works Loans of 44 lakhs include the original provision for the Malabár Hill Reservoir Roofing Work, Love Grove Pumping Station, and Queen's Road Sewer. Extra sums required for the completion of these three works have been included in the present application.

*Statement showing particulars pursuant to Rule 5 of the Rules published by the Government of India for the raising of Loans by Local Authorities.*

I. The loan is required for the construction of the following works, the estimated cost of which is Rs. 7,12,322, or say 7 lakhs, after allowing for savings on some works:—

II. The amount which it is proposed to borrow is Rs. 7,00,000.

III. It is proposed to borrow the said sum on the security of the general revenue of the Bombay Municipality, aggregating nearly 46 lakhs, as per Supplemental Statement A. hereto annexed.

IV. The laws under which funds, duties, taxes, rates, cesses, &c., are levied, received or held, are Act IV of 1857 and Bombay Acts VI of 1863, III of 1872 and IV of 1878, V of 1878, VI of 1882, and II of 1886.

V. The loan is required for such period or respective periods as may be agreed upon between the Corporation and the lenders, not exceeding 40 years. It is proposed to raise the loan in such instalments from time to time as will suffice for the prosecution of the works. Interest will be paid half-yearly, and provision will be made for annually setting aside such equal sums as after payment of interest will suffice for the liquidation of the whole debt in the period or respective periods agreed on as aforesaid, either by the creation of a Sinking Fund or by the redemption from time to time of portions of the debt as opportunity may offer.

VI. The yearly proceeds of each separate source of income are shown in the Supplemental Statements A. and B. hereto annexed.

VII. All expenditure incurred by the Bombay Municipality in each of the three last preceding years 1883-84, 1884-85, and 1885-86 is shown in Supplemental Statement C. hereto annexed.

VIII. All existing prior charges upon the Funds of the Municipality are shown in Supplemental Statement D. hereto annexed.

No. 7617 OF 1886-87.

Bombay, 14th September 1886.

TO THE SECRETARY, TOWN COUNCIL.

SIR,—In 1878 (December) a loan of 27 lakhs was raised, out of which 17 lakhs were appropriated to the new Drainage Works and 10 lakhs to Bhandarwada Water Works. A statement of the disposal of the 17 lakhs loan has already been given with my letter No. 12333 dated 20th February 1884. At that time some accounts had not been adjusted, and the final result now shows that out of that loan there is available a saving of Rs. 31,209.\* Out of this sum Rs. 15,000 were transferred to increase the original grant for house connections in Kámáthípura, but owing to better tenders having been obtained, the excess was not required, so that the whole sum of Rs. 31,209 is now available for reappropriation.

2. The accounts of the Bhandarwada Works have now been completed, and the total stands at Rs. 10,48,807-4-0, allowing for the value of iron work transferred to Surplus Stock, and debiting the work with Rs. 683-12-7 for depreciation in value of articles so transferred. This shows an excess of Rs. 33,807-4-0. This excess, as has already been explained, is due to the fact that the quantity of rock excavation was much larger than was anticipated and to the extra time over which the contract extended, as also to the higher compensation awarded under the Land Acquisition Act.

3. Thus, on all the works comprised under the 27 lakhs loan, there is an excess of Rs. 2,598-4-0, for which a further grant is required. This can be given either by a transfer from the sum of Rs. 5,360 provided out of current revenue for pitching slopes of banks of the John Hay Grant Reservoir, but not utilized, or it can form part of the further loan for which application has still to be made.

4. It will also be necessary to sanction the debit to some other head of expenditure of Rs. 31,675-6-3, which was the cost of completing the new outlet tunnel at Vehár. This work, it will be remembered, was sanctioned as being of an emergent nature, and the cost was temporarily debited to the unexpended Bhandarwada Loan Funds, out of which, it was then supposed, there would be a considerable balance; but this expectation, for the reasons already explained, proved to be mistaken.

5. The new main from Vehár, the catch-water channels at Vehár and Tulsi, the raising of the Tulsi dams, and other water works of a minor nature included with these in the recent Sanitary Works Loan, and of which a list is given below, have now been completed, and the final accounts show a net saving of Rs. 23,684-11-9. If this sum now available be deducted from the debit balances mentioned above, it will be necessary to make provision, by loan or otherwise, only for Rs. 10,588-14-6.

6. In the same loan a provision of Rs. 1,53,969 was made on account of the Queen's Road Intercepting Sewer. To this sum was subsequently added Rs. 25,975 out of Surplus Cash Balance, which, according to the introductory note of this year's Budget, was to be re-adjusted from new loan funds hereafter. The final account of this work, inclusive of all charges, stands at Rs. 1,67,513, showing a saving of Rs. 12,431; in other words, the debit to new loan, if it be made, will be Rs. 13,544 instead of Rs. 25,975.

7. The following other grants have also been made by the Corporation on various occasions, as temporary advances, from Surplus Cash Balance, pending the raising of a loan :-

Considerable misunderstanding appears to exist regarding the charges which are admissible under this rule.\* The following explanation is given with a view to assist officers in the preparation of their bills and to reduce the number of items disallowed in audit.

2. The rule empowers the Local Government to sanction the actual expense of maintaining "camp equipage" when it is necessary to do so, "camp equipage" being defined in the Code as "the apparatus for moving a camp"; and the word "camp," for the purpose of this rule, has been explained by the Government of India to include not merely tents but also tent furniture in the wide sense of "everything necessary to an officer to enable him to live in camp."

See G. I., F. D., to Government of Bombay, No. 3342, dated 24th September 1886, embodied in Government Resolution, Financial Department, No. 8147, dated 18th October 1886.

3. Accordingly under the rule as thus interpreted the hire of carts, and the keep of bullocks or other animals if used solely for the transport of camp-kit of all kinds are admissible charges, but not the cost of means of transport for the officer himself nor the wages of his camp servants.

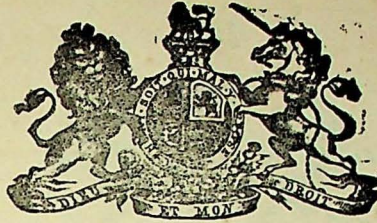
