



A Meeting of the Senate was held in the Durbar Room, Town Hall, on Wednesday the 13th October 1869, at 5. P.M.

The Minutes of the last Meeting were read and confirmed.

II.—The Registrar then read a letter from the Honourable Munguldass Nathoobhoy, offering on behalf of the Honourable B. H. Ellis, Government Promissory Notes for Rs. 1,500, bearing interest at 4 per cent. for an annual Prize of books of the value of Rs. 60, to be given "to the Scholar who, on Matriculation, passes the best examination in any Oriental Language."

It was proposed by W. G. Hunter, M.D., M.R.C.P., and seconded by James Burgess, M.R.A.S.—

"That this Endowment be accepted with the best thanks of the Senate, as a token from the Honourable B. H. Ellis of his appreciation of the University, and regard for the people of Bombay."

Carried unanimously.

III.—The following Regulations for the above Endowment, recommended by the Syndicate for the approval of the Senate were then read:—

"THE ELLIS PRIZE.

1. A Prize, to be entitled the ELLIS PRIZE, consisting of books of the value of Rupees sixty, shall be awarded every year to the Candidate who shall have passed the Matriculation Examination with the highest marks for proficiency in an Oriental Language.

2. The Prize shall be awarded in connection with such one or other of the following languages as the Syndicate from time to time may determine:—

3. The language for which the Prize will be given each year shall be notified by the Syndicate not less than twelve months before each Matriculation Examination.

4. The books shall be presented to the successful Candidate by the Chancellor or Vice-Chancellor at the Convocation for Conferring Degrees."

It was proposed by the Rev. R. Stothert, M.A., and seconded by F. G. Joynt, Esq., that Regulation 1 of the above Endowment Regulations be approved.—*Carried.*

It was proposed by W. G. Hunter, M.D., M.R.C.P., and seconded by Rao Bahadur Dadoba Pandurang, that Regulation 2 be approved.

It was proposed by T. B. Kirkham, Esq., and seconded by Atmaram Pandurang, G.G.M.C., that the following Regulation 2 be substituted for the draft Regulation 2:—

The amendment was put to the vote and lost; the original proposition was put to the vote and *carried.*

It was proposed by R. A. Dallas, LL.D., and seconded by T. B. Kirkham, Esq., that Regulations 3 and 4 be approved.—*Carried.*

IV. It was proposed by the Rev. D. Macpherson, M.A., and seconded by James Burgess, M.R.A.S.—

“That Regulation 2 in Arts on page 53 of the University Calendar for 1869-70 be removed, and that the forms and numbers of the Regulations be altered in conformity with this alteration.”

After some discussion the above proposition was negatived by a large majority.

V. It was proposed by W. G. Hunter, M.D., M.R.C.P., and seconded by Atmaram Pandurang, G.G.M.C.—

“That a Grace be passed permitting Kaikhosru Barjorji Cooper to appear at the ensuing Matriculation Examination.”—*Carried.*

The following Notice has been received for publication from the Chief Commissioner, British Burmah, in a letter dated Rangoon, 13th September 1869:—

"NOTICE TO MARINERS.

From and after the 15th September 1869, the Lights on the following Light Houses will be, Night by Night, continuously exhibited, and on the 21st September the Light Ship, which has hitherto marked the entrance of the Rangoon River, will be removed.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of Act XIII. of 1867, a coast light due of one anna a ton will be levied on and after the 15th September on all vessels of fifty tons burthen and upwards, if the voyage be from Rangoon or Maulmain to Bassein, or from Bassein to Rangoon or Maulmain.

N.B.—The bearings and courses given are all true.

I. Coast Lighthouse on the Krishna Shoal, Gulf of Martaban, in 15° 36' 30" North, Longitude 95° 35' East.

A Lighthouse on screw piles in 3 fathoms at low water, on the South-Eastern edge of the above shoal, showing a fixed dioptric Light of the 2nd order. The focal plane of the light 60 feet above high water mark, visible 14 nautical miles. Rise and fall of tide 12 feet. H. W. at F. and C. XII. hours. The light is cut off at W.S.W. to the Westward, and at N.N.E. to the Eastward, the centre of the light being South-East.

It is provided with a Fog Bell, which, in foggy weather, will be sounded at intervals of 30 seconds.

In making the light (the object of which is to enable vessels to round Baragu Point, so as to avoid the dangers of the Baragu flat and Krishna shoal) from the Westward, a vessel should keep in not less than 7 fathoms of water to the Southward, steering Eastward until the light bears North-West and distant 5 to 10 miles, then steering, according to strength and set of the tide, between North-East by North, and North-East 40 miles, to make China Buckeer Lighthouse off the mouth of Rangoon River.

Vessels from the Northward, going South must not get into less than 6 fathoms of water when standing to the Westward, or bring the light to bear to the Southward of S.W. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.

No vessel should approach within 5 miles of the Lighthouse.

A vessel bound to the Westward may steer in that direction after she has brought the light to bear North distant 5 to 10 miles, taking care to keep in not less than 7 fathoms of water.

II.—Harbour Lighthouse on China Buckeer, off the entrance of Rangoon River.

Hitherto the entrance to the channel of the Rangoon River has been marked by a Light-ship in 32 fathoms of water. The Lighthouse is situated on the high land of China Buckeer, which is generally first made by ships bound to Rangoon, and is about 3 miles North-East of the mouth of the China Buckeer River. It is built on screw piles, and the lower part being against a back ground of dark trees will be painted white. It is close to high water mark, but the sands at low water stretch 6 miles to the Eastward of it. Ships must therefore keep well to seaward from it. It will bear a dioptric light of the 1st order, the upper and lower cupolas showing a fixed light, and the centre drum a revolving light attaining its greatest brilliancy once a minute. It can be seen 15 nautical miles from the deck or 17 nautical miles from the masthead of a ship. It is in Latitude 16° 19' 30" North, and Longitude 96° 12' East.

III.—Harbour Lighthouse near the Eastern Grove, off the mouth of the Rangoon River.

This Lighthouse is also on screw piles, in Latitude 16° 29' North, and Longitude 96° 26' 30" East. It will show a light over an arc of 60°. It will be cut off to the Eastward due South, 10° of this angle will show a condensed light, the centre of which will pass through the present position of the Light-ship or in a direction South 30° West. This condensed light will be visible 16 nautical miles from the deck or 18 nautical miles from the masthead of a ship, and the remaining 50° of light 12 miles from the deck of a vessel. It is not intended to be a leading light into the river, but to prevent vessels making the land or China Buckeer light from running too far to the Westward.

Sailing directions for making the mouth of the Rangoon River.

Steer so as to make China Buckeer light bearing between N. by E. and W. by N. To avoid the Eastern Sands, a vessel should not go so far North as to bring the light to bear to the Southward of West; and to avoid the Western Sands, the Eastern Grove Lighthouse must not be brought to bear to the Eastward of N.N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. With China Buckeer light bearing West and the Eastern Grove light bearing between N.N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. and North, vessels will be on the Rangoon pilot station in the neighbourhood of which pilot vessels are constantly cruising, and should anchor until daylight, or until a pilot is obtained.
