Notice.

The following Rules regarding the passing of Passengers' Baggage, sanctioned by Government, and issued under Section V. of Act VI. of 1863, are published for general information in supersession of all former Rules on the subject:—

ON IMPORTATION.

- I. All personal Baggage accompanying Passengers, including the following articles, to be passed free, viz:—
 - Wearing Apparel, Gun, or a Rifle, a pair of Pistols, a Saddle and Bridle, and a Canteen not exceeding Rs. 100 in value.
 - If the Passenger be a Military, Naval, or Medical Officer, or a Civil Engineer, all professional instruments for his own use are to be admitted free.
- 11. When dutiable articles are imported along with Passengers' Baggage in such quantities as to convey the idea that they are intended either for sale or for more than personal or individual use, the ordinary duty should be levied thereon.

III. All dutiable articles brought by passengers for parties other than themselves are liable to duty.

- IV. The Baggage of Passengers arriving from Foreign Ports is subject to examination, and such Passengers should therefore bring or send with an Agent the keys of their portmanteaus and boxes to the Custom House.
- V. All nailed cases brought from Foreign Ports should as a rule be forwarded to the Town Custom House, to be there passed.

ON EXPORTATION.

- I. All Baggage on exportation is, with the exception of Shawls, free, and will be passed unexamined, and it is not necessary that it should be accompanied by a Pass.
- II. Passengers are allowed to export Shawls for their own use free of duty, but Customs duty will be levied on Shawls taken by them which do not form part of their wearing apparel.

- 3. Additional transfers required for the printing of large numbers of copies from any Negative, say above 200, will be charged for at half the price of Negative.
- 4. Printing of Maps and Drawings, 4 rupees per Negative plate, per 100, up to the first hundred; above that, 2 rupees per 100, exclusive of cost of paper.
- 5. All work sent for reproduction must be uniformly black, on white paper. Coloured and pale ink work not admissible.
- 6. Work for reduction should be suitably prepared, as regards the scale and written matter, the heaping of the scale being altered so as to describe correctly the scale as it would exist after reduction.
- 7. Unless a request to retain photographic or zinc plate Negatives accompanies the requisition, they will invariably be cleaned on completion of the work.
- 8. The terms on which Negatives will be retained for future use (in custody of the office) may be learned on application to the undersigned.
- 9. As a general rule work will be executed in the order in which it is received at the office, but in case of work being required emergently by a Government Department, it will take precedence.
- 10. If paper for work ordered be not furnished by the parties giving the order, they should state when making the requisition on what kind of paper they wish the work to be executed.
- 11. Owing to pressure of other work the reproduction of merely printed, written, or engraved papers cannot be undertaken at present.
