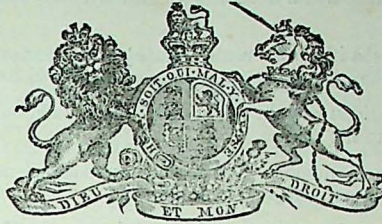

THE MANOCKJEE LIMJEE GOLD MEDAL.

The Subject selected by the Syndicate for the Medal, which is to be adjudged in November 1870, is as follows:—

“THE SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC EFFECTS OF THE INTRODUCTION OF RAILWAYS INTO INDIA.”

The Competitive Essays should be written in a neat legible hand, and must not exceed 100 pages foolscap size.

The following Regulations are reprinted from the University Calendar, for the guidance of Competitors:—

1. The Manockjee Limjee Gold Medal shall be awarded annually for the best Essay by a University student, in accordance with the subjoined conditions.
2. Competitors shall be Graduates in the University of Bombay, who shall not be of more than five years' standing from the date of their graduation, on the day prescribed for the sending in of the Essays. By the term Graduates is to be understood Masters and Bachelors of Arts, Bachelors of Laws, Doctors and Licentiates of Medicine, and Masters and Licentiates of Civil Engineering; and by the term date of graduation is to be understood the date of the Candidates' receiving the Degree of Bachelor of Arts or Licentiate of Medicine, or Licentiate of Civil Engineering.

3. Competitive Essays shall be written in the English language on the subject appointed for the current year, and shall be sent in to the University Registrar on or before the fourth Monday in September. Each Essay shall be designated by a motto instead of the writer's name, and shall be accompanied by a sealed cover, containing the name of the competitor and a declaration that the Essay sent in by him is *bonâ fide* his own composition.

4. The subject of the Essay shall be in alternate years (*a*) some question of Indian History or Antiquities; (*b*) some question connected with the introduction into India of European Science and Art.

5. The subject for the competition is to be selected by the Syndicate, and notified not less than twelve months before the day for sending in the Essays.

6. The Judges shall be two in number, and shall be nominated annually by the Syndicate. Their decision shall be announced on the fourth Monday in November.

7. The Medal shall be presented to the successful candidate on the Convocation for Conferring Degrees next ensuing after the Judges' decision. The Medallist shall on the same occasion read aloud selected portions of his Essay.

8. The successful Essay shall be printed at the expense of the University.

9. The medal shall not be awarded to any Essay which, in the opinion of the Judges, would not, when printed, be creditable to the University. But if only one Essay be sent in, nothing shall hinder the Judges from awarding to it the Medal, if it appears to them to come up to the proper standard.

10. Whenever a year passes without the Medal being awarded, the interest of the Endowment shall go towards the printing of Essays, and other expenses connected with the prize.

11. On all occasions of Academical costume, Medallists shall be entitled to wear their Medals.

Notice to Mariners.

SHAT-EL-ARAB.

A First-class Iron Buoy was laid at the mouth of the Shat-el-Arab on the 18th July.

Position.

On the Abadan side S. E. by E. from the inner black Buoy about two miles.

Description.

Cage on top and small white cap on cage:—



Colour.

Black above water, red underneath; cage black, and small cap on cage white.

In laying the Buoy the cage became a little canted, and it was left in this position, thus:—



(The small buoy which was laid a few weeks since is still about 100 yards W. N. W. from it.)

The moorings of the above Iron Buoy weigh $3\frac{1}{2}$ tons, and as it is the crank shaft of a large steamer the cranks project about 4 feet, and may not be sunk quite under the mud. As the Buoy was laid in $3\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms high water, it would be as well for deep

vessels not to go within 15 fathoms of it; probably also the chain is too heavy for the tide to straighten it, and the Buoy may lay the tideward side of the mooring even in strong tides.
