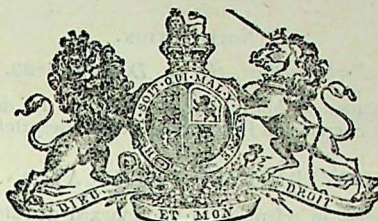

Notice to Mariners.

BUOYS OF THE NERBUDDA.

A large red Buoy with basket top has been placed off the entrance of the "Nerbudda" in Lat. $21^{\circ} 34' 30''$ N., Long. $72^{\circ} 30' 20''$ East, in 7 fathoms at low water spring tides, bearing from Perim Lighthouse S. 85° E., 10 sea miles.

The Buoy is $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile from the edge of the sands, and is a leading buoy for the channel.

A large red Buoy has been placed in the fairway of the channel in 4 fathoms low-water spring tides, showing the turn of the river. This Buoy bears from the Outer Buoy N. 56° E. $1\frac{1}{2}$ sea miles.

A Beacon has been placed on the North Bank of the river at high water mark, $3\frac{1}{2}$ sea miles due north of the Inner Buoy.

Sailing Directions for the Entrance of the River.

From the Outer Buoy steer East until the Inner Buoy bears N. E. by N., then steer for the Inner Buoy, passing it to seaward. From the Inner Buoy steer North for the Beacon, and thence along the North Bank for the clump of trees marking a temple close to Umbheta.

Deep water will be found off Umbheta close to the North Bank.

The lowest water found at the entrance of the river at low water spring tides between the Buoys was 15 feet. Between the Inner Buoy and South

Bank 6 fathoms will be found, and room for a large ship to swing at single anchor.

"DIE VERNON" WRECK, NEAR ALIBAG.

The Wreck is in the direct track of Coasting Craft. The Buoy anchored to point the wreck is a small Iron Buoy painted *Black*; it has a Bamboo lashed to it with a small Red Flag, and is visible from two to three miles off. The following is the description of its position:—

No. 16 of 1869.—In continuation of Marine Notification No. 14, dated 7th September 1869, the following Notification by the Colonial Secretary at Hong-Kong and the despatch therein referred to, are published for general information:—

GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATION.

No. 88.—Notice is hereby given, in reference to the annexed despatch of the 23rd April last, from the Right Honourable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that, on and after the 1st of October next, no signals will be made or answered from Government stations on shore or ships at sea, except by means of the *Commercial Code of Signals*.

CIRCULAR.

Downing Street, the 23rd April 1869.

SIR,—I have the honour to transmit to you extracts from two letters which have been addressed to this Department by the Board of Trade, with reference to the use of the Commercial Code of Signals throughout Her Majesty's possessions.

I have to request that the suggestions of the Board of Trade that no signals should be made or answered from Government stations on shore or ships at sea, except by means of the Commercial Code of Signals, may be adopted as soon as possible without risk of inconvenience, and that you will report to me how soon this can be done.

TO THE OFFICER ADMINISTERING THE GOVERNMENT OF HONG-KONG.

Extract of a letter from MR. GRAY, to the Under Secretary of State, Colonial Office, dated Board of Trade, the 28th November 1868.

I am to state to you, for the information of His Grace the Duke of Buckingham and Chandos, that the use of the “Commercial Code of Signals” has now become a matter of international importance. No other Code is now supplied by the Admiralty to Her Majesty's ships, and no other Code is recognized by the Governments of France and of several other Continental States for communicating with each other at the signal stations, and with merchant vessels generally.

Extract of a letter from MR. GRAY, to the Under Secretary of State, Colonial Office, dated Board of Trade, the 27th March 1869.

The Board of Trade have already, in their letter above referred to, pointed out the increasing importance of the Commercial Code of Signals, and they have received from the Admiralty a distinct intimation to the effect that Marryatt's Codes are no longer supplied to Her Majesty's ships.

They would therefore further submit, for the consideration of Earl Granville, whether the Officers administering the Governments of Her Majesty's several possessions abroad, might not properly be requested to give notice that, after a certain date, no signals will be made or answered from Government stations on shore or ships at sea, except by means of the Commercial Code of Signals.

I am to add that, to ensure the answering of signals and the reporting of vessels on their signalling their names to any signal station, it is essential that each station should, in addition to the Commercial Code Signal Book, be kept repeatedly supplied with the latest *Code List of Ships*.

Unless this is done, and shipmasters can feel certain that their distinguished signals will be recognized when exhibited, the general use of the Commercial Code must necessarily be retarded, and the exertions that have been made by the Government of this country and the principal maritime States will be frustrated.
