ACTS PASSED BY THE COVERNMENT OF INDIA.

The following Act of the Governor General of India in Council received the assent of His Excellency the Governor General on the 11th April 1868, and is hereby promulgated for general information:—

Act No. XII. of 1868.

An Act to empower the Governor General of India in Council to suspend the operation of section 17 of Act No. XI. of 1841.

Power to suspend Act No. XI. of 1841, section 17.

Act No. XIII. of 1868.

An Act to exempt the King of Oudh from the jurisdiction of the Civil Courts, and for other purposes.

WHEREAS it is expedient to exempt the King of

Preamble. Oudh from the jurisdiction of the Civil Courts,
and to render him incapable of entering into certain contracts; It is hereby enacted as follows:—

1. Section four of Act No. VIII. of 1862 (to Repeal of Act VIII. of protect the personal dig-1862, section 4. nity of His Majesty the King of Oudh) is hereby repealed.

2. No suit shall be commenced or prosecuted, and no writ or process

No suits to be brought against the King of Oudh, unless with consent of Government, and no writ or process shall at any time be sued for against the person or property of His Majesty the King of Oudh, unless

such suit shall be commenced, or such writ or process shall be sued for, with the consent of the Governor General of India in Council first had and obtained.

Such consent shall be certified by the signature of one of the Secretaries to the Government of India, and every such signature shall be judicially noticed.

And any suit which at any time shall have been or shall be commenced, and any writ or process which at any time shall have been or shall be sued for against the person or property of His said Majesty without such consent so certified as aforesaid, shall be null and void.

3. His said Majesty shall be incapable of

4. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed

Nothing in this Act to render Secretary of State or Government of India liable.

to render the Secretary of State for India in Council, or the Govern-ment of India, liable for any debt heretofore con-

tracted by or on behalf of His said Majesty, or in respect of any claim to be reimbursed which may be made by any person supplying His said Majesty with necessaries.

This Act may be called "The King of Oudh's Act, 1868," and shall come into operation Short title. on the first day of May
