The following Notification by the Government of India, No. 2364, dated 29th September 1865, is published for general information:—

" No. 2364.

The 29th September 1865.

The following order, passed by Her Majesty the Queen in Council, is published for general information:-

At the Court at Windsor, the 18th day of May 1865.

PRESENT:

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas by 'The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1855,' it is enacted than in any case in which any light-house, buoy, or beacon had been or should be thereafter erected or placed on or near the coasts of any British possession, by or with the consent of the legislative authority of such possession, Her Majesty might, by Order in Council, fix such dues in respect thereof, to be paid by the owner or master of every ship which passes the same, or derives benefit therefrom, as Her Majesty might deem reasonable:

And whereas a light-vessel has, by and with the consent of the legislative authority of the Colony of Ceylon, been placed on the Little Basses Rock, in the said Colony, and a light is already exhibited therein:

And whereas the several classes of ships following, that is to say-

Every ship which, in the same voyage by the southward of Ceylon, shall cross a line drawn from the southernmost point of Ceylon to the north-westernmost point of the Island of Sumatra, and also a line from the southernmost point of Ceylon to Cape Gardafui, on the eastern coast of Africa, and vice versa:

Every ship which, in any voyage to or from any place in the Maldive Islands, shall cross a line drawn from the southernmost point of Ceylon to the north-westernmost point of Sumatra:

Every ship which, in any voyage from any port on the eastern coast of Africa, south of Cape Gardafui, or from any port in Madagascar, Bourbon, Mauritius, or any island adjacent to the same, including the Seychelles and the Chagos Islands; or in any voyage in which such ship shall have rounded the Cape of Good Hope eastward, shull cross a line drawn from the southermost point of Ceylon to the southermost point of the coast of Tenasserim, and shall, between the first day of April and the thirtieth day of September, both included, arrive at any port situate north of such line:

Every ship which having departed between the first day of October and the thirty-first day of March, both included, from any port situate to the northward of such light, and also to the westward of the 90th meridian of longitude east from Greenwich, in any voyage to any port on the eastern coast of Africa, south of Cape Gardafui, or to any port in Madagascar, Bourbon, Mauritius, or any Island adjacent thereto, including the Seychelles and the Chagos Islands, or in any voyage in which such ship shall round the Cape of Good Hope westward, shall cross the latitude of the said light on the eastward side of the said light, will pass the said light-vessel, and will derive benefit therefrom:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that from and after the date of this present Order, the dues in respect of the said light-vessel upon Little Basses Rock, to be paid for every such ship as aforesaid, except ships belonging to Her Majesty, Her heirs and successors, shall be one penny per ton of the burthen of every such ship for every such voyage as aforesaid.

#### MARINE DEPARTMENT.

#### Bombay Castle, 16th October 1865.

No. 23 of 1865.—In supersession of G. G. O. No. 60, dated 19th October 1863, the practice of framing the Accounts of Vessels in the Audit Branch of the Accountant General's Office will cease, and the Pay Accounts and Contingent Bills of Vessels will be preferred according to the following rules from the 1st December next, i. e., commencing with the accounts for November.

- 2. Pay Abstracts and Contingent Bills, in the Forms marked A and B, are to be prepared by Officers in command of vessels, and after payment despatched to the Accountant General immediately after the close of each month.
  - 3. An Abstract should be exhibited on the back of the Pay Abstract, as per Form A.
- 4. Advances may, as heretofore, be taken up for contingencies when absolutely necessary, but the advance must not exceed the usual amount of the Contingent Bill of the vessel. The balance due, if any, at the end of the month should be drawn from the nearest Civil Treasury. An advance for the next month should not be taken up until the Pay Abstract and Contingent Bill shall have been prepared for the past month.
- 5. An Acquittance Roll for the Pay drawn on the abstract for the previous month (as per Form C), the usual Muster Roll Certificates for steam and tuition money, &c., &c., should accompany the Pay Abstract of a vessel.
- 6. Officers commanding vessels should keep their accounts from the 1st November next separate from those for previous months, so that there may be no difficulty in furnishing the Pay Abstracts and Contingent Bills for November in the new form, whether those for a prior period have been rendered or not.

# II.—MATRICULATION EXAMINATION.

1. As there will be a very large number of Candidates, Candidates are requested to visit the Town Hall (if practicable), on Saturday, the 18th November; where they will see on the University Notice-boards at the top of the steps, lists of their names (arranged alphabetically according to their surnames), and the Number of the Seat and Table each is to occupy printed on the same line with his name in the list.

Each table will also have the name of its occupier pasted on it. The tables will be arranged in parallel rows from East to West, and North to South; and the seats will be so placed that all the Candidates shall face the South. Table No. I will be placed at the South East corner, and the table which has the last number at the North West corner of the Hall; and the tables which have the intermediate numbers will be placed consecutively, except when Candidates having consecutive numbers on the list are from the same School.

- 2. The Candidates should be present in the Town Hall, on Monday, the 20th November, not later than 91 A.M., to take their seats and to be provided with paper.
  - 3. The Paper Examinations will be conducted in the following order :-

Monday, 20th November, 1865 .... \{ 10 to 1, Grammar and Idiom, &c. (English); 2 to 5, Elementary History and Geography.

Medical Practitioners particularly are requested to aid the registration. Blank forms of Death Reports, to keep by them in readiness, are given gratuitously on application at the Office of the Deputy Commissioner of Police.

It is thought that some withhold their assistance through the notion that reports of the single casualties coming now and then under their observation could but little affect the Returns; but it ought rather to be borne in mind that the accuracy of the Returns depends on the correct reporting of all single cases, for of such only the aggregate is made up.

A small portion of the plantation of Ayar Toli named Biocolie, belonging to the temple of Nagnath, will bear an annual rental of Rs. 24 (twenty-four rupees) per annum.

The register of tenders will be examined at noon, on the 1st March 1866, by a Committee consisting of the Superintendent Bolanical Gardens, the Judge, and the Collector of Saharunpore, at the Office of the Superintendent, and in the presence of all parties who may attend; and the amount of the highest tender for each lot, or, if there be more than one tender of equal amount, the number and amount of such tenders, but not the names of the parties tendering, will be publicly declared, and the highest tender, in writing, above the upset price at 4 P. M., will be accepted on the part of Government by the Committee.

On the tender being accepted by the Committee, the purchaser most deposit five per cent. of the purchase money, which will be forfeited if the amount of the purchase money be not paid in full on the date specified.

Agents must be supplied by their principals with sufficient powers of Attorney.
