SIR—In acknowledging the receipt of Mr. Officiating Junior Secretary C. Robertson's endorsement, No. 728A., dated 29th June 1865, I am directed to state that the Resolution of the 11th December 1863 is only to apply to the servants who are designated as Peons (or Chuprasses), and is further limited to

such members of this body as had been discharged, prior to the date of the order, on reduction of establishments after 30 years' service.

The order in question was passed to meet an exceptional condition of affairs, viz., to relieve the distress consequent on a large and sudden general reduction of Peons, and is not to be treated as a standing Regulation of the service.

“No. 755 of 1865.—The following Regulations on the subject of the appointment of Interpreters, are laid down for information and guidance:—

*British Troops.*

An Interpreter will be allowed, as at present, in each Regiment of Her Majesty's British Cavalry and Infantry, on the allowances noted in the margin. He must have passed the old Interpreter's or P. Examination, or the tests under the second standard, as notified in G. G. O. No. 734 of 9th September 1864.

Stationery .. .. Rs.	10
Half Staff .. .. .	30
Total .. .. .	40

When no Officer who has passed either of these tests is available, one who has passed the old P. H. Examination, or the first standard under the General Order of the 9th September 1864, may be appointed temporarily to act, receiving the stationery allowance, and half the staff allowance.

A Moonshee on Rs. 30 per mensem will be allowed on the Establishment of each British Regiment of Cavalry or Infantry.

*Native Troops.*

The appointment of Interpreters to Native Regiments under the new organization is not considered necessary, as every Officer now on the regular Establishment of such a Corps, must at least have passed the P. H. Examination, and eventually all will have qualified under the second standard above referred to.

Formerly the duties of interpreting at Courts Martial, Courts of Inquiry, Courts of Inquest, and Courts of Requests, &c., convened by Officers Commanding Stations, were performed in turn by the Regimental Interpreters. To provide for these and all other duties hitherto appertaining to Interpreters that may be *extra regimental*, the following Rules are laid down:—

In the event of the assembly in a station of a Court Martial or any other Court at which the services of an Interpreter may be considered essential, the Brigadier General or other Officer Commanding should nominate an Officer for the duty. This Officer, who should always be selected with reference to his qualifications as an Interpreter, must at least have passed either the P. H. Examination or that under the present second standard.

The Officer so appointed may be a regimental Officer, or an Officer doing general duty; but if the former, such occasional employment should not remove him from his Regiment, or exempt him from any regimental duty with which the special duty does not necessarily interfere.

For the duties above indicated, an allowance will be passed at the following rates:—

For all Station or District Courts, Rupees 5.

For all General Courts Martial or other Special Courts held by order of the Commander in Chief or of Government, Rupees 10.

Should the Courts sit more than one day, the above allowance of Rs. 5 and 10 respectively, will be passed for, each day during which the Interpreter's attendance may be actually necessary.

All appointments of Station Interpreters will cease from the 1st proximo, from which date the foregoing rules will come into operation.

"No. 757 of 1865.—The following paragraphs of a Military letter from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for India, No. 219, dated 30th June 1865, are published for General information:—

Paragraph 3 \* \* \* \* \* I shall not object to modify the decision conveyed in my Despatch dated 9th December 1864, No. 397, to the extent recommended by your Government, and allow to Officers, during the time they are on probation, the option of entering the Staff Corps from the day following their Cadre promotion, instead of from the prior date of their appointment on probation. Under this view, a Lieutenant appointed to the Staff Corps on probation on 1st January 1865, who obtains Cadre promotion on 1st July 1865 and completes his course of probation on 31st December 1865, will be appointed to the Staff Corps as a Captain from 2nd July 1865, instead of from 1st January 1865.

4. The promotion of an Officer during probation will thus go on in the Regiment or Cadre to which he belongs. The Officer who, during his period of probation, obtains no regimental or Cadre promotion, will enter the Staff Corps from the date of his appointment on probation.

*N.B.*—This table is an extract from a more extensive yearly Return that is prepared for statistical purposes, and chiefly for the detection of any removable sources of disease, with a view to improving the healthiness of the Island. As the principal object cannot be fully attained unless the true causes of death be recorded, persons at out-stations are requested, in each case of death occurring in their circle, to obtain, in writing, from the Medical Attendant, the name of the fatal disease, that it may be delivered to the Policeman at the funeral place. Medical Practitioners particularly are requested to aid the registration. Blank forms of Death Reports, to keep by them in readiness, are given gratuitously on application at the Office of the Deputy Commissioner of Police.

It is thought that some withhold their assistance through the notion that reports of the single casualties coming now and then under their observation could but little affect the Returns; but it ought rather to be borne in mind that the accuracy of the Returns depends on the correct reporting of all *single* cases, for of such only the aggregate is made up.

## To Architects.

POLICE OFFICE, BYCULLA, BOMBAY.

The Architectural Improvement Committee of Bombay have received instructions from Her Majesty's Government of Bombay to call for Competition Designs for a new Police Office at Byculla. The cost of the Building not to exceed, at present prices, three lacs of Rupees.

The extent of accommodation to be provided and other particulars as to site, &c, can be ascertained on application at the office of the Architectural Improvement Committee, Esplanade.

Each Design to be sent, in the first instance, as a pen and ink Architectural sketch, uncoloured and without shading, except such as can be done with the pen. Each Design should bear a motto, and should be accompanied by the Architect's address in a sealed envelope, and should be sent in on or before the First day of October 1865, addressed to the Architectural Improvement Committee of Bombay.

A premium of Rupees one thousand (1,000) will be awarded to the author of the Design approved, to be increased on the completion of the Contract Drawings of the selected Design, with specifications and table of quantities, to (2½) two and a half per cent. on the cost of the work when estimated at the current rates of the Public Works Department.

The style is left an open question, but the construction of the building, and its Architectural treatment must be thoroughly adapted to a tropical climate, where a high temperature and monsoon rains have to be provided against. Due regard must be had to the contemplated outlay; yet the Designs, whilst not too ornate, must be effective, and possess sufficient Artistic merit to entitle them to compete for the premium.

If the Designs are wanting in Artistic merit, or fail to comply with the conditions, the Judges will have power to reduce or withhold the prize. No prize will be given to a Design because it merely fulfils the conditions as to cost, &c., if it is conspicuously deficient in Artistic merit.

The Design will be selected, and the award made, by the Architectural Improvement Committee of Bombay.

Unsuccessful Designs will be returned to the authors if claimed by them or their authorized agents, within three months from the date of adjudication.
