Sin-In acknowledging the receipt of Mr. Officiating Junior Secretary C. Robertson's endorsement, No. 728A., dated 29th June 1865, I am directed to state that the Resolution of the 11th December 1863 is only to apply to the servants who are designated as Peons (or Chuprassees), and is further limited to

such members of this body as had been discharged, prior to the date of the order, on reduction of establishments after 30 years' service.

The order in question was passed to meet an exceptional condition of affairs, viz., to relieve the distress consequent on a large and sudden general reduction of Peons, and is not to be treated as a standing Regulation of the service.

When no Officer who has passed either of these tests is available, one who has passed the old P. H. Examination, or the first standard under the General Order of the 9th September 1864, may be appointed temporarily to act, receiving the stationery allowance, and half the staff allowance.

A Moonshee on Rs. 30 per mensem will be allowed on the Establishment of each British Regiment of Cavalry or Infantry.

Native Troops.

The appointment of Interpreters to Native Regiments under the new organization is not considered necessary, as every Officer now on the regular Establishment of such a Corps, must at least have passed the P. H. Examination, and eventually all will have qualified under the second standard above referred to.

Station or Garrison duties.

Formerly the duties of interpreting at Courts Martial, Courts of Inquiry, Courts of Inquest, and Courts of Requests, &c., convened by Officers Commanding Stations, were performed in turn by the Regimental Interpreters.

To provide for these and all other duties hitherto appertaining to Interpreters that may be extra regimental, the following Rules are laid down:—

In the event of the assembly in a station of a Court Martial or any other Court at which the services of an Interpreter may be considered essential, the Brigadier General or other Officer Commanding should nominate an Officer for the duty. This Officer, who should always be selected with reference to his qualifications as an Interpreter, must at least have passed either the P. H. Examination or that under the present second standard.

The Officer so appointed may be a regimental Officer, or an Officer doing general duty; but if the former, such occasional employment should not remove him from his Regiment, or exempt him from any regimental duty with which the special duty does not necessarily interfere.

For the duties above indicated, an allowance will be passed at the following rates :-

For all Station or District Courts, Rupees 5.

For all General Courts Martial or other Special Courts held by order of the Commander in Chief or of Government, Rupees 10.

Should the Courts sit more than one day, the above allowance of Rs. 5 and 10 respectively, will be passed for, each day during which the Interpreter's attendance may be actually necessary.

All appointments of Station Interpreters will cease from the 1st proximo, from which date the foregoing rules will come into operation.

No. 441 of 1865.—The following General Order by the Government of India, No. 757, dated 3rd August 1865 is republished:—

"No. 757 of 1865.—The following paragraphs of a Military letter from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for India, No. 219, dated 30th June 1865, are published for General information :—

Paragraph 3 * * * * * * * * * * I shall not object to modify the decision conveyed in my Despatch dated 9th December 1864, No. 397, to the extent recommended by your Government, and allow to Officers, during the time they are on probation, the option of entering the Staff Corps from the day following their Cadre promotion, instead of from the prior date of their appointment on probation. Under this view, a Lieutenant appointed to the Staff Corps on probation on 1st January 1865, who obtains Cadre promotion on 1st July 1865 and completes his course of probation on 31st December 1865, will be appointed to the Staff Corps as a Captain from 2nd July 1865, instead of from 1st January 1865.

4. The promotion of an Officer during probation will thus go on in the Regiment or Cadre to which he belongs. The Officer who, during his period of probation, obtains no regimental or Cadre promotion, will enter the Staff Corps from the date of his appointment on probation.

N.B.—This table is an extract from a more extensive yearly Return that is prepared for statistical purposes, and chiefly for the detection of any removable sources of disease, with a view to improving the healthiness of the Island. As the principal object cannot be fully attained unless the true causes of death be recorded, persons at outstations are requested, in each case of death occurring in their circle, to obtain, in writing, from the Medical Attendant, the name of the fatal disease, that it may be delivered to the Policeman at the funeral place. Medical Practitioners particularly are requested to aid the registration. Blank forms of Death Reports, to keep by them in readiness, are given gratuitously on application at the Office of the Deputy Commissioner of Police.

It is thought that some withhold their assistance through the notion that reports of the single casualties coming now and then under their observation could but little affect the Returns; but it ought rather to be borne in mind that the accuracy of the Returns depends on the correct reporting of all single cases, for of such only the aggregate is made up.

1. Hawul Bagh in Kumaon, forty-six miles from the plains, and six miles from Almorah. M., will be accepted on the part of Government by the Committee.

On the tender being accepted by the Committee, the purchaser must deposit five per cent. of the purchase money, which will be forfeited if the amount of the purchase money be not paid in full on the date specified.

The Architectural Improvement Committee of Bombay have received instructions from Her Majesty's Government of Bombay to call for Competition Designs for a new Police Office at Byculla. The cost of the Building not to exceed, at present prices, three lacs of Rupees.

A premium of Rupees one thousand (1,000) will be awarded to the author of the Design approved, to be increased on the completion of the Contract Drawings of the selected Design, with specifications and table of quantities, to (2½) two and a half per cent, on the cost of the work when estimated at the current rates of the Public Works Department.

The style is left an open question, but the construction of the building, and its Architectural treatment must be thoroughly adapted to a tropical climate, where a high temperature and monsoon rains have to be provided against. Due regard must be had to the contemplated outlay; yet the Designs, whilst not too ornate, must be effective, and possess sufficient Artistic merit to entitle them to compete for the premium.

If the Designs are wanting in Artistic merit, or fail to comply with the conditions, the Judges will have power to reduce or withhold the prize. No prize will be given to a Design because it merely fulfills the conditions as to cost, &c., if it is conspicuously deficient in Artistic merit.

The Design will be selected, and the award made, by the Architectural Improvement Committee of Bombay.

Book Packets and Parcels not made water-tight by parties posting them, will be liable to receive damage from wet.

Persian Gulf Mails.—The British India Steam Navigation Company's Mail Packet Boats will in future leave Bombay on fixed days, viz., the 3rd of each month, for Bussora, and will make the voyage direct viá Muscat instead of viá Kurrachee, at which latter port they will not touch on either the up or down voyage.

2. The Mail bags for Muscat, Bunder Abbas, Linga, Bushire, and Bussora, also Bagdad and Turkish Arabia, will be closed in future at 12 (noon) on the 3rd of each month.

Mauritius and Cape of Good Hope Wails.—An intimation has been received from Her Majesty's Post Master General of England of the establishment of a monthly communication between Port Louis (Mauritius) and Table Bay (Cape of Good Hope) calling at Natal.

The Branch Packet will leave Port Louis immediately after the arrival of the Packet from Suez and Aden, that is about the 25th of the Month, and will return to Port Louis in time for the Packet appointed to leave for Aden and Suez on the 6th of each Month.

Letters for Natal and the Cape of Good Hope, St. Helena, and Ascension, if marked via Aden and Mauritius, will be sent by the route abovementioned.

The Postage on prepaid letters sent by this route will be the same as on letters sent viá Southampton to England. Prepayment is optional.
