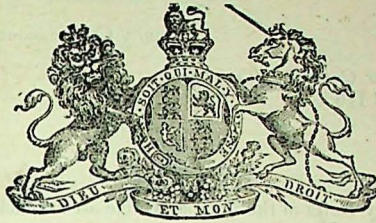

#### Cotton Seed.

The Cotton Commissioner, Bombay, is now prepared to supply the following Cotton Seeds, for sowing, during the Season, and at the prices affixed to each variety, as follows:—

New Orleans (imported) . . . . .	Rs. 25 per Cwt.
Ditto Dharwar grown) . . . . .	„ 4 do.
Sea Island (imported) . . . . .	„ 25 do.
Egyptian (imported) . . . . .	„ 10 do.

These rates are exclusive of packing and transport charges when forwarded to the Mofussil.

As a general average an acre of ground requires from ten to twelve pounds of seed.

It is requested that requisitions may be forwarded with as little delay as possible, in order that applicants may be enabled to make their own arrangement for the careful preservation of their seed until sowing time.

With exception of the “Dharwar New Orleans,” all the above named Seeds are in store at Bombay. The former variety is now on its way to the Depot, being fresh Seed of last season's growth.

Applications should be endorsed on the cover “Requisition for Cotton Seed,” and addressed to the “Cotton Commissioner, Bombay, care of the Senior Cotton Inspector, Bombay.”

## Government Photozincographic Establishment, Poona.

On and after the 1st of January next the above Establishment will be prepared to execute work for all Government Departments.

2. Facsimiles of Maps, Plans, Drawings (uncolored) Steel and Wood Engravings can be produced by the Photozincographic process the same size as the original, or on a reduced scale, as may be required, and can be multiplied *ad libitum* by the Zincographic process.

3. The following Rules must be observed by Departments sending work to the Photozincographic Establishment:—

1st.—Colored copies of Maps, Plans, or Prints cannot be received for Photozincography.

2nd.—The lines of Maps, Plans, or Prints, sent to be copied, on the same, or on a reduced scale, must be clear, distinct, and black, or good copies cannot be guaranteed.

3rd.—The number of copies required must be stated in the requisition, and the scale on which the Map should be reproduced should be distinctly written in the margin of the copy sent.

4th.—In the event of a Map being required on a different scale to that on which the copy sent is drawn, the scale required must be neatly printed and pasted over the scale on the copy, e. g. a Map on a scale of an inch to a mile is required to be reduced to an inch to four miles.

A "slip" scale 1 inch to 4 miles must be pasted over "scale 1 inch to a mile," otherwise the copy reduced by the Camera would contain the original scale, whereas the reduced scale adopted should be shown, which will be effected by the observance of this rule.

4. A scale of charges will be published hereafter.

5. All packets—to be franked by privileged officers, if *bonâ fide* on Her Majesty's Service, or prepaid—should be addressed to Mr. Cousens, Photozincographic Office, Poona.

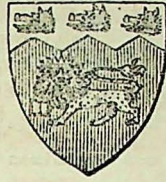

No. 401 of 1868-69.

Notice is hereby given that the following Regulations will come into force in the year 1868-69:—

## THE COWASJEE JEHANGHIER LATIN SCHOLARSHIP.

1. A scholarship, to be entitled The Cowasjee Jehanghier Latin Scholarship, of the value of Rs. 200 per annum, shall be awarded every year to that candidate who shall have passed the Matriculation Examination, and who shall have obtained the highest marks for proficiency in Latin at such examination.
2. The stipend of the scholarship shall be payable half-yearly on a bill drawn by the Head of some recognized College or Institution; which bill shall certify, under the signature of the Head, that the scholar is in regular attendance at the College or Institution, that his conduct is good, and his progress in University studies is satisfactory.
3. Should the scholar discontinue his University studies, or be unfavourably reported of by the Head of his College or Institution, the Syndicate shall declare the scholarship to be forfeited.
4. The scholarship shall be awarded at the final meeting of the Matriculation Examiners, and the name of the Cowasjee Jehanghier Scholar for the ensuing year shall be published by the Examiners together with their list of matriculated students.
5. A diploma of the scholarship, signed by the Dean of the Faculty of Arts and by the Examiners in Latin, shall be presented to the scholar by the Chancellor or Vice Chancellor at the Convocation for conferring Degrees.
6. In case of the student who is elected declining to proceed to College, the stipend of the scholarship for the ensuing year may be conferred on the candidate who shall have obtained the second place in the Examination in Latin.
7. In case of the scholarship lapsing, through forfeiture or otherwise, during the course of the year, any savings which may result may be added to next year's scholarship, so as to increase the half-yearly stipends payable; or may be used at the discretion of the Syndicate to create a Second Scholarship for the ensuing year.

## CURRENCY NOTES.

*Extract from Financial Department Notification, No. 1004A, dated Simla, 30th July 1866.*
