CIVIL PENSION CODE.

Page 97.

Add the following as Section 177A:—

177A. Section 177 applies to Officers of the Public Works Department who retired under the terms of the Resolution in the Department of Finance, No. 2079, dated 31st July 1879, except as regards re-employment in an establishment paid from a Local Fund. Any such Officer, whether re-employed permanently or temporarily, is required on re-employment to refund the special gratuity received by him under paragraph 5, section II, clause (5) of the Resolution of the 31st July 1879; but if he does not make the refund, his pension will, for the purposes of this Section, be held to be increased by an amount

equal to 5 per cent. per annum on his special gratuity. If an Officer has capitalised his pension the same deduction will, if necessary, be made from his allowances as if he had not done so. (For the purposes of this Section, service paid by a Guaranteed Railway Company shall be treated as if it were service rendered in a temporary capacity.)

An Officer re-employed in service paid from a Local Fund may, in addition to his salary, draw his pension and retain the special gratuity received by him under paragraph 5, section II, clause (5) of the Resolution of the 31st July 1879.

'All vessels coming from British India, Calcutta excepted, not laden with pilgrims are now admitted to pratique in the Ottoman ports of the Red Sea and Persian Gulf, but all vessels without exception freighted with pilgrims coming from beyond the Straits of Bab-el-Mandeb are to undergo five days' quarantine at the Island of Camaran; pending arrangements being made at Camaran they are to undergo quarantine at a small island near Jeddah.'
