The Cotton Commissioner, Bombay, is now prepared to supply the following Cotton Seeds, for sowing, during the Season, and at the prices affixed to each variety, as follows:—

As a general average an acre of ground requires from ten to twelve pounds of seed.

It is requested that requisitions may be forwarded with as little delay as possible, in order that applicants may be enabled to make their own arrangement for the careful preservation of their seed until sowing time.

With exception of the "Dharwar New Orleans," all the above named Seeds are in store at Bombay. The former variety is now on its way to the Dépôt, being fresh Seed of last season's growth.

The following Act of the Governor General of India in Council received the assent of His Excellency the Governor General on the 13th March 1868, and is hereby promulgated for general information:—

Act No. V. of 1868.

An Act to enable the Governor of Bombay in Council to delegate to the Commissioner in Sind certain of the powers of a Local Government.

1. It shall be lawful for the Governor of Bombay in Council, by a notification published in the *Bombay Government Gazette*, to delegate to the Commissioner in Sind all or any of the powers conferred on the said Governor in Council, as the Local Government of the Province of Sind, by any of the Bombay Regulations, or by any Act of the Governor General of India in Council solely applicable to the Presidency of Bombay, or by any Act passed heretofore or hereafter by the Governor of Bombay in Council, or by any of the Acts of the Governor General of India in Council mentioned in the schedule to this Act.

2. It shall be lawful for the Governor of Bombay in Council, with the consent of the Governor General of India in Council, to delegate to the Commissioner in Sind all or any of the powers heretofore or hereafter conferred by any Act of the Governor General of India

in Council on the Governor of Bombay in Council as the Local Government of the Province of Sind.

3. All acts done by the Commissioner in Sind under the authority of any power so delegated, shall be as valid as if they had been done by the Governor of Bombay in Council.

SCHEDULE.

- Act XXVI. of 1850 (to enable improvements to be made in Towns.)
- Act VII. of 1854 (for the apprehension, within the territories under the Government of the East India Company, of persons charged with the commission of heinous offences beyond the limits of the said territories and for delivering them up to justice, and to provide for the execution of warrants in places out of the jurisdiction of the authorities issuing them).
- Act XXV. of 1861 (for simplifying the Procedure of the Courts of Criminal Judicature not established by Royal Charter).
- Act VI. of 1863 (to consolidate and amend the laws relating to the administration of the Department of Sea Customs in India).
- Act VII. of 1865 (to give effect to Rules for the management and preservation of Government Forests).
