INDIA OFFICE, London, 6th July 1882.

To His Excellency the Most Hon'ble the Governor General of India in Council.

MY LORD MARQUIS .-

- PARA. 1. I have considered in Council your letter, dated the 8th of May, No. 123, referring, for my consideration, an application from A. B., praying that he may be allowed to commute a portion of the pension to which he will be entitled on retirement from the Covenanted Civil Service.
- 2. With reference to the observation of the Government of the North-Western Provinces and Oudh, that the concession asked for by A. B. would, if conceded generally, be a decided boon to the Service at large, without being in any way prejudicial to the interests of the State, you express considerable doubt whether the main object of the Indian pension system might not be defeated by the grant of such a concession generally. At the same time you believe that such a measure, if restricted to individual officers, would tend to remove a special block in promotion in certain places.
- You therefore request that, in cases in which you may consider that the retirement of officers of the Covenanted Civil Service would have the effect of removing a block in promotion, you may be permitted to allow such officers to commute the whole, or any part, of the £400 of their annuities in excess of the £600 which was supposed to represent the pension formerly given from the Annuity Funds. You propose to require the usual medical certificate in every case, and to calculate the capital value of the sum commuted by Table C on page 130 of the Codes of the Financial Department.
- 4. It has not hitherto been the practice to give to civil annuitants the option of commuting any portion of their annuities, partly on the ground that they were able by assigning them to practically effect commutation without the interven-tion of Government. The terms so obtained are necessarily less favourable than those allowed by this office, and, for this reason, the commutation of a portion of an annuity was recently allowed in one case. I do not, however, desire that this practice should become general.
- 5. But I see no objection to your proposal, which is accordingly approved, subject to the condition that, in every case, the capitalised sum will be paid in India, the annuity being taken at the rate fixed for its payment in that country.

6. It will rest with your Government to decide whether A. B.'s case is one of those in which the privilege of commutation should be conceded.

To Her Majesty's Secretary of State for India. MY LORD MARQUIS,-

We have the honour to refer, for Your Lordship's consideration, an application from A. B., praying that he may be allowed to commute a portion of the pension to which he will be entitled on retirement from the Covenanted Civil Service.

- 2. In submitting A. B.'s application, the Government of the North-Western Provinces and Oudh remarks that the concession asked for would, if granted generally, be a decided boon to the service at large without being in any way prejudicial to the interests of the State. We beg to observe, however, that we have considerable doubts as to the wisdom of allowing commutation of pensions generally. The main object of the Indian pension system might thereby be defeated. But at the same time we believe that such a measure, if restricted to individual officers, would tend to remove a special block in promotion in certain places. Commutation of pension within certain limits was a part of the remedy applied under the recent arrangements in removing the block in promotion in the North-West Provinces and elsewhere.
- 3. Accordingly, we ask Your Lordship's permission to allow officers of the Covenanted Civil Service to commute a portion of their pension in cases in which we may consider that the retirement of the officers will have the effect of removing a block in promotion. The portion of the pension which we would allow to be commuted would be the whole or any part of the £400 in excess of the £600 which was supposed to represent the pension formerly given from the Annuity Funds. A certificate as to the normal prospects of life will be required in every case, and the value of the annuity would be calculated by Table C on page 130 of the Codes of the Financial Department.

REVENUE DEPARTMENT.

No. 5541.—The following extract from a Report No. 179, dated 7th ultimo, from the Superintendent, Government Model Farm, Bhadgaon, Khándesh, relative to the working of an improved sugar-cane mill employed on that Farm, is published for general information:—

"3. The sugar-cane mill, which has been beyond comparison the most successful of all the different patterns tried here, was made by the late Firm of Nicol & Co., Bombay, in imitation of the large mills built by Messrs. Onie, of Glasgow, for use in the West Indies and differing from them, besides size, in one particular only, that of having the level wheel on the upright shaft of the mill working underneath instead of over the corresponding wheel on the end of the upper roller.

4. This mill is in cast-iron with three fluted rollers (14 in. long by 10 in. in diameter), one above, two fitted at the one end by even-toothed wheels which work into each other, the lower being turned by the upper, which, as above stated, is connected with the upright shaft. In the cross head of this shaft poles are fixed, and the bullocks pulling in a circle, at the ends of these levers communicate motion to the mill.

5. This machine is constructed so as to work with a maximum of economy in this district as much as it exactly consumes the power of two pairs of bullocks and fully employs one cutter, one feeder, one delivery man, one cook, and one kettle; working continuously, it produces 12 maunds (of 82 lbs.) of jagri per day, and thus clears 2 to 3 acres of crop weekly.

6. Its cost in 1868 was Rs. 650, but the iron market was at the time abnormally high; the price at present rates would be about Rs. 500.

7. The people are particularly fond of this mill, but of course no individual could afford to buy it for his own special use, and the want of facilities for getting done any trifling repairs of iron work, deter Wanias or other capitalists from investing in them. That such an investment would pay is proved by the fact that it was hired to neighbours last year at Rs. 1-4-0 per day and realized from this source Rs. 82; in the preceding year its earnings amounted to Rs. 173.

8. The makers of this at the same time built a few mills of a combined pattern. These have three iron rollers as in the above, but placed in a line perpendicularly and in a wooden frame like the country Ghani. They can be made for Rs. \$50 and act very well for a time, but readily give way under the pressure of work, so that the saving on original construction is soon outbalanced by the heavy expense of frequent repairs."

Letter from the Accountant General, No. 6. A.-5068, dated 4th July 1882—Exquiring whether it is sufficient to enter in the column headed "Purpose of Journey" in the prescribed form of travelling allowance bill on page 308 of the Civil Account Code, Volume I., simply the words "on public duty," as this term appears to be too vague and applies equally to all officers on all occasions; observing that he is of opinion that the entry in the column in question should be something like the following:—"inspection," "examination of record," "local investigation,"

"conference with—" &c., &c., so as roughly to indicate the nature of the public duty that necessitated the journey; and requesting instructions of Government as to whether he should enforce this rule.

RESOLUTION—The opinion of the Accountant General that the nature of the public duty should be briefly stated seems correct. Orders should be issued accordingly.

GENERAL DEPARTMENT.

Dated Bombay, 15th August 1882.

- As I notice that most communications now received from Treasury Officers bear the endorsement "through the Collector" and also "forwarded A. B. Collector," it would seem that the intention of my Circular No. 11 of the 4th April 1882, has been misunderstood.
- 2. The rule therein laid down was intended to apply to other Departments, the Subordinates of which should always communicate with this office through the Head of their own Department; but it was not intended that Treasury Officers, who are the executive officers through whom this office conveys its directions and controls the district accounts, should be debarred from addressing this office direct.
- 3. The responsibility for all Treasury and account business being with the Collector, it rests entirely with him to say to what extent he will allow his Treasury Officers to correspond directly with this office, and the practice will no doubt differ considerably in different districts.
- 4. When the Collector is out in camp or away from the Head-quarters station, it will no doubt generally be convenient to allow the Treasury Officer to communicate direct with this office, as he is in fact obliged to do in urgent cases.
- 5. So, again, in matters of mere routine most Collectors will probably not object to their Treasury Officer corresponding directly with me, even when the Collectors are at Head-quarters; but in all matters of any importance, and particularly in Resource questions, the Treasury Officer should forward his letters through the Collector whenever it is possible to do so.
- 6. I would ask the Treasury Officers to pay a little more attention to the legibility of their signatures. I can hardly ever read a native Treasury Officer's signature, and it sometimes causes embarrassment and delay in the disposal of correspondence if I am obliged to wait till I can ascertain the identity of the signing officer.
