No. 2019.—Under the provisions of the Indian Factories Act, No. XV. of 1881, His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to direct that the Assistant Collector and Magistrate in charge of the Eastern Division of Khândesh shall be Inspector under Section 3 within the limits of that Division.

No. 2020.—Under Section II. of the Steam Boiler Inspection Act, Bombay Act V. of 1873, and in modification of the orders contained in Government Notification dated 17th April 1877, His Excellency the Right Honourable the Governor in Council is pleased to notify for general information that the provisions of the said Act shall again apply to the towns of Karáchi and Kotri in Sind.

No. 2020A.—Under Section XXIV. of the Steam Boiler Inspection Act, Bombay Act No. V of 1873, His Excellency the Right Honourable the Governor in Council is pleased to notify for general information that the date on which Section XXIII. of the said Act shall come into operation in the towns of Karáchi and Kotri in Sind shall be the 1st January 1883, and that the penalties leviable under Sections XIV. and XXII. of the Act will be enforced after that date.

No. 2021.—With reference to Government Notifications Nos. 2020 and 2020A of this day's date extending the provisions of the Steam Boiler Inspection Act, Bombay Act V. of 1873, to the towns of Karáchi and Kotri in Sind, His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to publish for general information the following rules framed by him under Sections V., IX. and XVI. of said Act applicable to the towns of Karáchi and Kotri in Sind:—

*Rules concerning the duties and emoluments of the Inspector or Inspectors, and the examination of Boilers and Prime Movers under Section V. of the Act.*

1. The Inspectors appointed by Government under this Act for the towns of Karáchi and Kotri shall be under the orders and control of the Collector of the District and shall make all reports to that officer.

2. The office of the Boiler Inspection Act of 1873 for the Town of Karáchi shall be in the office of the Collector of the District, and that of the Boiler Inspection Act for the Town of Kotri in the office of the Mukhtyárkar of Kotri, and the Inspectors shall attend at their respective offices when necessary, and shall keep such statements and records as the Collector may from time to time direct.

3. The Inspector shall keep a diary of the work daily performed by him, and shall enter in it the places visited, the fees charged, and on what account, and any further details that may appear necessary. A copy of this diary shall be submitted every fortnight to the Collector of the District for information and record.

4. The Inspector shall attend all meetings of the Commissioner appointed under Section 9 of the Act, and shall make such statements and submit such plans as may be necessary, or as may be called for by the said Commissioner. For such attendance he shall be entitled to the ordinary fees and travelling allowances payable to European witnesses attending the Sadar Court in civil cases.

5. Fees shall be levied for the present according to the maximum scale given in the Schedule A of the Bombay Act V. of 1873, which fees shall be retained by the Inspector for his trouble.

6. The Inspector shall inspect externally and internally every boiler and prime mover on his list before a certificate is granted or permission given to work the boiler. The Inspector shall give ten days' notice of every such intended examination to steam owners, and if after such notice the boilers are not cool, clean and the prime movers ready for inspection on the date named, the Inspector shall prohibit the boilers and prime movers from working, and shall report the case to the Collector of the District.

Further, if any requests shall be made to remove fittings or settings and such be not complied with, the Inspector shall in like manner stop the working of the boilers and prime movers, and shall report the same to the Collector of the District.

7. The Inspector shall keep an Index Register and Dimension Sheets in the order authorized by the Collector of all boilers and prime movers within the limits of the Act.

8. The Inspector shall be provided with a testing pump, indicator and gauges for testing boilers.

*Rules concerning the duties and emoluments of the Commissioner appointed under Section IX of the Act.*

1. One Commissioner shall be appointed by Government and his appointment notified in the *Bombay Government Gazette* for such time as the Government may direct.

2. After his appointment the Commissioner shall attend at the office of the Boiler Inspection Act of 1873, whenever necessary at the request of the Collector of the District.

3. The Commissioner shall give over for custody the original proceedings of the cases, &c., disposed of by him to the Collector of the District.

4. The emoluments of the Commissioner shall be Rs. 30 per day for the performance of the duties laid down in the Act.

*Rules concerning Examination under Section XVI of the Act.*

1. One or more Examiners shall be nominated by Government for such term as shall be directed

2. The Examiner or Examiners so appointed shall assemble at such time and place as may be appointed by the Collector of the District who shall lay before them a list of the candidates to be examined.

3. The examination held at Karáchi shall be that for Third Class Engineers or Engine-drivers only.

4. The examination shall be *viva voce*, and, if possible, shall be conducted in a foundry where the candidate's knowledge can be practically tested in the use of the steam vacuum and water gauges. The candidate shall be required to understand thoroughly the working and use of the safety valves, and to be able to explain to some extent the actual working of the engines and the separate uses of feed pumps, slide valves, pistons, &c. The candidate shall be required to have been three years employed in the management of engines and boilers previously to his application; and he shall be not less than twenty-one years of age. With a Driver's certificate of competency he shall be only qualified to take charge of boilers and engines not exceeding twenty horse-power nominal.

5. Applicants for a certificate of competency as a Third Class Engineer or Engine-driver (to be granted on their passing the required examination) shall lodge their application with a fee of Rs. 6 at the office of the Boiler Inspection Act of 1873.

6. In the event of any candidate not obtaining the required certificate, half the fee shall be returned to him,—successful candidates will receive the necessary certificates from the Examiners.

7. The emoluments of the said Examiners shall be Rs. 20 each for each meeting at which they shall attend for the above purpose.

RESOLUTION.—In paragraph 4 of the Resolution of the 21st February 1882, read above, the Governor General in Council requested that in future swords required for the Police and other Departments might be procured of Indian manufacture in communication with the Inspector General of Police, Punjab, if they could not be made within the local limits of the presidency or



province concerned. As, however, it has since been ascertained that swords can be extensively manufactured in the North-Western Provinces as well as in the Punjab, and that skilled workmen can now be found in almost every district in the North-Western Provinces, the Governor General in Council requests that when it is found more convenient to obtain swords from the North-Western Provinces than from the Punjab, the necessary steps to procure them may be taken in communication with the Inspector General of Police, North-Western Provinces.

which the officers are permitted to be absent from duty (e.g., Uncovenanted Judicial Officers, Educational Officers, Officers in a High Court).

(b).—District and Sessions Judges who are permitted to avail themselves of the periodical court vacations.

But in case of urgent necessity, privilege leave may be granted to any such officer, under the ordinary rules; subject to the conditions, (1) that the officer shall during his absence receive only half the salary and allowances ordinarily admissible during privilege leave, and (2) that the leave cannot in any case be combined with vacation.

2. Rule 1 does not apply to the case of an officer who is, by general or special orders issued by competent authority, prevented in any year from availing himself of the vacation or vacations by reason of his having to remain at his post on duty. In such a case, privilege leave may be granted under the ordinary rules; provided always that the leave shall not in any case be combined with vacation.

3. An officer who is, by general or special orders issued by competent authority, prevented from availing himself of a part only of a periodical vacation may, during privilege leave subsequently taken, draw his full salary for a period bearing the same proportion, if the vacation be annual, to a month, or if it be half-yearly, to half a month, as the time spent on duty during the vacation bears to the whole vacation.

No. 1975.—In exercise of the power conferred by Act I. of 1870, the following rules for Quarantine against Cholera have been made by the Government of Bombay with the previous sanction of the Governor General in Council; they will take effect from the 29th May 1882 in the Ports of Bombay, Aden and Karachi as a temporary measure :—

I.—The Commander of every vessel, including buggalows or other native craft, arriving from Sumatra shall, before entering the harbour, indicate by signal the port from which such vessel has come.

- II.—Such Commander shall not, except as hereinafter provided, allow any communication, either with the pilot boat, except orally, or with the shore, or with any other vessel or boat in the harbour.
- III.—Immediately on any such arrival being signalled, the Health Officer of the port shall go alongside the vessel and, if communication with the shore is desired, shall direct the Commander to take the vessel to the quarantine anchorage, duly appointed and notified in that behalf, there to remain for a period of seven days from the date of arrival in the harbour, and undergo disinfection, which should apply as well to crew, passengers, effects and susceptible goods. The Health Officer shall also direct the Commander to prohibit, during the period for which the vessel remains at the quarantine anchorage as aforesaid, all communication, except such as is hereinafter provided for, between such vessel and the shore, or other vessels and boats in the harbour. If communication with the shore is not required the vessel shall not enter the inner harbour, and no communication in any way shall be allowed with the pilot boat, except orally, or with the shore, or with any vessel or boat in the harbour.
- IV.—If during the period a vessel is at the quarantine anchorage aforesaid, any case or cases of cholera should occur on board, the said vessel shall remain in quarantine for a period of seven days from the date of the last case occurring, and be subject to all the prohibitions provided for in Rule III.
- V.—When any vessel has been placed in quarantine as aforesaid, the Health Officer may direct the removal of so many of the passengers and crew as may not be suffering from illness, and whose services may not be required on board the vessel, to such particular spots as may from time to time be selected by the local officers as places of quarantine, there to remain for a period of seven days. If a case of cholera occurs among such passengers and crew during any such period, they shall remain in a place of quarantine for a period of fifteen days from the date of the occurrence of the last case of such illness.
- VI.—Any mails or cargo which may be brought by any vessel so arriving shall be landed under such precautions as the Health Officer may deem necessary to prevent the spread of the disease.
- VII.—It will be the duty of the Port Officer to facilitate the conveyance to all vessels in quarantine of such supplies of provisions, stores and other articles, as may be required by those on board. Such supplies will be placed on the boats of the vessels in quarantine to be subsequently removed by members of their crews.
- VIII.—All vessels arriving at Bombay, Aden and Karáchi which may have communicated with vessels coming from Sumatra shall be subjected to the same quarantine as vessels arriving at Bombay, Aden and Karáchi from Sumatra.
- IX.—All vessels which have undergone quarantine in the manner above prescribed, should have the fact clearly stated on their Bills of Health.
