No. 17.—In supersession of Section A of the Notification No. 6922, dated 26th December 1879 (Bombay Government Gazette dated 1st January 1880, page 3), His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased, under the powers vested in him by Section 3 of the Karáchi Lauding and Wharfage Fees (Bombay) Act III. of 1879, to determine the limits of the following Government landing places to which the provision of the said Act shall apply (namely):—

A.—Limits of Government landing-places. Keamari Bandar.

Comprises the foreshore of the west end of Keamari Island abutting on the Harbour, and extends an aggregate of 1,989 yards from the junction of the Napier Mole on the north to a point, 600 yards, south of shore end of the Keamari Groyne on the south, bounded on the west by the Harbour, on the east from the north end by the Napier Mole Road as far as the Commissariat Yard, thence along the north and west boundaries of the Commissariat Yard, including the Commissariat Pier, as far as the north side of the Customs Pier, thence by a line 50 yards above H. W. mark running south as far as the Andrew Road, and thence by the shore line of the S. P. and D. Railway Company's premises, and including the Railway Pier to the Keamari Groyne (shore end), and from there along a line 50 yards east of the west face of the Groyne and parallel with it to the south end of the landing-place.

The boundaries on all sides are marked by masonry pillars, bearing the letters L. P., signifying landing-place.

Native Jetty.

Bounded on the east by the Harbour Works Chauki, Harbour Board Office and Peons' Quarters near the north-east junction of the said Jetty with the Napier Mole, and on all the other sides by the Harbour.

The boundaries on the east side are marked by masonry pillars, bearing the letters L. P., and on the remaining sides are defined by the coping of the Jetty wharf walls.

Khudda Bandar.

(Formerly called Wood Bandar.)

Bounded on the north and south by a swamp of Mangrove Bushes, on the east by the village of Khudda and on the west by the Native Fishing Boat Channel.

The shore end of the Bandar and west boundary of the adjoining village of Khudda are marked by masonry pillars, bearing the letters L. P.

Layári Hard.

Bounded on the north by the mouth of the Layári River, on the south by the embankment facing north wall of Native Jetty, on the east by the old Muchee Meeance, by Jetha Moolji's Cotton Press, by the Custom House and by the adjoining part of the Napier Mole, and on the west by a swamp of Mangrove Bushes. The boundaries are marked at angles and intervals along the shore line by masonry pillars, bearing the letters L. P.

Manora Beach.

Comprises the entire Harbour Face extending from the mouth of the Yariri Creek on the north to the Manora Breakwater on the south, reserving the rights of the Harbour Works and Persian Gulf Telegraph Departments to land and ship Government Stores at their respective Piers.

Baba Island.

The boundary is marked at intervals, where required, by masonry pillars, bearing the letters L. P.

His Excellency the Governor in Council is also pleased, under the provisions of Section 3 of the same Act, to exempt goods which are bond fide the property of the Sind, Panjab and Delhi Railway Company from any landing, shipping, wharfage, cranage, storage or demurrage fees at the Railway Pier thereinbefore mentioned and situate within the limits comprising the Keamari Bandar, or any vessel, boat, animal or vehicle bringing or removing any such goods to or from the said Railway Pier.
