## Government Notifications, Appointments, &c.

#### NOTIFICATIONS.

JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT.

Bombay Castle, 17th June 1882.

No. 3703.—The following Notification by the Government of India is republished:—

"HOME DEPARTMENT.

Simla, the 8th June 1882.

No. 865.—Under the provisions of Section 17 of the Indian Arms Act, 1878, the Governor General in Council is pleased to direct that the following Rule for the grant of licenses for the importation into British India, by land or river, of arms, ammunition, or military stores, shall be inserted after Rule

No. 1601, dated the 30th August 6B of the Rules framed under Sec-

tion 17 of the said Act, and published in the Notification mentioned in the margin:

6C. Licenses to import into British India, by land or river, arms (other than arms for which the Governor General in Council is to issue licenses under Rule 5), ammunition, or military stores, may be granted by the Magistrate of the district to which

such arms, ammunition, or military stores are consigned; or, if such arms, ammunition, or military stores are consigned to a Presidency Town, by the Commissioner of Police. The fee payable in respect of each such license shall be Rs. 5; but officers granting such licenses are empowered to remit the fee when the arms, ammunition, or military stores are of a reasonable quantity, and such officers are satisfied that they are required bonā fide for purposes of protection of person or property. In the case of arms, ammunition, or military stores imported from a Native State, a copy of the license shall be sent by the officer granting it to the Political Officer of the State from which they are to be imported. If the district to which the arms, ammunition, or military stores are consigned is other than a frontier district, and they are to cross the frontier by road or river, a copy of the license shall also be sent to the Magistrate of the frontier district, who shall, if he thinks necessary, before permitting the arms, ammunition, or military stores to leave his district, require the holder of the license to produce them for his inspection. In cases in which the arms, ammunition, or military stores are to cross the frontier by rail, a copy of the license shall be sent to the Railway authorites at the place to which the arms, ammunition, or military stores are to occovered by Railway. The Railway authorities shall in every such instance

satisfy themselves before delivery that the arms, ammunition, or military stores claimed by any consignee correspond with the description given in the original license, which must be produced by him, and also that the license is identical in substance with the copy sent to them by the officer granting it. If

the license is not produced, or the arms, ammunition or military stores claimed do not correspond with the description in the license, the railway authorities shall give immediate notice of the fact to the nearest Magistrate. Nothing in this rule applies to import into the district of Ajmere.

The licenses shall be prepared in the following form :-

Endorsements to be printed on the reverse of the above form :—

This license is valid only for the period and the route named herein.

It becomes invalid if bulk is broken, or the consignment stopped, at any place on the journey.

It is given subject to the provisions of the Indian Arms Act, 1878, and of the rules framed thereunder. The contents of each package covered by this license shall be described in legible characters on the

outside of such package.

This license must be delivered to the District Magistrate or the Commissioner of Police when the articles covered by it reach their destination. In the cases of consignments crossing the frontier by road or river, the articles must, within six days of their reaching British territory, be available for exhibition to the frontier Magistrate, or other officer whom he may empower in this behalf. In case of consignments crossing the frontier by rail this license must be shown to the Railway authorities of the station of delivery.

delivery.

The Governor General in Council is also pleased to direct that the following Rules shall be substituted for Rules 7A, 8, 9 and 10 of the Rules framed under Section 17 of the Indian Arms Act, 1878, and published in Home Department Notification No. 1892, dated the 25th November

1881 :---

(7A.) Nothing in Rule 5, 6, 6C or 7 shall be deemed to authorise the grant of licenses—

(a) to import any arms, ammunition, or military stores from Portuguese India;

(b) to export to Portuguese India by sea, river or land, any arms, ammunition or military stores, except the same be exported for the exclusive use of the Government of Portuguese India, or are covered by special license for import into Portuguese India signed by the Secretary General to the Government of Portuguese India.

(8.) Persons desireus of transporting, importing by land or river, or exporting arms, ammunition, or military stores, must apply in writing to the nearest Officer authorized to grant such licenses. The application must specify—

(a) the place to which the articles are to be transported, imported or exported; the route of transport, import or export; and the probable time that will be occupied in the journey:

(b) the quantity, description, average price, and the purpose of each kind of arms or ammuni-

tion : or

(c) in the case of transport or export, whether the applicant has obtained the consent of the Magistrato or Political Officer of the place of consignment. [If so, the evidence of such consent must be produced.]

(9.) Persons transporting, importing by land or river, or exporting arms, ammunition or military stores under a license, must write legibly on the cases or packages containing such articles an account of their contents.

(10.) In the case of transport, or import by land or river, the consignee must, within six days of the articles reaching their destination, deliver the transport or import license to the Magistrate of the district, or, in the case of a Presidency Town, to the Commissioner of Police. In the case of articles crossing the frontier of British India by road or river—(1) the export license must, within six days of the consignment reaching the frontier district, and before it leaves British territory, be delivered to the Magistrate of the frontier district, or other officer empowered by him on this behalf; (2) the import license must, within six days of the consignment entering British territory, be shown to the Magistrate of the frontier district, or other officer empowered by him on this behalf.

The officer to whom the transport, import, or export license, as the case may be, may be delivered, must satisfy himself that the articles correspond with the entries in the license, and that any deficiency is properly accounted for."

A. By a Covenanted Civil Servant-

163 per cent. (one-sixth) on the gross salary he receives from his foreign employers.

B. By all other officers-

14% per cent. (one-seventh) on the gross salary he receives from his foreign employers subject to a maximum contribution of Rs. 166% a month from an uncovenanted officer.

O. By a native of India not being a Covenanted Civil Servant who elects under Section 8 (b) 3 to contribute for pension only...

one-eleventh of the gross salary he receives from his foreign employers subject to a maximum contribution of Rs. 100.

2. Where a higher rate of contribution is now paid, the rate is for the future (i.e., for contributions for June due on 1st July 1882, and afterwards) to be reduced as above; but in all such cases the gross salary drawn from the foreign employers will be re-adjusted in such a manner as to leave the same net salary as the officer on foreign service at present receives.

3. A memorandum is appended of the officers on foreign service who pay their contributions into your Treasury showing their contributions under the old and new scales.

4. Have the goodness to advise each of the officers and their foreign employers of the changes made, and see that contributions due on 1st July and later months are paid on the new scale. Arrears of contributions due on 1st June and earlier dates should of course be paid at the old rates. Please also advise me at once of any omissions that may have been made in the list now sent.

5. The revised rates do not affect the cases of officers specially provided for in Section 10 (a) to (f) of the Civil Pension Code, or inferior servants provided for by Section 8, Rule 4.
