FINANCIAL DEPARTMENT.

The following Notifications by the Government of India are republished for general information :—

“ FINANCIAL DEPARTMENT.

No. 1205.

Extract from the Proceedings of the Government of India in the Financial Department, Simla, under date the 5th July 1865.

Read again the Financial Resolution No. 2189, dated 20th April 1865, directing the introduction into the Civil Department of a system of Audit and Account on the model of the English system.

RESOLUTION.—The Governor General in Council observes that the amalgamation of the Offices of the Deputy Auditor and Accountant General and the Civil Pay Master, was approved in para. 31 of the Resolution dated 20th April 1865.

2. As a first step, the Office Establishments of those functionaries will be amalgamated as they stand, reductions being effected immediately of such clerks and servants as, in the opinion of the Deputy Auditor and Accountant General, may have become palpably superfluous,—the general revision of the Office being deferred till there shall have been sufficient experience of the requirements of the new system. Such further modifications, however, as may be absolutely necessary, may be made provisionally by the Deputy Auditor and Accountant General, with a careful regard to the saving which ought ultimately to accrue from the amalgamation of the two Office Establishments, and subject to immediate report to the Government of India.

3. The arrangements which may be made for a proper post-audit and for reports to the Local Governments, on claims to pension and on applications for leave, &c., can also in many cases be adapted so as to admit of the pre-examination of claims payable at stations where there are Accountants General, on the plan recommended by the English Commissioners of Inquiry into Indian Accounts.

4. At Calcutta, Madras, and Bombay respectively, an Examiner of Claims has however been specially allowed; but until further experience of the new system, a similar appointment will not be allowed for any other Province or Administration. When the several Examiners are not employed on the work appertaining more immediately to their appointments, their services will be available for such other additional duties as may be assigned to them by the Accountant General.

5. In paras. 386—87 of the Report on Civil Accounts, the Commissioners urged the necessity for providing an efficient Deputy to each Deputy Auditor and Accountant General, if the present defective control over Treasuries, and over the internal working of the local Account Offices, is to be remedied. The expediency of utilizing for this object the Officers now serving as Civil Pay Masters, was suggested by the Commissioners. The Governor General in Council approves of the recommendation, and is pleased to decide accordingly that, for the Presidencies of Madras and Bombay, and for Bengal, the North-Western Provinces and the Punjab, there shall be allowed, without any increase of emoluments an Accountant General, and a Deputy Accountant General, in place of the present Deputy Auditor and Accountant General and Civil Pay Master. In the North-Western Provinces and the Punjab, the duties which in Calcutta, Madras, and Bombay are allotted to Examiners of Claims, will be performed by the Deputy Auditor and Accountant General, in addition to any other which may be assigned to him by the Accountant General.

6. An Accountant General without a Deputy will be retained, within the present scale of charge, for British Burmah; and the existing provision of a Deputy Accountant General for Hyderabad and the Assigned Districts, and for the Central Provinces, will continue.

7. Considerable embarrassment has been experienced in the posting of the Officers of Account to Presidencies and Provinces from the circumstance that, whereas they are on a general list for employment in any part of India, the position of an Accountant General or Deputy Accountant General in the classified list of the Department, is dependent in many cases on the locality in which he serves. This inconsistency will now be removed by making salaries personal and not local.

8. By the Financial Resolutions No. 84, dated 13th May 1862, and No. 69, dated 29th August 1862, the Officers in the Financial Department below the Financial Secretary, and in the Civil Departments of Audit and Account were formed into classes in a department under the Government of India, with the same scale of pay in each class for Covenanted Officers appointed to the Department after 13th May 1862, and for Uncovenanted Officers. No alteration in this arrangement will be made.

9. For the Covenanted Officers who were in the Department on 13th May 1862, certain higher salaries were retained in the first three classes, in order to preserve to them the prospects, on the faith of which they entered the Department.

10. In this way, and from the effects of certain minor modifications of a later date, the sanctioned scale of charge for Officers in the Departments of Account and Audit, as originally constituted by the Resolution of 13th May 1862, is as follows, viz. :—

Class I.—5 Officers.

Ordinary salary in the Class, Rupees 1,500 monthly,—rising by Rupees 100 a month, after each year of service in the Class, to a maximum of Rupees 2,000 monthly.

Exceptional.—Of the five ordinary salaries in the Class, four are in abeyance by the payment of the following in lieu, viz. :—

2 on Rs. 3,000 monthly.
2 on Rs. 2,500 do.

These are held by Covenanted Officers already in the Class, and they will be retained for other Covenanted Officers who were in the Department on 13th May 1862, and who may succeed to any one of these four exceptional salaries.

Class II.—7 Officers.

Ordinary salary, Rupees 1,000 a month,—rising to Rupees 1,500 monthly, by an increase of Rupees 75 a month, after each year of service in the Class.

Exceptional.—Of the seven ordinary salaries, five are in abeyance by the payment of the following in lieu, viz. :—

- 1 on Rs. 2,500 monthly.
- 2 on Rs. 2,000 do.
- 2 on Rs. 1,500 do.

These are held by Covenanted Officers already in the Class, and they will be retained for their benefit and for that of the only Covenanted Officer in the 3rd Class who entered the Department before 13th May 1862, and who severally may succeed to any of these five exceptional salaries.

Class III.—5 Officers.

Ordinary salary, Rupees 800 a month,—rising by an annual increase of Rupees 50 a month, after each year of service in the Class, to a maximum of Rupees 1,000 a month.

Exceptional.—Of the five ordinary salaries, one has been in abeyance hitherto by the payment in lieu, of a salary of Rupees 1,425, rising from 1st May 1865 to Rupees 1,500 monthly. This will now be in abeyance by the temporary promotion of the Covenanted Officer who held it, to a higher Class.

Class IV.—11 Officers.

Ordinary salary Rupees 600 a month,—rising to Rupees 800 by an increase of Rupees 50 monthly, after each year's service in the Class.

Class V.—24 Officers.

Salary, Rupees 400 a month,—rising to Rupees 600 by an increase of Rupees 50 a month, after each year's service in the Class.

11. His Excellency in Council is pleased further to rule that the posting of an Officer to any Province will not confer a title to any higher salary than that of the class from which the Officer is taken, unless the appointment is accompanied by promotion to a higher class, or by a nomination to act in a higher class.

12. With regard to the undermentioned appointments wherever they exist, the designations of the local Officers of Account and Audit will be hereafter as follows :—

- 1.—Accountant General of the Local Government or Administration.
- 2.—Deputy Accountant General.
- 3.—First Assistant to Accountant General.
- 4.—Second Assistant to Accountant General.
- 5.—Examiner of Claims.

13. All other Officers, whether belonging to the late Civil Pay Masters' Offices, or the Offices of the Deputy Auditor and Accountant General, will be entered as Assistants in the Offices of the Accountants General, to which they are attached. They will be borne in the proper order of precedence or seniority on the classified list, if belonging to that list, or on the rolls of the Establishment of which they form a part.

14. In accordance with the terms of this Resolution, and having regard to existing vacancies and to the special Rules of the Department which allow Covenanted Officers on furlough to retain a lien on their appointments in the Department while their salaries are available for Officers in actual employment in the Department, the Governor General in Council has determined on the following disposition of the several Accountants General, Deputy Accountants General, and other classified Officers employed in the Account Department in the several Presidencies and Administrations :—

GENERAL ORDERS

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HONORABLE THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

M I L I T A R Y D E P A R T M E N T.

Bombay Castle, 14th July 1865.

No. 388 of 1865.—With reference to G. G. O. No. 515, of 25th October 1854, the following Orders are published:—

2. The provisions of the above order do not affect G. G. O. No. 222, of 3rd May 1864, which provides for free passages to Officers proceeding by Sea from Port to Port in India.

3. In cases of Staff or Regimental Transfers on public grounds, attended by only temporary promotion, Officers will be allowed their travelling expenses under paragraphs 3 and 4 of the order.

4. Officers heretofore permitted under specific authority to draw fixed mileage allowances have the option of continuing to do so instead of adopting the rules of G. O. No. 515 of 1864; but after once choosing, they must abide by their choice so long as they hold their present appointments.

5. The tours of inspection of General Officers of Divisions, and Brigadiers General, are included in Clause 3 paragraph 4 of the General Order.

6. Officers entitled to free conveyance by Rail will be provided with tickets by the Quartermaster General's Department as at present, on the production of the Divisional, Brigade, or Station Order directing them to proceed by Rail; when however a Railway Pass or Passage Order cannot be provided, a certificate to that effect should be given by the Officer who will charge the actual expenses in a Contingent Bill vouched by the Divisional or Brigade Order on the Commissariat Department.

7. The amount of Baggage for which free conveyance is allowed to Officers when proceeding by Rail or River Steamers will not exceed the following scale:—

Warrant Officers of all grades	164

8. When an Officer proceeds singly by Bullock Train he will be allowed one cart for his personal conveyance, but if two travel together one cart must suffice for both. To each Captain and Subaltern one cart, and to each Field Officer two Carts, will be allowed for the carriage of servants and Baggage.

9. By Palankeen Mail Cart or Horse Dāk two Coolies for Baggage will be allowed.

10. If the duty on which the Officer is proceeding requires that his Camp Equipage should accompany him, separate provision will be made for it by the Officer furnishing the passage requisition in the following proportion:—

It is thought that some withhold their assistance through the notion that reports of the single casualties coming now and then under their observation could but little affect the Returns; but it ought rather to be borne in mind that the accuracy of the Returns depends on the correct reporting of all single cases, for of such only the aggregate is made up.

To Architects.**POLICE OFFICE, BYCULLA, BOMBAY.**

The Architectural Improvement Committee of Bombay have received instructions from Her Majesty's Government of Bombay to call for Competition Designs for a new Police Office at Byculla. The cost of the Building not to exceed, at present prices, three lacs of Rupees.

The extent of accommodation to be provided and other particulars as to site, &c. can be ascertained on application at the office of the Architectural Improvement Committee, Esplanade.

Each Design to be sent, in the first instance, as a pen and ink Architectural sketch, uncoloured and without shading, except such as can be done with the pen. Each Design should bear a motto, and should be accompanied by the Architect's address in a sealed envelope, and should be sent in on or before the First day of October 1865, addressed to the Architectural Improvement Committee of Bombay.

A premium of Rupees one thousand (1,000) will be awarded to the author of the Design approved, to be increased on the completion of the Contract Drawings of the selected Design, with specifications and table of quantities, to (2½) two and a half per cent. on the cost of the work when estimated at the current rates of the Public Works Department.

The style is left an open question, but the construction of the building, and its Architectural treatment must be thoroughly adapted to a tropical climate, where a high temperature and monsoon rains have to be provided against. Due regard must be had to the contemplated outlay; yet the Designs, whilst not too ornate, must be effective, and possess sufficient Artistic merit to entitle them to compete for the premium.

If the Designs are wanting in Artistic merit, or fail to comply with the conditions, the Judges will have power to reduce or withhold the prize. No prize will be given to a Design because it merely fulfills the conditions as to cost, &c., if it is conspicuously deficient in Artistic merit.

The Design will be selected, and the award made, by the Architectural Improvement Committee of Bombay.

Unsuccessful Designs will be returned to the authors if claimed by them or their authorized agents, within three months from the date of adjudication.
