The following Notification by the Government of India is republished:—

Rea^d Extract, Military Department, No. 844, dated 20th November 1865, forwarding for consideration a letter, with enclosures, from the Controller General of Military Expenditure, regarding a claim to passage-money from Kurrachee to Bombay, preferred by Captain F. T. Ross, of the Staff Corps, a Deputy Collector in Scind.

RESOLUTION.—The Governor General in Council is pleased to lay down the following rule in regard to the provision of free passage for Public Officers in the Civil Department.

All Officers in Civil employ, whether Civil or Military, Covenanted or Uncovenanted, will be allowed a free passage when proceeding on duty by sea, on the conditions on which they would draw travelling allowance if proceeding on duty by land. Military Officers in Civil employ will, in addition, be allowed a free passage when proceeding from port to port in India on medical certificate.

The cost of the free passage, both for cabin and table accommodation, will be borne by Government, except that Officers whose salaries exceed Rs. 600 a month must suffer a deduction of Rs. 8 per diem (*i. e.*, the full rate of table money on Government sea-going vessels), and those on Rs. 600 or less of 4 per diem on account of their table for the number of days occupied in their passage on a Government vessel or a private vessel.

ORDER.—Ordered, that the foregoing Resolution be published in the *Gazette of India*, and that copies of it be forwarded to the Military Department, with the original enclosures of the Extract from that Department above referred to and to the

Accountants General Bengal, Madras, Bombay, N. W. Provinces, Punjab, and British Burmah.

Notification.

1. An Examination of Candidates for the Office of Pleader will be held in Bombay, commencing on Monday the 29th January 1866.
2. The Committee for conducting the Examination will be appointed by the Honorable the Judges of the High Court of Judicature.
3. No person will be admitted to the Examination unless he produce before the Committee a certificate, according to the following form, from the Judge of the Zillah within which he may have been employed or residing :—
 " I hereby certify that I have personally examined the bearer A. B. inhabitant of———, and find that he is —— years of age (not less than 21); is of respectable character, reads Balbodh well, and is otherwise properly educated. He has hitherto been employed as ——, and I consider him fit to appear before the Committee appointed for the Examination of Candidates for the office of Pleader."
4. When the character of the applicant is not known to the Zillah Judge personally, that officer will assure himself on this point by inquiry, or by requiring the production of testimonials from others, in whose judgment and testimony he may have confidence. The acquirements of the applicant will in all cases be determined by the Zillah Judge by personal examination.
5. The Examination will be conducted by requiring each Candidate to answer in writing questions on Law and Practice, and to give oral answers to similar questions put orally.
6. At the conclusion of the examination, the Committee shall report the result to the Judges of the High Court, who, on application, will grant to each passed Candidate the usual Sunud.
7. When a Candidate may have failed to pass any examination, the Examiners shall state in what respect he is most defective, and how soon he may again present himself for examination.
8. Each passed Candidate shall satisfy the Registrar of the High Court that he is *bonâ fide* owner of a complete set of the Civil and Criminal Enactments in force in the Bombay Presidency.
9. No person will henceforward be admitted to practise as a Pleader on the Appellate side of the High Court unless he possess a competent knowledge of English to enable him to plead fluently in that language.
10. Nothing in these Rules is intended to interfere with the conditions under which the Judges have already expressed their willingness to grant Sunuds, as Pleaders, to University Law Students who may have successfully completed a five years' course of study, and further qualified themselves by attending an additional course of special instructions in the existing laws of this country, as notified in the *Government Gazette* of the 12th December 1861.
11. The above Rules will apply only to the examination of which notice is given in paragraph 1.

४. उमेदवाराचे चालीविषयी जिल्हे जडज्यास स्वतः माहिती नसेल तर त्याहीं ज्या मनुष्याचे विचारावर व सांगण्यावर त्याचा भरवसा असेल त्या मनुष्याचें सरटिफिकेट आणवून अथवा चौकशी करून आपली खात्री करून घ्यावी. उमेदवाराची तयारी किती आहे हें नेहमी जिल्हे जडजाने स्वतः परीक्षा घेऊन पहाविं.

It is thought that some withhold their assistance through the notion that reports of the single casualties coming now and then under their observation could but little affect the Returns; but it ought rather to be borne in mind that the accuracy of the Returns depends on the correct reporting of all single cases, for of such only the aggregate is made up.

OFFENSIVE AND DANGEROUS TRADES.

NOTICE BY THE MUNICIPAL COMMISSIONER
UNDER SECTION 264 OF ACT II. OF 1865.

THE following By-Laws for the inspection of places used for offensive and dangerous trades, and for the management and conduct thereof, have been sanctioned by Government under date the 20th December 1865:—

BY-LAWS.

Certain Trades not allowed within certain limits.

I. The trades of melting Tallow or Sulphur, boiling Offal or Blood or Bones, melting Fat, washing or drying Wool or Cotton, Soap-making, Oil-boiling, dyeing in Indigo, Tannery, Lucifer Match-making, Catgut-manufactory, Hide-cleaning or packing, Candle-making, Fish-curing; Brick, Tile, Pott-ry, or Lime Kiln; Sago-manufacturing; Gunpowder-manufacturing; manufactory of Fire-works, or other similar offensive and dangerous trades, shall be carried on only in the Mahim and Parell wards, at such places as may be approved by the Health Officer and the Commissioner.

Plans of all premises to be used in these trades are to be submitted to the Commissioner together with the application for license or registry.

Places for melting Tallow or Fat, Catgut-making, Hide cleaning or packing.

II. Every house, yard, compound, or other place, whether registered or licensed by the Municipal Commissioner to be used for melting Tallow or Fat, Catgut-making, Hide-cleaning or packing, shall be thoroughly cleansed daily, as well as all boilers, pans, or other utensils used for the purpose. All refuse matter shall be removed from the premises daily, and deposited in such places as may be approved by the Health Officer and Commissioner. The inside walls of buildings used for the above purpose shall be white-washed with chunam once at least every two months, and the floors shall be paved with stone or burnt brick or chunam, and shall be sluiced and kept thoroughly clean.

Dyeing Houses, &c.

III. Every dyeing-house, compound, yard, or place used for the dyeing of cloth, yarn, or other article, whether registered or licensed by the Municipal Commissioner, shall be paved, and shall be provided with covered drains for the conveyance of the wastage water off the premises, constructed in such manner as may be approved by the Health Officer. Every such dyeing-house, compound, yard, or place shall be daily thoroughly cleansed, and no filthy or offensive liquid or other matter shall be allowed to accumulate.

IV. No cloths, yarns, or other articles in the process of being dyed shall be spread or hung up to dry in any place within 400 yards of any dwelling-house.

Tanneries.

IV. Every house, building yard, or compound, or other place, whether registered or licensed by the Municipal Commissioner as a tannery, shall be effectually drained by means of a covered and paved drain, so as to convey all the wastage water

of the premises, constructed in such manner as shall be approved by the Health Officer and the Commissioner.

VI. Every part of such tannery as shall be used for the removal of the hair or wool from the hides or skins of animals shall be completely paved in such manner as shall be approved by the Health Officer and the Commissioner.

VII. All refuse from the process of tanning, and all animal and other offensive matter, shall be removed from the tannery daily, and deposited in such a place as may be approved by the Health Officer and the Commissioner.

Yards and Depôts for Wood, Coal, Hay or Straw.

VIII. If it shall seem to the Commissioner on inspection that any stack or stacks of Coal, Fire-wood, Hay, or Straw is or are from any cause likely to inconvenience or be injurious or dangerous to the neighbourhood, he may cause the same to be reduced or removed as he may deem fit.

IX. Every place whether registered or licensed by the Municipal Commissioner to be used as a yard or depôt for Wood, Coal, Hay, or Straw shall be kept clean and dry in such manner as may be approved of by the Health Officer and the Commissioner.

Regulations for keeping Cows, Horses, and Horned Cattle otherwise than for private use.

X. All keepers of Cows or Buffaloes the produce of which is for sale, and every owner or occupier of a stable or stables or other place or places used for the use of keeping therein Horses or Horned Cattle for other than for private use, whether registered or licensed by the Municipal Commissioner, shall have such stable or stables of a height of not less than 12 feet.

XI. Stables or other places as described in preceding Section for one row of Horses or of Horned Cattle shall not be less than 12 feet in breadth, measuring from the outside of the manger to the opposite wall, and if for a double row of Horses or Horned Cattle shall not be less than 26 feet in breadth from one manger to the other if the mangers are placed against the external walls, and not less than 24 feet in breadth if the mangers are placed in the centre of the stables.

Space allowed for Horses, &c.

XII. The space allotted to each Cow, Bullock, or Buffalo kept as aforesaid, shall not be less in breadth than 5½ feet, and to each Horse not less than 7 feet.

Floors of Stables to be sloped.—Water supply.

XIII. Stables and other places used for the purpose of keeping therein Horses or Horned Cattle as aforesaid shall be metalled or moorumed, the floors sloping to the drain. Such stables and places shall be provided with such supply of water as may be approved by the Health Officer and the Commissioner, and shall be cleansed daily.

Stables to be drained.

XIV. Stables and other places used for the purpose of keeping therein Horses or Horned Cattle as aforesaid shall be drained to the satisfaction of the Health Officer and the Commissioner, and may communicate by a covered drain into the public drain or sewer, if there be one within 100 feet of

such stable or other place used for keeping therein Horses or Horned Cattle as aforesaid; but if there be no such covered sewer or drain within 100 feet of such stable or other place used for keeping therein Horses or Horned Cattle, the liquids and washings of such places shall be deposited by the owner in covered water-tight casks or boxes, the contents of which will be removed from such stables and places daily by the Municipality.

Dung to be removed.

XV. All dung and dry refuse shall be deposited daily by the owner of such stables or places in a proper receptacle outside such stables and places, and will then be removed from the vicinity of such stables and places by the Municipality.

Right of Entry.

XVI. The Health Officer or the Municipal Commissioner may at any time between sunrise and sunset enter and inspect any of the places to which these By-laws are applicable.

Penalties.

XVII. The Commissioner is hereby and by Section 260 of Act II. of 1865 empowered to impose such reasonable penalties as he thinks fit, not exceeding Rs. 20, for each breach of these By-Laws, and in case of a continued breach further penalties, not exceeding Rs. 10, for each day such breach is continued after notice from the Commissioner to abstain from such breach.

- First Delivery at 7 A.M.**—To comprise the Mails from the Stations on S. E. and N. E. Railway Lines from Poona and Kussara, and the Mails brought by the B. B. and C. I. Railway Train.
- Second Delivery at 11 A.M.**—To consist of Inland Mails received by the S. E. and N. E. Railway Trains.
- Third Delivery at 2 P.M.**—To consist of Local Letters, and any Sea or other Mails received after the Second Delivery.

The Mails that arrive after the issue of the 3rd or 2 P.M. delivery will not be issued the same evening, but Letters and Papers may be had on application at the Post Office until 7 P.M.

Persian Gulf Mails.—The British India Steam Navigation Company's Mail Packet Boats will in future leave Bombay on fixed days, *viz.*, the 3rd of each month, for Bussora, and will make the voyage direct *via* Muscat instead of *via* Kurrachee, at which latter port they will not touch on either the up or down voyage.

2. The Mail bags for Muscat, Bunder Abbas, Linga, Bushire, and Bussora, also Bagdad and Turkish Arabia, will be closed in future at 12 (noon) on the 3rd of each month.

Mauritius and Cape of Good Hope Mails.—An intimation has been received from Her Majesty's Post Master General of England of the establishment of a monthly communication between Port Louis (Mauritius) and Table Bay (Cape of Good Hope), calling at Natal.

The Branch Packet will leave Port Louis immediately after the arrival of the Packet from Suez and Aden, that is, about the 25th of the month, and will return to Port Louis in time for the Packet appointed to leave for Aden and Suez on the 6th of each month.

Letters for Natal and the Cape of Good Hope, St. Helena, and Ascension, if marked *via* Aden and Mauritius, will be sent by the route above mentioned, by the P. & O. Company's Packets on the 29th of each month in the fair season.

The Postage on prepaid letters sent by this route will be 8 annas for $\frac{1}{2}$ ounce. Prepayment is optional.
