"INDIA OFFICE, LONDON, 8th June 1865.

FINANCIAL. No. 43.

To His Excellency the Honorable the Governor in Council, Bombay.

Para. 1. In continuation of my Financial despatch \* dated the 31st May 1862, No. 77, I forward herewith copy of correspondence with the Lords Commissioners \* To the Government of India. of the Treasury relative to the grant of Royal Charters for Banking Companies in India, together with a copy of the Charter of the Asiatic Banking Corporation. Letter from Treasury, dated 3rd March 1865.

From this correspondence you will observe that a pledge has been given by the Lords of the Treasury that in future Joint Stock Companies will be empowered to establish agencies or branches in territories under the Government of India only after they shall have conformed to the local laws, and also that permission will not be granted to the Asiatic Banking Corporation or to other Companies incorporated by like charter to establish agencies or branches in those territories without the previous sanction of the Secretary of State for India in Council.

3. As provision has been made by legal enactment in India for admitting Joint Stock Banking Companies to the privileges of limited liability, I do not consider that it would be expedient to give my consent to the grant of banking privileges to any Company until they shall have complied with that

## JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT.

The Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased, with the approval of His Excellency the Right Honorable the Governor General of India in Council, to publish for general information the following Rules for the classification, &c., of transported Convicts, under the provisions of Section 3 of Act XV of

- I. Persons transported to Bombay shall be confined in Central Gaols or in any of the Gaols of that Presidency, and be subject to the discipline laid down for their inmates by the rules or regulations in force, and by the orders of the Inspector General of Prisons or of Government.
  - II. Such persons shall be put to hard labour as other convicts with whom they may be imprisoned.
- 111. When a convict who has been ordered to be transported for seven years shall have been confined four years, or if transported for fourteen shall have suffered six, or if transported for life shall have suffered eight, years' imprisonment, such convict may, provided his conduct has been exemplary, be allowed to reside without the Gaol in which he may have been confined, on condition,-lst, of his good conduct; 2ndly, that he present himself to such officer as may be appointed for the purpose at such times, but not less than once a month, as may be fixed by the Inspector General of Prisons; 3rdly, that he will not proceed beyond certain limits to be settled by the officer in charge of the Gaol. A forfeiture of any of these conditions will ensure the immediate return of the convict to Gaol.
- IV. Before any convict is released from Gaol under the above rules the sanction of Government shall be obtained through the Inspector General of Prisons.

"No. 661 of 1865.—His Excellency the Governor General in Council is pleased to announce that it has been decided by the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for India that all authorized periods of leave of absence may be included as part of the six years' service in the rank of Field Officer required to entitle a General Officer to the unattached pay of the latter rank.

"No. 666 of 1865.—In continuation of G. G. Orders Nos. 278 and 279 dated the 28th March 1863, His Excellency the Governor General in Council is pleased to declare that any Non-Commissioned Officer of the Native Army who shall be reduced to the ranks without being sentenced also to forfeiture of advantages accruing from former service shall be entitled to the same rates of Good Conduct Pay as Sowars or Sepoys of good character of similar length of service are entitled to, provided that for one year from the date of his return to duty as a Sowar or Sepoy he shall forfeit one rupce a month of such Good Conduct Pay, restoration to such forfeited Good Conduct Pay being also subject to the condition that no offence involving forfeiture shall be committed.

This order is applicable to the three Presidencies.

"No. 668 of 1865.—The following Military letter from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for India, No. 176, of the 25th May 1865, is published for general information:—

Military.

'INDIA OFFICE; London, the 25th May 1865.

To His Excellency the Right Honorable the Governor General of India in Council.

SIR,—(Paragraph 1.) I have received and considered in Council your Military letter No. 88, dated 21st February 1865, forwarding correspondence relative to a proposal submitted by the Inspector General of Ordnance and Magazines that Officers of the Royal Artillery in India should be encouraged to qualify themselves for appointments in the Ordnance Department and Manufacturing Establishments by undergoing the course of study and training laid down in General Order to the Royal Artillery, No. 492, dated Horse Guards, 2nd November 1863.

2. Lieutenant Garrett, 3rd Class Commissary of Ordnance, has, it appears, submitted an application to proceed home for two years for the above purpose, declaring his readiness to forfeit Indian and Staff allowances, provided he be permitted to resume his appointment on his return, and to reckon the period as service in India towards pension.

3. Your Government have not felt authorized to comply with this request, but you consider that the benefit to the service which would result, if Officers now in the Ordnance Department would go through the course of study in question, would be so great that you recommend that the request be granted and, further, that permission be given to one Officer in each grade of the Commissaries of Ordnance to be absent for the same purpose, if so many should apply for the indulgence, and if the Inspector General of Ordnance can in each case recommend the applicant as one who would be likely to derive from the course the full benefit which it is intended to afford.

4. I concur with your Government in considering it desirable that Officers of Artillery either having or desiring to have employment in the Ordnance Department should be encouraged to undergo the course of study to which you refer.

5. There are, however, a large number of Artillery Officers belonging to the Indian Brigades of Artillery always in this country; and I have been informed by His Royal Highness the Field Marshal Commanding in Chief that Officers of Brigades of Royal Artillery serving in India are eligible to compete for appointment to the advanced class of Officers referred to in the abovementioned General (Artillery) Order. Abundant opportunity is thus offered to the Officers of those Brigades to go through that course of study, and to qualify themselves for employment in the Ordnance Department in India.

6. All Officers passing through the course and receiving satisfactory testimonials at its termination will be permitted to count as service for pension one-half of the time so employed; but I do not consider it necessary or expedient to sanction a departure from the established rules of the service in the case of Officers actually holding staff appointments of this nature, by permitting them to retain the appointment during absence from India beyond the period allowed under existing regulations.

7. His Royal Highness the Field Marshal Commanding in Chief has suggested to me, in reference to this subject, that the actual appointments to the Ordnance and Manufacturing Departments both in Europe and in India should be open to the Officers of the regiment generally whose Brigades respectively are in those countries, and who may have qualified for such appointments by passing satisfactorily through this class, without reference to whether they belong to the old or the new Brigades of Artillery.

8. I have informed His Royal Highness that I fully concur in this opinion but that with respect to the appointments in India it will be necessary the candidates pass the language or other test specially laid down for Staff employments in that country.

It is thought that some withhold their assistance through the notion that reports of the single casualties coming now and then under their observation could but little affect the Returns; but it ought rather to be borne in mind that the accuracy of the Returns depends on the correct reporting of all single cases, for of such only the aggregate is made up.

M., will be accepted on the part of Government by the Committee.

# To Architects.

POLICE OFFICE, BYCULLA, BOMBAY.

The Architectural Improvement Committee of Bombay have received instructions from Her Majesty's Government of Bombay to call for Competition Designs for a new Police Office at Byculla. The cost of the Building not to exceed, at present prices, three lacs of Rupees.

The extent of accommodation to be provided and other particulars as to site, &c, can be ascertained on application at the office of the Architectural Improvement Committee, Esplanade.

Each Design to be sent, in the first instance, as a pen and ink Architectural sketch, uncoloured and without shading, except such as can be done with the pen. Each Design should bear a motto, and should be accompanied by the Architect's address in a sealed envelope, and should be sent in on or before the First day of October 1865, addressed to the Architectural Improvement Committee of Bombay.

A premium of Rupees one thousand (1,000) will be awarded to the author of the Design approved, to be increased on the completion of the Contract Drawings of the selected Design, with specifications and table of quantities, to (2½) two and a half per cent. on the cost of the work when estimated at the current rates of the Public Works Department.

The style is left an open question, but the construction of the building, and its Architectural treatment must be thoroughly adapted to a tropical climate, where a high temperature and monsoon rains have to be provided against. Due regard must be had to the contemplated outlay; yet the Designs, whilst not too ornate, must be effective, and possess sufficient Artistic merit to entitle them of compete for the premium.

If the Designs are wanting in Artistic merit, or fail to comply with the conditions, the Judges will have power to reduce or withhold the prize. No prize will be given to a Design because it merely fulfills the conditions as to cost, &c., if it is conspicuously deficient in Artistic merit.

The Design will be selected, and the award made, by the Architectural Improvement Committee of Bombay.

Unsuccessful Designs will be returned to the authors if claimed by them or their authorized agents, within three mouths from the date of adjudication.
