Cotton Seed.

The Cotton Commissioner, Bombay, is now prepared to supply the following Cotton Seeds, for sowing, during the Season, and at the prices affixed to each variety, as follows:—

New Orleans (imported) Rs. 25 per Cwt.
Ditto Dharwar grown) ..., 4 do.
Sea Island (imported), 25 do.
Egyptian (imported), 10 do.

These rates are exclusive of packing and transport charges when forwarded to the Mofussil.

As a general average an acre of ground requires from ten to twelve pounds of seed.

It is requested that requisitions may be forwarded with as little delay as possible, in order that applicants may be enabled to make their own arrangement for the careful preservation of their seed until sowing time.

With exception of the "Dharwar New Orleans," all the above named Seeds are in store at Bombya. The former variety is now on its way to the Dated, being fresh Seed of last season's growth.

RESOLUTION.—Portions of all the Collectorates in the Southern Division, with the exception probably of Ahmednuggur and Canara, and perhaps of Sattara, are apparently included within the limits of total phase of the ensuing solar eclipse. Ten copies of these papers should be sent to each of the District Officers concerned, who should be enjoined to spare no pains in supplying Lieutenant Herschel with the requisite information. The papers should also be published in the Government Gazette, and copies should be sent to the Political Department for a similar purpose, in reference to the Political Agencies comprised within the limits indicated on the chart. The Bombay Branch of the Royal Asiatic Society may also be asked to favour Government with their opinion as to the adequacy of these instructions, and the Secretary and Curator, Government Central Museum, who prepares the returns of rain-fall, may be consulted as to the reliability and completeness of the recorded information in his Office and in the districts. The Commissioners of Survey should report whether, in the event of such a course being deemed expedient, they could depute an Officer or Officers of scientific attainments to collect information regarding peculiarities of atmosphere, and to select localities embracing favourable conditions.
