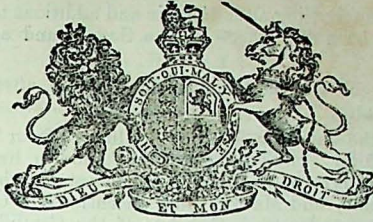

THE HOMEJEE CURSETJEE PRIZE.

The subject for the year 1868 for the Homejee Cursetjee Prize is—

INDIA THREE THOUSAND YEARS AGO.

The Homejee Cursetjee Prize, consisting of books to the value of Rs. 200, will be awarded for the best poem by a University student, in accordance with the following conditions:—

Competitors should be matriculated students of the University of Bombay, who should not be of more than four years' standing from the date of their matriculation on the day prescribed below for the sending in of the poems.

The competitive poems should be written in the Heroic metre, or in the Spenserian stanza, and should not exceed 150 lines in length. Each poem should be designated by a motto instead of the writer's name, and should be accompanied by a sealed cover containing the name of the competitor, his University Standing, and his Post Office address, and a declaration that the poem sent in by him is *bonâ fide* his own composition.

The competitive poems should be sent in to the Registrar on or before the second Saturday in June next.

REGULATIONS.

It is hereby notified that the following alterations in and additions to, Bye-Laws and Regulations of the University of Bombay, have been duly made by the Senate, and approved of by the Governor of Bombay in Council:—

I. That in Bye-Law 35, page 54 of the Calendar for 1867-68, after the word "undergraduates" be inserted the words "or graduates."

II. That at page 118 of the Calendar for 1867-68, line 14 from top, for "Bachelor of Arts" be read "Graduates"; and in line 15 for "two" be read "five"; and in line 17, after the word "Essays" be added "By the term Graduates is to be understood Masters and Bachelors of Arts, Bachelors of Laws, Doctors and Licentiates of Medicine, and Masters and Licentiates of Civil Engineering; and by the term date of graduation is to be understood the date of the Candidate's receiving the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, or Licentiate of Medicine, or Licentiate of Civil Engineering."

III. That at page 121, line 5 from bottom, after "petitor" be read "his University standing and his Post Office address"; and at page 122, lines 4 and 5, for "during the month of September" be read "on or before the 30th of September."

IV. That in page 50 of the Calendar, line 20, for "one Medicine" be read "Two Medicine."

BOMBAY TO WIT.—By virtue of a Precept to me directed, I hereby Proclaim and give Notice, that the FIRST SESSIONS of 1868 of Oyer and TERMINER, and GENERAL GAOL DELIVERY, will be holden before the High Court of Judicature at Bombay, at the Court House, on MONDAY, the 3rd day of February next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, for the trial of all Treasons, Murders, and other Felonies, Perjuries, Trespasses, and other Crimes, Misdemeanors, and Offences, had, done, or committed within the Town and Island of Bombay, and the Limits thereof, and the Factories subordinate thereto; and also to inquire, hear, and determine in the like manner all Treasons, Murders, Felonies, Forgeries, Perjuries, Crimes, Extortions, Misdemeanors, Offences, Wrongs, and Oppressions, had, done, or committed, by any of Her Majesty's British Subjects in any of the Territories which now are subject to, or dependent upon, the Government of Bombay, or within any of the Dominions of the Native Princes of India in alliance with the said Government.

And also, that at the same time and place, will be holden a Session of Admiralty, for the trial of all Treasons, Murders, Piracies, Robberies, Felonies, Misdemeanors, Offences, and other Maritime Crimes whatsoever done or committed on the High Seas.

And I hereby give Notice to all persons bound to prosecute and give evidence at the above Sessions, or in any way concerned therein, that they are to attend at the time and place abovementioned, and not to depart without leave of the Court.

And I hereby give Notice to all Justices of the Peace, Coroners, Escheators, and also all Chief Constables and Bailiffs of the Town and Island of Bombay and the Limits thereof, that they be then and there in their own persons, with their Rolls, Records, Indictments, and other remembrances, to do those things which to their offices in that behalf appertain to be done.—Dated the 20th day of January 1868, and in the Thirty-first year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria.
